Bangladeshi film 'Adim' headed to Queens World Film Festival

Juboraj Shamim's film "Adim" (The Instinct) will soon be screened in New York. The much-talked-about film will be screened at the Queens Theatre and the Museum of the Moving Image.

Juboraj Shamim stated that the authorities of the Queens World Film Festival confirmed the news via email on September 21.

The first screening of the film will take place for selective guests only – including festival organisers, jury board, film directors, producers, distributors, and other film members. Then, the second screening will be held for audiences, who will have to pay a small fee to see the movie.

The festival will run between November 1-6.

Schoolground remains waterlogged half the year

Academic and co-curricular activities at a government primary school in Maheshpur upazila are being badly hampered as most portion of the school compound remained under stagnant water for over six months due to absence of proper drainage system.

A number of guardians said the schoolground goes under knee-deep water even after a moderate rain, much to the sufferings of students and teachers.

As a result, students and teachers of the institution have to wade through the water to go to the classrooms.

Moreover, the rest part of the schoolground, which is covered with large holes created from the demolition of an old building, had not been filled yet, they said, adding that teachers often hold the assembly on the balcony or in the

classroom.

Every year, the playground of Mandartala Government Primary School, covering 72 decimals of land, goes under water during the monsoon and remains waterlogged for nearly six months of the year.

However, there is a narrow path in front of the main building to walk to the classroom.

Students and teachers of the institution have to wade through the muddy water to go to the classrooms.

Most of the students of the institution complained that they could no longer use the playground for playing.

The school, established in 1955, has two buildings that housed four classrooms and an office room.

Headmaster of the institution

Mosharraf Hossain said the school currently has 226 students and six teachers.

The institution secured 100 percent pass rate in the last couple of years, but the current environment is in an appalling condition, he said.

Sometimes, teachers have to take off their shoes and fold up their trousers to go to and from school, the headmaster said.

The schoolground needs earth filling so that water cannot remain there, he said, adding that they have submitted letters to the authorities concerned and local public representatives in this regard, but to no avail.

Rezaul Islam, an assistant teacher of the school, said due to the stagnant water teachers and students cannot move freely and hold the assembly in the school compound. Maheshpur Upazila Primary Education Officer Abu Hasan said they were taking measured to fill the schoolground.

national and global political, economic and social events. BBC has been close to all public exam candidates."

He said though the BBC Bangla programme will be heard online, not all people, especially in the rural areas, can avail smartphones or internet. "I would request the British authorities to continue the radio service."

BBC Bangla radio broadcast began with a 15-minute weekly programme on October 11, 1941 and launched its website in 2005.

It proposed seven more language services move to digital only, modelling the success of others, which are already offering purely digital services and performing well with audiences. This means that nearly half of all 41 language services will be digital only.

Journalist-researcher Afsan Chowdhury, who worked for BBC Bangla, said BBC was always the most important radio service to Bangladeshis even before 1971, but during Liberation War, it became the ultimate radio platform that everyone turned to.

While Shadhin Bangla Betar Kendro was representative of the Bangladesh movement, BBC provided accurate news and international support. It signified the global nature and support for the war, he wrote in an opinion run by UNB yesterday.

It was after 1971, under an independent flag, that saw the reputation of the BBC grow. "... the hunger for information was satisfied mostly by the BBC broadcast, along with other foreign outlets."

He further said, "All good things do come to an end when the time comes and the wheels of change will bring forth new media forms and content, which will all be welcomed. But the memory of BBC Bangla radio will live on."

sign at the town's entrance in Donetsk region's north, a video posted by the president's chief of staff showed.

Neither side's battlefield assertions could be independently verified.

Russia has used Lyman as a logistics and transport hub for its operations in the north of the Donetsk region. Its fall would be Ukraine's biggest battlefield gain since a lightning counteroffensive in the northeastern Kharkiv region last month.

The Ukrainian military spokesperson said the capture of Lyman would allow Kyiv to advance into the Luhansk region, whose full capture Moscow announced at the beginning of July after weeks of slow, grinding advances.
