"After the report, within a few hours, the decision of vaccinating pregnant women was finalised by the government, and mothers-to-be became a priority group to be vaccinated. They did not even have to stand in the long queues," she added.

Diner Sultana, senior reporter of BTV, shared how her reportage on the reproductive health of girls who were married off early due to the pandemic successfully drew the attention of the government.

Md Saiful Hassan Badal, secretary of Medical Education and Family Welfare Division, joined the event virtually.

"We need to work on the unmet needs of women and girls from underprivileged communities. Public and private partnership is required to address their demand," he said.

"During the last census, we found that more than five crore people live in eight city corporations, but we are not being able to address their needs properly. We should not leave behind the

underprivileged people from these areas, in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)," he added.

Monjun Nahar, head of advocacy at MSB, presented the organisation's evidence-based advocacy in Bangladesh through a video and recommended prioritising family planning issues with a focus on Bangladesh's Family Planning 2030 and SDG 2030 goals.

She also stressed on implementing a geographically targeted service package for low-performing regions -- mainly upazilas, char and coastal areas.

Kishwar Imdad, country director of MSB; Abdus Salam Khan, joint secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare; Mervyn Christian, AFP senior programme officer; Dr Nurun Nahar, line director of Directorate General of Family Planning; and Ainoon Naher, professor of anthropology of Jahangirnagar University, spoke at the workshop among others.

of the business community," he said, adding that it is the responsibility of the well-off citizens to uplift the poor and the marginalised.

If Bangladesh is to achieve its targets of implementing Sustainable Development Goals by 2030, becoming a higher middle-income country

by 2031 and a developed nation by 2041, taxes must be paid, Kamal said.

The business people and the National Board of Revenue need to work together more, he said, adding that some initiatives are being taken to modernise the VAT department.

"If businesspeople are more sincere in paying

VAT, then the revenue will further increase," he added.

At the event, which the NBR organised to mark the 12th National VAT Day and the ongoing VAT Week, Kamal presented certificates and awards to the nine firms that paid the highest VAT in the production, business and service sectors at the national level.

gender-sensitivity awareness among adolescents.

The event took place based on the findings of a project called "JANO Nutrition Governance Programme", which was funded by European Union (EU) and co-funded by Austrian Development Cooperation.

CARE Bangladesh in association with Plan Bangladesh and Eco-Social Development Organisation (ESDO) implemented the project.

Prof SM Abdul Matin Laskar, director of Rangpur Region Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, chaired the event.

Md Ashik Billah, head of the central and northern region programme of Plan Bangladesh, gave the inaugural speech at the event.

Mohammad Faiz Kawsar, project manager of the JANO project presented the keynote. He said they chose seven upazilas of Rangpur and Nilphamari for implementing the five-

year project, which started in 2018.

Currently, the project is being implemented at 331 schools in these two districts.

The aim of the JANO project is to educate adolescent school-goers on gender sensitivity, empower their knowledge in nutrition and health, and give them practical knowledge in agriculture.

Besides, sports are also included in the project to inform the students about their physical health activities. "We are providing them Karate training," he said.

Antora Roy, an adolescent, said she was unaware of the importance of nutrition, reproductive health and safety before the involvement of the JANO programme.

Segufta Nasrin, assistant teacher of Afan Ullah High School in Rangpur, said social stigmas among parents are the biggest barriers to implementing such campaigns.

Dr Md Shahid Uz Zaman, founder and

executive director of ESDO; Shamimur Rahman, deputy director of the Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE) in Rangpur; Dr Shamim Ahmed, civil surgeon of Rangpur; Md Shahidul Islam, education officer of Nilphamari; Md Mosaraf Hossain, assistant inspector of Bangladesh Madrasa Education Board; and Afroz Mahal, director of programme management and implementation at Plan Bangladesh, also spoke at the roundtable among others.

square feet, an office room, male and female toilets both indoors and outdoors, an electric furnace room, a gas furnace room, an equipment room, a balcony, and a public gathering place, among other facilities, will be constructed.

Apart from this, the whole area will be improved with the provision of high-quality LED lights, the construction of septic tanks and soak wells, and the renovation of circular furnaces and drainage systems.

DSCC executive engineer (zone-5) Saiful Islam Joy said, "According to the master plan of the crematorium, an electric and a gas furnace will be built. However, gas or electricity will not be supplied for now, as it is expensive and time-consuming. We will ensure the supply in future if needed."

After inaugurating Postogola Maha Shamsan's development work, Taposh said, "We have undertaken this programme by ensuring all facilities and assessing the needs. We hope that the renovation work will be completed soon."

"During the construction, cremation activities will be carried out through an alternative system. We will also arrange work for those who live nearby," the mayor added.

Besides, Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leaders and activists took positions at Shaheed Minar, Shahbagh, TSC, and Palashi intersection, said witnesses.

Ariful Islam, secretary of DU Chhatra League unit, said they occupied the areas by complying with an organisational decision.

Yesterday, BCL men blocked people in Nilkhet area -- an entrance to the DU campus -- and checked their phones. While checking, they beat up five youths suspecting their link with Chhatra Dal.

The BCL men then handed them over to police.

Nur Mohammad, officer-in-charge of Shahbagh Police Station, said they detained five suspected activists of Chhatra Dal for interrogation.

Although the AL party office was full of activists, none were able to visit the BNP party office, as law enforcers blocked both roads leading to the establishment.

In the morning, correspondents of this newspaper, who tried to

reach the BNP office, found that police put barricades on the road from Nightingale intersection to Fakirapool intersection, preventing vehicles and pedestrians from moving through the area.

At 11:45am, journalists were allowed to enter the road through Nightingale intersection. They were allowed to go in front of the BNP office. The correspondents then found the office padlocked and under heavy guard of law enforcers.

Meanwhile, many city dwellers said fearing the possibility of violence due to a face-off between activists of the two parties, only those who had a pressing need to leave their houses were seen on the streets.

Although the presence of city dwellers was thin, those who were out suffered as almost all forms of public transport were unavailable.

Around 8:15am, Rafiqul Islam, a private job holder, said he waited for public transport for over 15 minutes at Mirpur-10 bus stand.

"There was no bus at

the stand. I finally took an auto-rickshaw. While going towards Farmgate, not a single bus crossed me. I did not see any buses on the opposite side either," he said.

Public buses were hardly seen in Panthapath and Kalabagan areas on Mirpur Road, and Mohakhali, Mirpur-1, Gabtoli, and Uttara areas.

Many residents also alleged that rickshaw pullers and auto-rickshaw drivers charged extra fares.

Talking to The Daily Star, Khondaker Enayet Ullah, secretary general of Bangladesh Road Transport Owners Association, said, "There were some people on the roads in the morning. That's why few buses were running. Due to the low number of passengers, many bus owners took their vehicles off the road."

Enayet Ullah also said a car was burnt in Mirpur area yesterday.

"That's why the bus owners were afraid. There was no instruction from the government or the administration to keep buses off road," he added.
