'Limitations' hinder freeing rivers from pollution

Says state minister for shipping

He said this while replying to journalists at the premises of Rajshahi divisional commissioner's office, before attending a divisional workshop on a study centring Atrai, Ichhamati, Boral, Mahananda and Punarbhaba rivers.

"Bangladesh could not collect the equipment [needed to free the waterbodies from pollution]," he said.

He said the government took up a project to collect equipment to tackle river pollution.

Myanmar situation barrier to regional cooperation

Says foreign secretary at 'Bay of Bengal Conversation'

The unresolved Rohingya issue and Myanmar's political situation stand in the way of harnessing the full potential of inter-regional connectivity and cooperation in South and South-east Asia, contributed to people-to-people said Masud Bin Momen, foreign secretary of Bangladesh.

He made the comment in a discussion on "Evaluating the State of Trade and Connectivity in South and East Asia" on the second day of the regional conference "Bay of Bengal Conversation" yesterday.

The three-day conference has

been organised by Centre for Governance Studies (CGS) at Pan Pacific Sonargaon Hotel in the capital.

Momen said the existing rail connectivity between India and Bangladesh has substantially contact and trade prospects.

Bangladesh exploring prospects centring power and cooperation through energy bilateral links between India, Bhutan and Nepal, he said.

Momen also hoped for a connection between Nepal and Bhutan through inland waterways,

which Bangladesh and India are enjoying at present. Besides, Bangladesh is eyeing direct shipping and coastal link with Malaysia, Sri Lanka and other regional countries.

'We are carefully looking at the potential of BIG-B, an initiative of Japan, Belt and Road Initiative, Indo-Pacific Framework. We are very much on track to facilitate trade, as we have thought out prospects of regional connectivity and devised appropriate policies," he said.

SC stays ex-ACC director's bail

The Supreme Court yesterday stayed till December 5 a High Court order that granted bail to suspended Anti-Corruption Commission director Khandaker Enamul Basir in a Tk 40-lakh bribery case.

Enamul was sentenced to eight years' imprisonment in

Chamber judge of the Appellate Division Justice M Enavetur Rahim passed the order following a petition filed by ACC, seeking a stay on the bail order. The chamber judge also asked the ACC to file a leave-

to-appeal petition with this court against the HC order by December 5. Following the Supreme Court order, Basir cannot get released from jail, ACC lawyer Khurshid Alam Khan told

In response to a petition, the High Court on November 17 granted ad-interim bail to Enamul Basir for six

On February 23, a special judge's court in Dhaka sentenced Enamul and Mizanur Rahman, suspended deputy inspector general of police, to eight and three years in jail, respectively, in the case filed over transaction of Tk 40 lakh as bribe.

Enamul was sentenced to three years for taking Tk 40 lakh as bribe from Mizan, and five years for laundering the amount.

The Dhaka court sentenced Mizan to three years'

imprisonment for giving the amount. On July 16, 2019, the ACC filed the case with its Integrated District Office in Dhaka under the money laundering prevention act.
