Kelly's win in Arizona leaves Democrats one seat shy of upper house control; Nevada still counting votes

President Joe Biden's Democrats edged closer to retaining control of the US Senate on Friday, as Donald Trump prepared to declare his bid for the White House in 2024. Democratic Senator Mark Kelly won

re-election in Arizona, three television networks projected. His victory will give Democrats 49 Senate seats, one short of securing a majority, with Nevada still counting votes and Georgia's

Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader yesterday accused BNP of starting nomination trade ahead of the general election.

He said the nomination trade has already begun, and money is already flying in the air.

He made the remarks while addressing the triennial council of the ruling party's Brahmanbaria district unit at Niaz Mohammed Stadium.

"Sacks of money are being traded for the position of MPs and ministers. We will play against Tarique Rahman who laundered billions of taka. We will play against the nomination trade. We will play in the next election," Quader said.

Russian FM due in Dhaka this month

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov is likely to be in Dhaka on a brief official visit later this month to discuss bilateral, regional, and global issues of mutual interest

Earlier, Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen extended an invitation to his Russian counterpart to attend the 22nd IORA Council of Ministers meeting to be held in Dhaka on November 24.

Russia is a dialogue partner of the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA).

Bangladesh, the current chair of IORA, expects over a dozen ministers including the Russian foreign minister at the meeting, a senior official

Apart from meeting Momen, the Russian foreign minister is likely to meet Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

Momen met his Russian counterpart last month in Astana, Kazakhstan, on the sidelines of the CICA Summit and apprised him of the current situation of the Rohingyas.

He stressed the need for stronger international support for resolving the Rohingya crisis.

In August, Lavrov met Myanmar Foreign Minister Wunna Maung Lwin in Naypyitaw.

326 killed in Iran protest crackdown

Says rights group in updated toll

Iranian security forces have killed at least 326 people in a crackdown on nationwide protests since Mahsa Amini's death in custody, Iran Human Rights (IHR) said in an updated toll yesterday.

The Islamic republic has been gripped by protests that erupted over the death of Amini on September 16, three days after her arrest for an alleged breach of the country's strict dress code for women.

The protests were fanned by fury

over the dress rules for women, but have grown into a broad movement against the theocracy that has ruled Iran since the 1979 revolution.

"At least 326 people, including 43 children and 25 women, have been killed by security forces in the ongoing nationwide protests," Oslo-based IHR said in a statement posted on its website.

The latest toll represents an increase of 22 since the rights group issued its previous figures on November 5.
