

How handicrafts training enhanced the livelihoods of women in Cox's Bazar

Thirty-five-year-old Roleya Hegum (pseudonym) was struggling to most her family's damands four years ago when her intellectually disabled hosband became physically (il all of a sudden due to a stroke.

Bokeys, mother of three daughters and a sun, started sewing and farming to meet the treatment costs of her husband. Unfortunately, those efforts were not enough. When the Covid-19 pandamic bit, the situation worsesed.

The situation was tough even before the pandemic int in Ukhiya and Teknari, since the local job market was under assem pressure due to the one radiion Robingyas who have been staying there since 2017.

Despite the fact that the local community of Cox's Basic first came forward to embrace the Robingya people who crossed the Naf River to save their fives in 2017, tension between the Robingya people and the local community was rising since the job market was shrinking for the local people.

Apart from supporting the Robings community, international and local organizations came forward to support the local community too.

Roleya shared that when she was struggling

and her back was against the wall. Outlan came as a relief for her as she received training from the organization on how to sew emitary napidne and face marks.

"it was film a blessing, I would to earn Tk 10,000 to Tk 15,000 each month," she told The Dully Stur, standing in front of her yard in Najirpara of Telenaf in Con's Hause.

In one and a half years, she carned around Tk 1, SD, OOO, with which she treated her husband, bore the education costs of her kids and bought two gosts.

Tam the only earning member of the family, and I am happy with my earnings," she said with a broad amile on her face.

Remembering the struggling days, the added, "If I did not get support from Oufan, I would have had to work as a househelp. My kids would have starved."
