

Dengue claims 3 more lives

At least three dengue patients died, while 760 were admitted to different hospitals across the country in the last 24 hours till yesterday morning.

The total number of fatalities and cases have now risen to 205 and 49,300.

According to DGHS, among the deaths, 120 occurred in Dhaka, 24 in Cox's Bazar, 26 in Chittagong, seven in Barishal, seven in Khulna, five in Mymensingh, two each in Rajshahi and Narail, and one each in Narsingdi, Kushtia, Pabna, Bagerhat, Khagrachhari, Bogura, Madaripur and Feni.

A total of 46,106 patients have already been released, of whom 15,830 are from outside Dhaka.

BRTC to bring all city buses under e-ticketing by December

The state run Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) has taken a move to bring all city-service buses under its jurisdiction, operating in Dhaka and adjacent areas, under an e-ticketing system by December this year, aiming to reduce the hassle of passengers and improve overall services.


As part of the plan, BRTC will start e-ticketing services in all 71 BRTC buses operating from Gazipur to different destinations in Dhaka from today.

BRTC launched the e-ticketing service last year, and so far introduced this system on eight city routes.

The development came as e-ticketing service for buses on the Mirpur route started partially on Saturday, as part of the private bus operators' plan to bring all city buses under the system within February next year.

Until Saturday, helpers of almost all private buses collected bus fares manually without providing any tickets and

Climate change multiplying risk of displacement, migration

Say speakers at COP27 side-event

Bangladesh government, International Organization for Migration (IOM) and Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF) yesterday jointly called for more global action to address climate-induced migration and displacement.

At a side-event during the 27th Conference of the Parties (COP27) in Sharm El-Sheikh of Egypt, the participants recognised that climate change is a risk multiplier for displacement and migration.

Millions of people throughout the world will be impacted by climate-induced displacement unless immediate action is taken, said a press release issued by IOM Bangladesh.

The parties called for collective action to minimise mass migration and displacement due to climate change, read the release.

Participants also noted that concerted action on climate change mitigation and adaptation with inclusive development

polices, and embedding climate migration in policy and planning will help address some challenges surrounding climate migration.

Jointly organised by Bangladesh government, IOM and CVF, the event was on "Human Mobility in the Context of Climate Change: Building a Positive Narrative on Migration and Climate Action".

According to Global Report on Internal Displacement 2021, 216 million people could become internal climate migrants by 2050, said the IOM release.

With a population of 165 million and high susceptibility to flooding, storm surges, riverbank erosion and salination, Bangladesh is one of the most vulnerable countries to the adverse effects of climate change, it adds.

Bangladesh is also at the forefront of climate change adaptation, and disaster risk reduction and management efforts, as well as consensus

'Justice denied to victims by authorities'

Speakers tell discussion marking 10 years of Tazreen tragedy

In a discussion held by RMG workers yesterday, economist Prof Anu Muhammad asked why the rich leave the country and money launderers settle abroad with their families and children despite Bangladesh's promises of being a developed country.

The discussion was arranged by Bangladesh Garment Sramik Sanghati, a rights platform for RMG workers.

The organisation also launched a 10 day photo exhibition, centring 10 years of the Tazreen Tragedy, where a fire claimed the lives of over 100 RMG workers in a factory at Ashulia on November 24, 2012.

Sohela Khatun, a mother of a victim of the incident, inaugurated the exhibition around 3:30pm, at

Sangskriti Bikash Kendra Bhaban in the capital's Poribagh.

During a discussion followed by the exhibition, Prof Anu Muhammad said though RMG workers have been repeatedly demanding security, the government hardly shows any interest in the matter.

He further said the owner of Tazreen Factory got out on bail, just after a few days of prison time.

"Questions remain as to whether the victims of the incident will get any justice," he said.

Sohela Khatun said, "My son was the one who took care of the entire family. Ten years have passed since he perished in the fire. We have not yet met with justice." CPhotographer Shahidul Alam


