#### Cop among three killed in road crashes

Three people were killed in separate road accidents in Narsingdi and Chattogram yesterday, report correspondents.

In Narsingdi's Shibpur upazila, a sub-inspector of Demra Police Station, Md Sabuj (30), was killed as a truck ran over his bike in Karar Char area around 9:00am, said Demra Police Station Officer-in-Charge (Investigation) Mollah.

He was rushed to Narsingdi Sadar Hospital at first, and when his condition deteriorated, the doctors sent him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries around 12:00pm, said police.

# Surma dredging plan may turn futile

Say experts as BWDB prepares to dredge 15km of 166km river

This year was a disastrous blow for Sylhet's people, due to a devastating flood that continued for around two months from May 12.

Besides floods, in recent years, the city has been facing acute waterlogging. On September 5, only three hours of rain inundated many areas of the city.

For this situation, experts and authorities concerned have pointed fingers at the struggle for Surma river to navigate through the city.

Amid the long-standing demand of dredging the river, it took authorities decades to finally decide on it.

The 15.05 kilometres of Surma, beside the city, is set to be dredged

that dredging a small part of the 166-kilometre trans-boundary river won't change the flood situation. REASONS BEHIND DELAYED INITIATIVES

From 2012 to 2019, Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) prepared three project proposals to dredge Surma and other

waterbodies in the upper-Meghna resources basin. The first two were scrapped by the ministry.

Its 2019 proposal, which had a budget of Tk 2,200 crore, faced an inter-departmental challenge, since Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) also prepared a Tk 3,000 crore (approx)

After a stalemate in the decision, two more years of inaction passed

Eventually, the situation led to this year's flood, displacing more than 3.68 lakh people and incurring financial losses of Tk 1,238 crore for the division (according to government data).

Considering the pressing demand, BWDB finally got the approval to dredge a small part environmental of the river beside the city under activists raised concerns saying an ongoing project to protect budget of Tk 120.81 crore, and the riverbanks.

> AKM Niloy Pasha, assistant engineer of BWDB Sylhet, said, "There was an ongoing project to protect Surma's riverbank at Sylhet Sadar and Bishwanath upazila's Rajapur, Mahtabpur and Dashgram

Under this project, the water

ministry's organisation -- Institute of Water Modelling -- conducted a hydromorphology study and found that 15.05 kilometres need dredging.

"According to the study, a tender has been called. However, as the recent flood changed the riverbed in some areas, the detailed project plan (DPP) has been revised and now awaiting ministry approval," he said.

ongoing project is scheduled to be finished by June next year, and 1,650 metres of the riverbank is being protected from erosion under the project," said

"With the revised DPP, we've added another 325 metres of riverbank protection in Sylhet Sadar along with the dredging work. The original DPP was had a revised one will be disclosed after approval," he added.

## **DGFI OFFICIAL MURDER CASE** ARSA leader among 66 accused

Sixty-six persons have been made accused in the case filed over the murder of a DGFI officer near the Tumbru border in Bandarban's Naikkhangchhari on November 14.

Of them, Ataullah Abu Ammar Jununi, known as the commander-in-chief of Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army (ARSA), has been named as the prime accused.

Mohammad Anwar Hossain, a DGFI field officer in Cox's Bazar, filed the case with Naikkhangchhari Police Station on November 23.

Inspector Mohammad Shahjahan of the police station confirmed the matter yesterday and said Inspector Sohag Rana of Ghumdhum police outpost has been assigned to investigate the case.

Bangladesh Air Force Squadron Leader Rizwan Rushdee, who was serving in DGFI, was killed and Rab official Sohel Barua was injured as drug smugglers opened fire during a clash near the Tumbru border.
