

# 'Life of the planet' at stake in climate crisis

Biden tells COP27, vows US 'will meet' target of slashing carbon emissions by 2030

US President Joe Biden addressed the COP27 climate conference in Egypt posed an existential threat to the planet warming. It came even as a slew of crises and promising that the United

States was doing its part to combat it.

"The climate crisis is about human security, economic environmental security, security, national security, and the very life of the planet,' Biden said, before outlining steps the United States, the world's second-biggest greenhouse gas emitter, was

"I can stand here as president of the United States of America and say with confidence, the United States of America will meet our emissions targets by 2030,"

His speech was intended to remind

government representatives gathered in Sharm el-Sheikh to keep alive a goal of keeping the global average temperature rise within 1.5 degrees Celsius to yesterday, saying the global climate crisis avert the worst impacts of planetary

> from a land war in Europe to rampant inflation - distract international focus.

"Against this backdrop, it's more urgent than ever that we double down on our climate commitments. Russia's war only enhances the urgency of the need to transition the world off its dependence on fossil fuels," he said.

protesters to remove their sign.

## India SC frees six killers of Rajiv Gandhi

India's top court yesterday ordered the release of six people convicted over the assassination of former prime minister Rajiv Gandhi.

Gandhi was 46 when he was killed by a woman suicide bomber at an election rally in the southern state of Tamil

The assassination was carried out by the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), a Sri Lankan armed

India's supreme court said the convicts were being released based on their "satisfactory conduct" in prison and that they had served over three decades of jail time.

The six -- three of whom had been condemned to death before their sentences were commuted -- are the last still in prison for the assassination, although two were already

"I am very happy... I am very thankful to each and everybody," Nalini Sriharan, one of the two on parole, told broadcaster CNN News18. The "last 32 years have been a struggle", she added.

She and her husband -- another of the convicts ordered released by the court -- were both initially condemned to

Bangladeshi origin Nabilah Islam, 32, made history in the US midterm elections, becoming the first-ever Muslim and the youngest woman to be elected to the Georgia Senate.

# Ukrainian troops enter Kherson

#### Hail 'important victory' as Russia completes pullout

Ukraine said yesterday its forces were entering the southern city of Kherson and hailed an "important victory" after Russia announced its troops had retreated from the only regional capital it has captured after nearly nine months fighting.

announcement Moscow's pullout was over came hours after Russian strikes killed seven people in Mykolaiv, a city near Kherson, that Russian troops have troops. But the Kremlin insisted

"Kherson is returning to Ukrainian control and units of the Armed Forces of Ukraine are entering the city," the defence ministry said on social media.

It added that its artillery teams had clear views over Russia's routes to retreat and warned: "Any attempts that to oppose the Armed Forces of Ukraine will be stopped."

Russia announced earlier that it had finished pulling back its
