Activists of Awami League and its associate bodies allegedly vandalised and looted houses of at least five BNP and Jubo Dal leaders in Chonpara area of Narayanganj's Rupganj upazila on Sunday night and early

These incidents happened barely a day after at least five houses and shops of Jubo Dal and Chhatra Dal leaders were attacked, allegedly by AL men, in the upazila's Bhulta on Saturday night.

BNP leaders alleged that activists of AL, Jubo League, and Chhatra League carried out the attacks between 11:00pm Sunday and 1:00am yesterday. The attackers are supporters of upazila AL member Bazlur Rahman.

"At least 50 people, carrying sticks, entered my house in Chonpara around midnight on Sunday by breaking the padlock at the main SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

# No let-up in fight to regain territory

Vows Zelensky as Ukrainian troops prepare assault on Donbas; Kyiv accuses Russia of striking nuke plant in the south

President Volodymyr Zelensky has vowed that there will be no let-up in Ukraine's fight to regain its territory as Kyiv said its troops had crossed the Oskil River, preparing for an assault on Russia's occupation forces in the eastern Donbas region.

Reflecting the dramatic change in momentum since Ukrainian forces routed Russian troops earlier this month in the northeast, US President Joe Biden offered his strongest prediction so far that the Ukraine would win the war.

"They're defeating Russia," Biden said in an interview with CBS's "60 Minutes". Victory would come only when Russian forces were completely driven from Ukrainian territory, and the United States

takes", Biden said.

"Russia's turning out not to be as competent and capable as many people thought they were going to be."

Crossing the Oskil River is another important milestone in Ukraine's counteroffensive in the northeastern Kharkiv region. The river flows south into the Siversky Donets, which snakes through the Donbas, the main focus of Russia's invasion.

Further beyond lies Luhansk province, base for Russia's separatist proxies since 2014 and fully in Russian hands since July after some of the war's bloodiest battles.

Uraine yesterday accused Russian forces of shelling near the Pivdennoukrainsk nuclear power plant in Ukraine's southern Mykolaiv region.

A blast occurred 300 metres away from the reactors and damaged power plant buildings shortly after midnight, Ukraine's atomic power operator Energoatom said in a statement. The reactors were not damaged and no staff were hurt, it said, publishing photographs showing a huge crater it said was caused by the blast.

superpower India. Domestic football was very popular at the time, yet girls across the country could hardly kick a football due to the social stigma with women playing

Since those heady days, the footballing landscape in the country has witnessed a fall from grace from which it has not recovered.

The only exception has been this set of girls, who won almost every age-group regional trophy since their chequered journey started in 2015 in Kathmandu with a triumph in the AFC U-14 Regional Football Championship before retaining it in 2016. Their impressive trophy cabinet also includes the title of the U-18 SAFF Championship in 2018 and the U-19 SAFF Championship trophy last year.

They even made it to the AFC Championship twice after finishing as zonal group

champions in 2017 and in 2019. While they might have lost all their games on the big stage against heavyweights like North Korea and Japan, their outings against Australia demonstrated how competitive they were capable of becoming. After losing 3-2 to the Socceroos in a closely-contested game in 2017, these girls came back stronger in 2019 and settled for a 2-2 draw against the same

"Those who are pensively waiting to embrace the dream, we want to win it (the title) for those dreamers. We want to repay their unequivocal support. We are not thinking of a victory parade on an open-top bus with the trophy in our hand. We want to win it for those who have helped us to touch the green grass (of a football field) by shielding us from social stigma," Sanjida wrote.

Now that they have lived up to their promise, a celebrative atmosphere might linger for a while. There may be promises of financial rewards.

But this success can only be turned into a watershed moment provided that women footballers get a structure that can enable them to consider taking up the game as a profession.

The BFF had revived the women's football league for the 2019-2020 season, but that is not inviting enough to give financial comfort to those who want to take up the game

It is about time the government and businesses come forward and lay the foundations for a professional structure that will help them scale

"Besides, they can participate in specialised or professional training programmes organised the same budget on the basis of a memorandum of understanding signed between the government and other foreign training institutions or universities," it said.

The government also allowed

their participation in foreign training through invitation and full funding by a foreign government, institution, or development partner.

In order to audit or inspect the quality of services or products, officials concerned, including those with technical knowledge, can travel abroad, if funded by suppliers, contractors, or consulting firms.

The circular said the decision was taken to ensure the skill upgradation of government officials.

However, exposure visits, study tours, foreign trips, workshops or seminars covered under the Annual Performance Agreement Innovation, under the management development budget,would remain closed due tothe current global economic situation, according to finance ministry officials.

Earlier, the restrictions on foreign trips were imposed in the context of post-Covid economic recovery and ongoing global crisis.
