



Dengue cases cross 50,000 mark, three more die

With 767 new dengue cases recorded yesterday, the total number of people infected with the mosquito-borne disease crossed the 50,000 mark this year.

Besides, the death toll has risen to 216, with three more fatalities.

According to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), the number of total cases rose to 50,759 in the past 24 hours till yesterday morning, of which, 17,760 are from outside Dhaka.

Of the deaths, 128 occurred in Dhaka, 24 in Cox's Bazar, 29 in Chattogram, nine in Barishal, seven in Khulna,

Finally, a contractor
BR appoints firm four months after project deadline

Bangladesh Railway (BR) finally appointed a contractor to carry out preparatory work for a project to build a workshop for maintaining railway carriages and wagons, four months after the project's original deadline expired.

BR took the said project in February 2020. The delay in appointing the contractor led the authorities to extend the deadline up to June 2024 from its original deadline of June 2022.

This means that the 1.5-year project will now take at least 3.5 years.

The Tk 30.05-crore project was supposed to be completed yet. Yesterday, BR appointed a French-Bangladeshi joint venture firm to carry out the feasibility study and prepare a detailed design for the workshop in Rajbari.

Under the contract, the firm will get 16 months to complete the work at a cost of Tk 26.98 crore.

The companies are Systra SA of France and Development Design Consultants Ltd of Bangladesh.

Project Director Kudrot E-Khuda and Systra (South Asia) Managing Director Hari Somalraju

signed the contract on behalf of their organisations at Rail Bhaban in the presence of Railways Minister Nurul Islam Sujan.

Sujan asked the contractors to complete the work within the deadline.

Asked, Kudrot E-Khuda said the Covid-19 pandemic has caused the delay in the tendering

Currently, the maintenance of both metre-gauge and broad-gauge carriages and wagons is being carried out at Saidpur Carriage and Wagon Shop.

process, consequently delaying the implementation of the project.

However, BR sources said it was the legal complexities over the tendering process that caused the delay.

Khuda said their contractor will complete the feasibility study within the first eight months of the contract and then prepare an engineering design and a tender document in detail.

Besides, he said if the project is found to be feasible, they will prepare a development project

However, a large number of carriages and wagons have been procured in the last few years and an additional fleet is expected to be added in the near future.

And so, BR has taken the initiative to construct a modern maintenance workshop in Rajbari, said a BR official, requesting anonymity.

Railways Ministry Secretary Humayun Kabir and BR Director General Dharendra Nath Mazumder also spoke during the contract signing ceremony.



People waiting to oust govt: Fakhrul

BNP yesterday claimed that the people are now eager like a “rumbling volcano” to oust the current government.

Political situation, bigotry behind tourism drop
Say travel-agent leaders

Association of Travel Agents of Bangladesh (ATAB) yesterday said unhealthy political environment and religious bigotry are the major reasons why foreign tourists are not coming to Bangladesh, restricting the tourism sector from flourishing.

Top leaders of ATAB – a platform of around 3,500 travel agents across the country – also said the government is doing almost nothing to develop or boost the country's tourism industry.

ATAB leaders made the remarks while holding a courtesy call with the newly elected executive committee of Aviation and Tourism Journalists' Forum of Bangladesh (ATJFB) at its office in the capital.

Tanzim Anwar, president of ATJFB, led the delegation on behalf of the organisation.

ATAB President SM Manzur Murshed Mahbub said media plays a crucial role in developing the tourism industry in any country.

ATAB Secretary General Abdus Salam Aref said there are many problems regarding fixing airfare by different airlines operating to and from Bangladesh.

Mentioning their issues with Biman and the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh, he said, “We all should work together to solve them.”

About ATAB's first ever three-day long Bangladesh International Travel and Tourism Expo, which will start on December 1, he said they want to discuss all their issues in the expo.

Chinese national among 6 jailed

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced six people, including a Chinese national and two officials of National Bank Ltd, to different terms of imprisonment in a case filed over the embezzlement of Tk 2.59 crore.

The accused are Chinese National Yang Wang Chung, chairman of The Sinfa Knitters Ltd, its managing director Khasru Al Rahman, directors Golam Mostafa and Mansurul Haque, the then senior vice president (export) of National Bank Ltd at Dilkusha branch Abdul Wadud Khan, and its executive vice-president Shahabuddin Chowdhury.

Abdul Wadud and Shahabuddin were each sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined
