Visionary banker

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for a Bengali-owned bank. This came to fruition in 1965 when he joined the newly established Eastern Banking Corporation.

Soon after, he was put in charge of the key portfolios of planning and development, audit and inspection, and correspondent banking.

After Bangladesh's independence, Amin succeeded to secure the then British government's approval for transferring ownership of Eastern Banking Corporation's London branch to Bangladesh government.

Even, Amin could protect the foreign currencies reserved in the branch that later went under ownership of Bangladesh government.

Later, the Eastern

Banking Corporation's London branch was renamed as Uttara Bank. It was the first foreign branch of any bank of Bangladesh. The branch was inaugurated on March 30, 1972.

This is considered as one of the outstanding achievements in Bangladesh's banking sector.

Amin wrote an autobiography titled Bidheshe Prothom Bangladeshi Banker Shakha Kholar Nepotho Kahini that was published in 2021.

The book recounts Amin's journey as a young Bangalee banker starting in the Pakistan era and transitioned into the non-cooperation movement of the shadow Awami League government that ignited the 1971 war of independence and the

ensuing challenges of nation building.

From a historical perspective, the book serves as an important document that records the pivotal role played by Amin and other Bangalee bankers in the banking and finance side of the liberation struggle.

Amin was a visionary banker who took various measures in banking sectors that helped grow industries in the country. After retiring, he became the independent director of MTB bank and Bank Asia.

Late Razia Khan Amin, one of the most prominent writers of modern Bangladeshi literature and a teacher of Dhaka University, was his wife.

His daughter Aasha Mehreen Amin is working as the joint editor of The Daily Star.

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"The government will have to form their body or policy to tackle the Aedes mosquito situation and will also have to manage all of their logistics from the lean period so that they can not face any difficulties during the outbreak next year."

"We have failed to find out breeding sites. We have to be active during the lean period to overcome the weaknesses of this year," he said.

"An effective insecticide needs to be introduced and registered for the people to use it, along with modern fogging machines. We had given advice to the city corporations several times in this regard but they did not pay any heed in this regard," he added.

Saifur also mentioned that surveillance is crucial and the authorities will have to form a monitoring cell for the activities.

"Dengue has already reached its peak this year and started declining. However, the number of patients is still massive. The authorities need to continue their activities to curb mosquitoes," said Entomologist Manzur A Chowdhury.

We need more women at the helm

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our attitude and perception towards women, over 90 percent of such problems will be resolved."

"In the last 30 years, the media and women came a long way together. And that has been the result of women's movement and activism, that many of us have been involved in the last three decades, directly working with the media through training, discussions, seminars," said Shaheen Anam.

"The media has a very important role. But they

are not the only medium to influence our attitude and perception. Solidarity within the media is important. A woman has to bring up other women along with them to senior-level positions and policy-making positions," she added.

DDT disposal

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such substances. Global Environment Facility (GEF) is supporting the disposal of the 500 tonnes by providing a fund of around Tk 70.09 crore.

The DDT will be destroyed under "The Pesticide Risk Reduction in Bangladesh" project, with involvement of the DoE, Department of Agricultural Extension, DGHS, and Department of Fisheries.

According to FAO officials, authorities will start loading the pesticide onto a ship from today. The ship entered Bangladesh territory yesterday. It will go through ports of 12 countries before reaching France to raise awareness in those countries about the issue.

They said it will take four to five days to finish loading the DDT powder. FAO

staffers and government officials have been involved in properly packaging the substance since mid 2021.

The hazardous powder will be destroyed at a plant in France. Bangladesh signed the Stockholm convention in 2001. It banned use of DDT powder in 1989, after importing the substance for four years.

Saso Martinov, senior technical adviser of FAO, told The Daily Star that the whole process was delayed because the mechanism to destroy DDT is complex and time consuming. Only a few countries have plants to destroy the harmful substance.

Mark Davis, senior technical adviser of Pesticide Risk Reduction in Bangladesh, said that authorities have completed the process to destroy DDT. In 2007, an initiative

was taken to destroy the DDT pesticides under the project. It has taken 14 years to come to this stage due to various reasons, including fund complexity.

HOW DDT CAME TO CTG In mid 1984, the government signed an agreement to import 1,000 tonnes of DDT powder from Pakistan to control malaria. A consignment of 500 tonnes arrived at Chattogram port in the first phase in early 1985.

On March 19, 1985, four samples of the DDT were sent to the WHO in Geneva and Dhaka Testing Laboratory. After test reports stated that the substance was substandard, the government asked the Pakistani supplier - Exchange International Limited - to take the consignment back. But it did not do so.
