Tangail residents suffer as new bridge yet to be built

Thousands of residents in Tangail's Basail upazila have been suffering for a long time after a bridge over Jhenai river has remained completely broken for several years.

Although a big new bridge was supposed to be constructed there, only three pillars of the bridge have been built so far.

As a result, locals, including students, have been facing great difficulties to get across the river, as they are being compelled to use boats.

Locals blame negligence of the authorities concerned for the incomplete construction of the new bridge. The authorities, however, blamed untimely floods for the delay.

In 2000, the old bridge was constructed over the river in Kashil area. However, it got damaged during the flood in 2007 and completely collapsed in 2014, cutting off communication between five unions and the upazila headquarters.

According to the Local Government and Engineering Department (LGED), the department floated a tender to construct the new 270-metre

Further research is required to find out the exact number of people who were killed in the genocide during the Liberation War, said speakers yesterday.

They were speaking at the inauguration of the two-day international conference titled "Bangladesh Genocide in the Context of the 20th Century Aftermath, Resistance and Justice" held at Khulna District Shilpakala Academy Auditorium.

The event is being organised by Bangladesh Itihas Sammiloni and Center for Genocide -- Torture and Liberation War Studies.
