Couple killed in road accident

Swapna Akhter (25) husband and her Hossain Israfil (35)worked separate factories in Dhamrai's Sutipara. Every day, the couple





used to go to work on Ismail's bicycle.

Ismail would drop Swapna at her workplace and later go to his. The couple, who have been married for 12 years with a 10-year-old son, were living a life of tranquillity and in the comfort of each other's presence, unaware of what fate had in store for them.

Like a usual workday for the last two months, they started for the factories on Ismail's bicycle yesterday. However, they never reached their destinations.

A bus rammed the cycle on its way, leaving the two dead on the Dhaka-Aricha highway at Srirampur at 7:30am. Life has suddenly become uncertain for their 10-year-

old son Shaon, who is a second-grader at a local school. "Shaon has been orphaned. What would happen to him now? Who will look after him?" asked Naznin Akhter, the grieving sister of Israfil.

The bodies were recovered and the bus was seized. However, the driver and the helper fled the scene," said SI Shah Alam of Golra Highway Police Station.

"A case was filed against the driver and the helper. We are trying to capture them," he added.

Govt shuts down Care Medical College

government cancelled the authorisation of Dhaka's Care Medical College to run academic activities.

The decision was taken on October 23 at a meeting at the health ministry, as the college authorities expressed their inability to run the institution in accordance with the rules, according to a circular signed by Mahbuba Bilkis, deputy secretary of the ministry, yesterday.

For failing to meet standards, the ministry stopped admission of new students from the 2016-17 academic year.

The college authorities, however, continued their academic activities, as the High Court had stayed the ministry order, after the college filed a writ petition.

The institution then withdrew its petition on July 26 this year, saying that the college authorities were "unable" to continue academic activities.

Earlier on June 14, an audit team from Directorate General of Medical Education visited the college and found a number of issues, including unsuitable academic atmosphere, shortage teachers, hospitals of and college on separate sites, and only 10 percent hospital-bed occupancy rate instead of the required 70 percent.

Paying attention to a timely need Country to introduce post-crash response care

The government, for the first time in the country, is going to develop a strategy and action plan for postcrash response care for road crash victims.

Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) with assistance from non-government organisations and UN bodies -- has already developed a draft and expects to finalise it within a few months, said DGHS officials.

The development came at a time when the country is witnessing a sharp rise in road-crash deaths. Around two-thirds of the victims succumb to their injuries on the way to hospitals.

As per the World Health Organisation (WHO) Global Status Report on Road Safety (2018), an estimated 25,000 people lost their lives in 2016 due to road-crash related injuries in Bangladesh. The number is almost 10 times the official number given by police that year. According to Bangladesh Health and Injury Survey

2016, two-thirds of all road-crash victims die on the way to hospitals, while three-fourths do not receive any form of pre-hospital care. However, despite the alarming numbers, there is

no strategy, protocol or guideline on pre-hospital care to ensure emergency medical services for roadcrash victims at the crash site, according to United Nations Road Safety Fund (UNRSF).

According to UNRSF, post-crash morbidity and mortality can be reduced by providing timely pre-hospital and hospital-based care. Hence, it is imperative to have a robust post-crash response system in place.

High fatality and injury rates on Bangladesh's roads are undermining the remarkable progress that the country has made in boosting economic growth and reducing poverty, says UNRSF.

UNRSF is funding WHO for developing the strategy and plan for the government.

DGHS requested the WHO country office in Bangladesh to support it in drafting the strategy and the action plan.

"We do not have any policy regarding post-crash response for road-crash victims. Hence, we are developing the plan," said Prof Robed Amin, line director at Non-Communicable Disease Control (NCDC) of DGHS.

Ilias Hossain Molla, a UP member, said the supporters of AL candidate Monirul Haque Mithu and Mahbub Mia had an altercation near Ismanir Char No-2 Primary School area around 9:00am.

Three people injured Mithu's supporters fired some shots, said Ilias, also a witness.

The injured were transferred from Gozaria Upazila Health Complex to Dhaka, said its doctor Kanti Rani Biswas.

Upazila Nirbahi Officer Ziaul Islam Chowdhury said, "We heard about the incident."

Gozaria Police Station Officer-in-Charge Molla Saheb Ali said they suffered bullet injuries, fired from a shotgun. "No cases have been filed yet," he added.

'PROTESTING HARASSMENT' Youth stabbed in Dhaka bus dies

A 25-year-old youth died early yesterday after being stabbed in a moving bus in the capital's

The deceased is Rabbi, said Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station Sub-inspector Mahesh Singh. The incident took place around 8:00pm on Tuesday. Another youth Shaon (20), was also

injured in the incident. The victims along with their friends were returning from a picnic in Dhamrai. On the bus, a few other passengers including one Faruk were smoking and harassing the female friends of the victims, according to Shaon's friend Shanto.

Rabbi protested the incident. Soon after, some youths boarded the bus from Asad Gate intersection and stabbed Rabbi and Shaon.

They were rushed to DMCH where Rabbi died around 1:30am. OC Shahjahan Mandol said they have arrested the main accused.

Biman taking steps to prevent loss State minister tells JS

Biman Bangladesh Airlines has taken various measures, like introducing dynamic ticket pricing, to prevent irregularities and loss, State Minister for Civil Aviation M Mahbub Ali told parliament yesterday.

Replying to Jatiya Party MP Nasrin Jahan Ratna, Ali said earlier, Biman had to incur huge losses, as its ticket prices were not in accordance with the international

"The introduction of dynamic pricing made it possible to strictly monitor the process of fixing ticket prices, which led to Biman's revenue rising," he said.

In a scripted answer, the state minister said Biman has also taken strict measures to increase the quality of passenger services.

"Biman has reduced the average luggage delivery time to 45 minutes through efficient ground handling. The national airline is working to bring this down to 30 minutes." he said. Ali said Biman purchased ground support equipment (GSE) equipment worth Tk 45 crore this year to increase luggage handling capacity.

"Different types of equipment worth Tk 80 crore will be added soon. Process to purchase GSE equipment worth Tk 113 crore will be completed by June 2023."

Replying to another query, Ali said the government has a plan to upgrade the Barishal domestic airport to an international one.
