

UN body rejects debate on China's rights record

The UN rights council yesterday rejected a Western-led motion to hold a debate about alleged human rights abuses in China's Xinjiang region after a UN report found possible crimes against humanity.

The defeat is only the second time in the council's 16-year history that a motion has been rejected and is seen by observers as a setback to both accountability efforts and the West's moral authority on human rights. The US, Canada and UK were among the countries that called for the motion.

China's envoy warned shortly before the vote that the motion would create a "dangerous shortcut" for examining other countries' human rights records. "Today China is targeted. Tomorrow any other developing country will be targeted," said Chen Xu.

IRAN CRACKDOWN IN ZAHEDAN 82 killed since Sept 30: Amnesty

At least 82 people have been killed by Iranian security forces in the city of Zahedan in the southeastern Sistan-Baluchistan province since protests erupted there on September 30, Amnesty International said yesterday.

In a violent crackdown after Friday prayers on September 30, security forces killed at least 66 people, including children, Amnesty said. Since then, 16 people have been killed in an ongoing clampdown on protests, it added, warning the real toll is likely to be even higher.

With Iran already convulsed by protests over the death of Mahsa Amini who had been arrested by the Tehran morality police, the protests in Zahedan were triggered by anger over the reported rape of a teenage girl by a police commander in the region.

Amnesty said that security forces fired "live ammunition, metal pellets and teargas" at protesters, bystanders and worshippers when a group of people gathered for a protest outside a police station after Friday prayers on September 30 in Zahedan. "Evidence gathered by Amnesty International shows that the majority of victims were shot in the head, heart, neck and torso, revealing a clear intent to kill or seriously harm."

It added that the firing had come from the "police station rooftop". At least three children were killed on September 30. Iranian officials have characterised the unrest as attacks by "extremists" on police stations that left five members of the Revolutionary Guards dead.

Climate change made 2022 drought '20 times likelier'

Say scientists, warn that extreme dry periods will become increasingly common with global heating

Human-caused climate change made this summer's drought across the Northern Hemisphere at least 20 times more likely, according to a rapid analysis released Wednesday that warns such extreme dry periods will become increasingly common with global heating.

The three months from June-August were the hottest in Europe since records began, and the exceptionally high temperatures led to the worst drought the continent has witnessed since the Middle Ages.

Crops withered in European breadbaskets, as the historic dry spell drove record wildfire intensity and placed severe pressure on the continent's power grid.

Successive heatwaves between June and July, which saw temperatures top 40 degrees Celsius in Britain for the first time,

saw some 24,000 excess deaths in Europe.

China and North America also experienced unusually high temperatures and exceptionally low rainfall over the period.

An international team of climate scientists have determined the warming caused by human activity made such extreme weather significantly more likely than it would have been at the dawn of the industrial age.

The World Weather Attribution service calculated that the agricultural and ecological drought over the Northern Hemisphere was at least 20 times likelier thanks to global heating.

"The 2022 summer has shown how human-induced climate change is increasing the risks of agricultural and ecological droughts in densely populated and cultivated regions of the North Hemisphere," said Sonia

Seneviratne, a professor at the Institute for Atmospheric and Climate Science at ETH Zurich in Switzerland and one of the study contributors.

To quantify the effect of human-caused climate change on soil moisture levels, the team analysed weather data and computer simulations to compare the real climate as it is today -- that is, some 1.2C hotter than pre-industrial levels -- with a climate absent of any human-induced heating.

They found that western and central Europe experienced particularly severe drought. Moisture in the top 7cm of soil across the Northern Hemisphere was made five times likelier to experience severe drought due to climate change, the study found.

For the top one metre of soil -- known as the root zone -- this summer's dryness was made at least 20 times likelier due to global heating.

North Korea fires ballistic missiles

Flies warplanes as it blames US for 'escalation'

North Korea yesterday fired two ballistic missiles and flew warplanes, while claiming its recent blitz of sanctions-busting tests were necessary countermeasures against joint military drills by the United States and South Korea. As the United Nations Security Council met to discuss Pyongyang's Tuesday launch of an intermediate-range ballistic missile over Japan, North Korea blamed Washington for "escalating the military tensions on the Korean peninsula". The recent launches -- six in less than two weeks -- were "the just counteraction measures of the Korean People's Army", Pyongyang's foreign ministry said in a statement yesterday. Seoul, Tokyo and Washington have ramped up joint military drills in recent weeks, and carried out fresh exercises yesterday involving a US navy destroyer from the USS Ronald Reagan aircraft carrier's strike group. The United States redeployed the nuclear-powered aircraft carrier to waters east of South Korea as part of a broad-ranging military response to Pyongyang's Tuesday test, which also included joint bombing and missile drills. The carrier's redeployment prompted an angry response from the North. Seoul's military said it had scrambled 30 fighter jets yesterday after 12 North Korean warplanes staged a rare "formation flight north of the inter-Korean air boundary [and] conducted air-to-surface firing drills."

Sonia Gandhi joins Rahul-led Congress march

India's Opposition Congress President Sonia Gandhi yesterday joined the "Bharat Jodo Yatra" (Unite India Street March) by her son Rahul in Mandya town of the southern Indian state of Karnataka, in her first participation in a public event of the party

after a long gap. Amid cheers and slogan-shouting by party workers, Sonia walked besides Rahul Gandhi and other leaders in Mandya town of Karnataka in a bid to bolster the party's pan-India "Bharat Jodo" (Unite India) campaign. Sonia walked a short distance, surrounded

by a large crowd of party workers, before getting into a car. At one point of the street march, Rahul Gandhi was seen kneeling next to his mother to tie her shoelaces. Sonia was expected to address a rally in Ballary to launch the party's campaign in BJP-ruled Karnataka that will go for fresh state assembly elections in a few months.

DEATHS OF 66 KIDS IN GAMBIA WHO probing Indian cough syrup

The World Health Organization (WHO) issued an alert Wednesday over four cough and cold syrups made by Maiden Pharmaceuticals in India, warning they could be linked to the deaths of 66 children in The Gambia.

The UN health agency also cautioned the contaminated medications may have been distributed outside of the West African country, with global exposure "possible".

WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus told reporters the cold and cough syrups in question "have been potentially linked with acute kidney injuries and 66 deaths among children."

According to the alert issued by WHO Wednesday, the four products are Promethazine Oral Solution, Kofexmalin Baby Cough Syrup, Makoff Baby Cough Syrup and Magrip N Cold Syrup.
