A teenage cast-off leads Dutch charge

One of the world's most formidable defenders, a combination circumstance and misfortune means only now is Virgil van Dijk set to appear at his first major international tournament.

From a teenager essentially discarded by Willem II to an underrated prospect at Groningen, Van Dijk became the world's most expensive defender when Liverpool signed him for £75 million from Southampton in 2018.

His debut season coincided with Liverpool's run to the Champions League final. In the next season, however, Liverpool went on to lift

Jail Killing Day today

The nation will observe Jail Killing Day today by paying rich tributes to four national leaders and Liberation War heroes who were brutally murdered inside the Dhaka Central Jail on November 3, 1975.

The four senior leaders - Sved Nazrul Islam, acting president of Bangladesh government in exile in 1971, Tajuddin Ahmed, prime minister of the same government, M Mansur Ali, finance minister, and AHM Qamaruzzaman, minister for home affairs, relief and rehabilitation -- were killed by some army officers.

They were assassinated 79 days after Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and most of his family members were killed on August 15,

To observe the day, the AL has chalked out an elaborate programme including placing wreaths at the graves of Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmad, Mansur Ali at Banani graveyard around 7:30am and at the grave of AHM Qamruzzaman in Rajshahi.

The party will also arrange a discussion at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the city at 3:00pm.

Dengue rages in 60 dists

The dengue situation in the country is alarming as the mosquito-borne virus has already spread to 60 districts. Kurigram, Gaibandha, Thakurgaon

and Rangpur are the only four districts still safe from the virus, according to data of the Directorate General of Health Services.

At least four people died from dengue and 1,094 were admitted to hospitals with dengue fever in 24 hours till yesterday morning.

With this, the total number of dengue infections in the country this year rose to 40,101, including 12,953 reported outside Dhaka. The fatalities from dengue rose to 152, including 60 outside Dhaka, shows DGHS data.

Of the deaths, 92 were recorded in Dhaka, 23 in Cox's Bazar, 16 in Chattogram, six in Barishal, four each in Mymensingh and Khulna, two in Narail and one each was logged in Narsingdi, Pabna, Khagrachhari, Bogura, Madaripur and Feni.
