Thirty percent of Dhaka city wards do not have any playground or park. This situation hinders the mental and physical growth of children, as they have no space to play and interact with friends, say experts.

Mymensingh family continuing ancestral profession of making rhythmic musical instruments

A lone family of the Moni-Wrishi community has been continuing their ancestral profession of rhythmic musical instruments despite facing several pitfalls.

Narayan Chandra Das (84) came to Mymensingh with his parents as a 13-year-old boy from Manikganj. He now runs the instrument business along with his son Suvash Chandra Das and grandson Gopal Chandra Das.

Narayan claimed now they are the only family involved in making rhythmic instruments in Mymensingh.

"It is a great relief that stability in business has returned after the pandemic. Things have started to look up with the upcoming puja celebrations," said Narayan. "We continued this profession

even if she could complete her education, it would the issues dawned on her, be hard for her to manage she started working for a job because of her condition and the stigma attached to it. "If the government could

arrange rehabilitation and employment opportunities for people with disabilities, our lives would get better," she said.

All Shantona hopes for is an accessible society, where her height will not be a barrier to any opportunity.
