

Inclusion the key to ensuring their rights Speakers tell Domestic Workers Conference

Speakers at a conference yesterday said although various initiatives have been taken by the government to improve the lives of domestic workers, implementation of these policies and other guidelines is not possible due to the lack of necessary legal framework.

Planning Minister MA Mannan assured that if the labour ministry can create a proposal of a comprehensive project for the welfare of the domestic workers and send it to the ministry, the government might consider it.

He made the comments yesterday at the "National Domestic Workers Conference 2022", organised by Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE), in association with Oxfam in Bangladesh, Bangladesh Institute of Labour Studies (BILS), Hellotask, Dushtha Shasthya Kendra (DSK), Karmojibi Nari, Nari Maitry, Red Orange and UCEP Bangladesh.

The conference was held at Krishibid Institute in the capital.

Nightmare on Khulna road

Major road in Rupsha upazila unrepared for 8 years

It's almost shameful that the road named after a Bir Shrestha is being neglected this way.

The bitumen has eroded in many parts. During dry season, the road is engulfed in dust and in monsoon. There is water and a thick layer of mud.

This is the state of one of the busiest roads in Rupsha upazila for the last eight years.

As a result, for Khulna residents, using the Bir Shrestha Ruhul Amin Road has turned into a living nightmare.

According to LGED sources, the road's length is around seven kilometres. It starts from the eastern bank of Rupsha Ferry Ghat and ends at Zabusa Bazar via Char Rupsa, Bagmara. The road has seen no repairs since 2015.

Visiting the road last week, this correspondent saw around four km of the road (from Orion Power Plant to Ferry ghat) in a dilapidated state.

Rickshaw and van drivers were seen pushing their vehicles as there was no scope to drive it properly. Some pedestrians even chose to pass the road on barefoot, wading through murky water and mud.

Along the road, there are at least 15 shrimp processing factories and ice mills, three primary schools, coast guard office, police camp and several important facilities. At least 50 shrimp buying agents run their business on both sides of the road.

Md Kamal Hossain Bulbul, chairman of Naihati Union Parishad, said it's almost shameful that the road named after a Bir Shrestha is being neglected this way.

Although the road is under LGED, the road is categorised as "Village Road A" in documents. However, large vehicles of fish companies, heavy vehicles of power plants and many vehicles of the under-construction Rupsha rail bridge ply the road.

"There are also brick, sand, stone and coal dealers on both sides of the road and overloaded trucks from those places ply it regularly. This made the road unusable," said Kamal Hossain.

Jalal Sheikh, a van driver in Bagmara, said, "It has become difficult to use the road. Not a day goes by that cars don't get stuck in the potholes."

506 hospitalised with dengue

At least 506 dengue patients were admitted to different hospitals across the country yesterday.

With the new cases, the total number of dengue cases rose to 15,852, according to the DGHS.

The total number of dengue deaths this year is 55 so far.

A total of 1,874 dengue patients are still undergoing treatment while 13,923 have been released from hospitals so far.

SSC QUESTION LEAK Headteacher placed on 3-day remand

A local court yesterday placed the headmaster of Nehal Uddin Pilot Girls' High School in Kurigram on remand over SSC question paper leak.

Lutfar Rahman was placed on three-day remand.

Kurigram Judicial Magistrate Suman Ali granted the remand around noon, said Officer-in-Charge of Bhurungamari Police Station Alamgir Hossain.

The court set October 2 for hearing the remand prayer of two other accused - Islamic teacher Jobayer Hossain and agriculture teacher Hamidul Islam of the same school.

Lutfar Rahman, also SSC exam centre's secretary in Lalmonirhat, Jobayer, Hamidul, Bangla teacher Sohail Chowdhury, English teacher Rasel Ahmed, and school staffer Sujon Mia were arrested on charge of leaking the SSC question paper on September 20.

NIKO GRAFT Khaleda's hearing deferred till November 8

A Dhaka court yesterday again adjourned till November 8 the hearing against BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia and eight others in Niko graft case.

Judge Sheikh Hafizur Rahman of Special Judge's Court-9 passed the order after a petition was filed on behalf of Khaleda, advocate Masud Ahmed Talukder, one of her lawyers, said. Masud told the court senior lawyer AJ Mohammad Ali could not appear before it due to illness. The defense has sought 46 dates so far.

Among the accused, Giasuddin Al Mamun is in jail while six others are on bail. ACC filed the case in December 2007, accusing Khaleda and others of abusing power to award a gas exploration and extraction deal to Canadian company Niko when she was the prime minister between 2001 and 2006.
