## Hasina banks on the same troops

Gets reelected AL president, Quader remains GS



Sheikh Hasina, who has been leading the grand old Awami League for 42 years now, will be at the party helm for the next three years as she was reelected the president for the 10th consecutive

Besides, Obaidul Quader scored a hat-trick with his reelection as the general secretary, the second highest position in the AL hierarchy.

They were elected at the 73-year-old party's 22nd triennial council held at the auditorium of Institution of Engineers in the capital yesterday. Before her reelection, Hasina once again stressed the need for new leadership.

"The old ones should move over, making the responsibilities to you. New leadership is required," Hasina told nearly 7,000 councillors

present at the closed-door session. Councillors are entrusted with the task of electing the new leadership, according to the AL

"I will be with you no matter where I am. New ones arrive and the old ones depart. This is universal," said the 75-year-old leader.

At 5:00pm, Hasina announced the dissolution of the AL central committee and said an election would be held to elect the new AL office bearers. She handed over this responsibility to the three-member Election Commission to conduct the polls.

At that, the auditorium brimming with AL leaders burst into a "no".

## One dies as cops, **BNP** activists clash

The party alleges police fired shots, used brute force

A BNP man died in Panchagarh and scores of others were injured in clashes between police and party activists centring the BNPs mass processions in different parts of the country yesterday.

The deceased, Abdur Rashid Arefin, 50, was the health affairs secretary of Mavdandighi union BNP in Boda upazila.

The party claimed he was killed due to indiscriminate baton-charge and firing by

Referring to physicians of Panchagarh Sadar Hospital, SM Sirajul Huda, superintendent of police, told The Daily Star that Arefin died from heart disease and had undergone a bypass surgery

"He fell ill around 2:30pm and he had no injury signs on his body."

Dr Toufique Ahmed, Panchagarh Sadar Hospital resident medical officer, told reporters that Arefin died before reaching the hospital. "The cause of his death would be known after a postmortem."



Panchagarh district BNP Member Secretary Farhad Hossain said, "Police attacked our peaceful procession. And Arefin, one of our men, died due to this."

Local BNP activist Motiar Rahman said that as the clash erupted, Arefin tried to escape the spot by jumping a wall when police caught him and beat him indiscriminately.

"He died by police beatings and tear gas smoke," he claimed.

After disappearances, murders, and extra-judicial killings, the party activists are now being shot and killed in the peaceful political programme, said BNP

### Chinese city sees 'half a million Covid cases a day'

Half a million people in a single Chinese city are being infected with Covid-19 every day, a senior health official has said, in a rare and quickly censored acknowledgement that the country's wave of infections is not being reflected in official statistics.

China this month has rapidly dismantled key pillars of its zero-Covid strategy, doing away with snap lockdowns, lengthy quarantines and travel curbs in a jarring reversal of its hallmark containment strategy.

Cities across the country have struggled to cope as surging infections have emptied pharmacy shelves, filled hospital wards and appeared to cause backlogs at crematoriums and funeral homes.

But the end of strict testing mandates has made caseloads virtually impossible to track, while authorities have narrowed the medical definition of a Covid death in a move experts have said will suppress the number of fatalities attributable to the virus.
