

Raihan M Chowdhury passes away

UNB, Dhaka

Raihan M Chowdhury, senior news consultant at The Financial Express (FE), died at a city hospital yesterday.

He was 57. Raihan, who had been suffering from liver cirrhosis, breathed his last at Islami Bank Central Hospital around 2:00pm, his colleagues said.

He left behind his wife, two sons and a host of relatives and well-wishers to mourn his death.

He had been working for FE since 1996. During his tenure, he also worked as the newspaper's senior business editor.

The bus could not be identified. Police rushed the spot and recovered the bodies from the highway.

In Natore, a CNG-run auto-rickshaw driver was killed and two of its passengers were injured in a head-on collision between the vehicle and a truck in Singra upazila.

The deceased was identified as Rafiqul Islam (40) from Singra.

Inspector ANM Masud, in charge of Jhalmalia Highway Police Station, said Rafiqul died instantly. Locals rescued the injured, Ashikur Rahman and Bulbul Hossain, and took them to Singra Upazila Health Complex, from where Ashikur was transferred to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Conservation Act; forming National Commission for Minorities; properly implementing Transfer of Entrusted Property Act as well as Hill Peace Agreement and Hill Land Commission Act; and implementing Plaintiffs Act.

The leaders of Oikya Parishad say that the present government has not implemented these promises.

Bangladesh Workers Party President Rashed Khan Menon said the anti-discrimination law has already been placed in parliament. Hopefully, it will be passed soon.

The five arrestees are Biman MT operator Jahangir Alam (36), Mohammad Mahfuz Alam Bhuiyan (31), Enamul Haque (27), office assistant Awlad Hossain (29) and Harunur Rashid (40).

Deputy Commissioner of Lalbagh Division of DB Moshirur Rahman said evidence including leaked question paper have been seized from the arrestees.

He also said, detectives will interrogate the members of the committee formed to conduct recruitment tests of airline.

"The exam-conducting committee, which includes Biman's general manager and deputy general

manager, was supposed to take all measures to stop question leak. Yet, the office assistants leaked the questions... We will interrogate all and take legal action," Harun said.

Asked if any member of the committee is involved, Harun said they are investigating the matter.

"We will appeal [before a Dhaka Court] for taking the arrestees on remand," he said, adding detectives will try to find out other beneficiaries. Following the suspension of the tests, Biman formed an enquiry committee to investigate the incident, said sources.

The committee has been asked to submit its report within five days.
