Police torture victims of robbery

Family alleges Savar DB personnel out to frame them instead of going after the culprits, also forced them to pay Tk 1.5 lakh

After they were robbed, they went to the police and lodged a complaint. But the law enforcers, instead of giving them the support they sought, brutally tortured them.

The allegations were made by the family of Godadhar Malo, a 68-year-old farmer of Majhipara area of Dhaka's Dhamrai upazila. He filed a case with Dhamrai Police Station on June 18,

accusing five to six unnamed individuals of entering his house and taking away cash, gold jewellery, and other valuables. About a month later, the Detective Branch of police got

the charge to investigate the case, and on September 6, the officers asked Godadhar's daughter-in-law Shyamoli Haldar Rupa and her 14-year-old son Diganta Halder to go to the office of Dhaka District (north) DB in Savar.

Rupa, 35, alleged that when she and her eighth grader son went there, the officers tortured her for three days in custody and her son for one day.

WB lowers GDP growth forecast for Bangladesh

Economy to grow 6.1pc in FY23, not 6.7pc projected in June

The World Bank has slashed its economic growth projection for Bangladesh for the current fiscal year to 6.1 percent because of higher inflation, energy shortage, slowdown of the recovery from the pandemic, and the war in Ukraine.

The new forecast is 0.6 percentage points lower than its previous projection of 6.7 percent made in June, according to the WB's South Asia Economic Focus titled "Coping with Shocks: Migration and the Road to Resilience" yesterday.

The projected growth is the lowest since 2019-20 when it fell to 3.45 percent as the pandemic brought the economies around the world to their knees.

Last month, the Asian Development Bank also cut its projection for Bangladesh's gross domestic product (GDP) growth to 6.6 percent this fiscal year from 7.1 percent.

The government had set an ambitious economic growth target of 7.5 percent for the current fiscal year.

According to the World Bank report,

GDP growth is projected to decelerate slightly in 2022-23 due to the slowdown of post-Covid recovery in consumption and investment.

French author Ernaux wins Nobel Prize in literature

French author Annie Ernaux nas won the 2022 Nobel Prize in Literature for "the courage and clinical acuity" in her autobiographical books examining personal memory inequality.

In explaining its choice, Swedish Academy yesterday said Ernaux, 82, "consistently and from different angles, examines a life marked by strong disparities regarding gender, language and class".

Govt to regulate service charges

The government will fix charges and set the services that private healthcare organisations can provide based on their capability, Health Minister Zahid Maleque said yesterday.

"We will divide all private healthcare organisations into A, B, C [and D] categories based on their number of beds, human resources and equipment. None will be allowed to provide treatment going beyond their category," Maleque said at a press conference following a meeting in this regard at the Secretariat.

The ministry did not follow through with a similar initiative to regulate service charges in 2019, but it revived the project again

yesterday to regulate health service charges. As the Covid-19 emergency began in early 2020, the 2019 initiative

could not go ahead, health officials said. In 2019, there was a meeting at the health ministry where representatives of owners of private healthcare organisations had opposed capping service charges, instead preferring a competitive market price policy from the government, health officials said.

The owners opposed the initiative yesterday too as officials of the Directorate General of the Health Services (DGHS) placed a proposal regarding the categories and charges for different services, multiple sources who attended the meeting told The Daily Star.

Owners of top healthcare organisations including LabAid and Popular Diagnostics, Universal Medical College Hospital, and representatives from Bangladesh Private Clinic Diagnostic Owners Association and Bangladesh Private Medical College Association attended the meeting, among others.

Ex-cop kills 38 in a knife and gun rampage

THAI NURSERY MASSACRE

22 children among dead; suspect takes own life after killing wife, child

A former policeman killed 38 people, including 22 children, in a knife and gun rampage at a nursery in Thailand yesterday, later shooting dead his wife and child at their home before turning

his weapon on himself, police said. The children at the nursery in Uthai Sawan, a town 500 km northeast of Bangkok, were mostly stabbed to death, they said.

Police identified the attacker as a former member of the force who was dismissed from his post last year over drug allegations and he was facing trial

on a drugs charge. The man had been in court earlier in the day and had then gone to the nursery to

collect his child, police spokesperson Paisal Luesomboon told broadcaster ThaiPBS.


