Police Week to start on January 3

The six-day Police Week 2023 is going to begin on January 3.

After a two-year gap due to the pandemic, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has given her consent to be present at the inaugural ceremony in the capital's Rajarbagh Police Lines.

Confirming development, Haider Ali Khan, deputy inspector general (operation) of the Police Headquarters (PHQ), told The Daily Star that they have already taken all necessary steps for the event.

Followed by the inauguration, the PM will attend a welfare parade with officials.

Asked about placing any demands at the parade, DIG Haider said they are yet to decide on any specific demands to place in front of the premier. "But we may request for our needs in front of the prime minister."

According to PHQ sources, the PM will listen to seven officers of different ranks -- from constable to additional superintendent of police -- at the welfare parade about their ongoing issues.

Besides, at least 100 ficers will receive officers Bangladesh Police Medal (BPM) and President Police Medal (PPM) from the PM for their courageous work around the year, they said.

According to the schedule, on the second day of the programme, the PM will give a speech addressing the police officials at the Prime Minister's Office. On the same day, the president will also give a speech addressing them Bangabhaban.

Meherpur Krishak League leader assaulted Inamul

Meherpur's Krishak League leader Bani Amin was the person who assaulted Engineer M Inamul Haque, former director general of the River Research Institute, in Dhaka on Saturday.

Bani Amin is the president of Krishak League's Kazipur Union of Gangni upazila, said party sources.

On Saturday afternoon, Inamul was speaking at a rally in front of the National Museum at Shahbagh when Bani Amin was passing through the area to participate in Awami League's 22nd national council at Surawardy Udyan.

Amin suddenly attacked Inamul, bringing allegation that he was making anti-government statement at the

Criticism started pouring in soon after a video of the incident went viral on social media.

While talking to The Daily Star yesterday morning, Bani Amin regretted the incident.

He said he asked Inamul not to make such statements. But when Inamul did not pay heed to him, he attacked him, he added.

Gangni Police Station's Officer-in-charge Manajit Nandi said he had heard about the incident. However, no complaint has been filed in this regard

2021, Water March Development Board started dredging 5.67 kilometres of Ichhamati river to increase its navigability, under a project worth Tk 5.46 crore. Besides, it simultaneously kicked off an eviction drive, under a Tk 2.69-project, to free the riverbank.

Poor visibility caused by thick fog has disrupted the ferry services on Daulatdia-Paturia and Aricha-Kazirhat routes yesterday morning.

Meanwhile, the movement of all types of water transports has been suspended on the routes.

Khorshed Alam, office assistant manager of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC) at Daulatdia point, said the ferry services remained suspended from 6:00am due to poor



Row over payment mode stalls water-supply project

On June 30, the Directorate of Public Health Engineering finished building a water-supply centre in Habiganj at a cost of Tk 9.29 crore.

This is the second water-supply project in Habiganj municipality. İt has a water-purification capacity of 350 cubic feet per hour.

However, even six months after completion, the project is still not up and running due to a disagreement between the municipal authorities and Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) over electricity connection.

BPDB intends to provide prepaidmeter electric connection for the water-supply scheme. But the municipality wants postpaid facility

to pay the bill. Abdul Quddus, assistant engineer (water and sewerage) of Habiganj municipality, said if this centre

residents will get pure water.

Currently, half of Habiganj dwellers are already getting clean water from the first water-supply centre located in Kalibari area of the city. The new centre, located in Babystand area of Habiganj, can supply purified water to at least 10 to 15 percent of Habiganj dwellers, he added.

Ataur Rahman, mayor of Habiganj municipality, said, "The municipality is an institution of the state. We always pay our bills in postpaid mode. But BPDB is not agreeing to this for the second centre."

"There is a delay in getting electricity connection due to BPDB's negligence and irresponsibility. That is why this centre cannot be launched. Residents are being deprived of clean water," he added.

Contacted, BPDB Habiganj Office Executive Engineer Abdullah starts operation, at least 60 percent Al Mamun Sarkar said, "Monthly

bills must be paid monthly. In the postpaid method, bills can be kept in arrears. The municipal authorities want to take advantage of this method."

"We are ready to provide electricity connection according to the BPDB policy," he added.

As the two government bodies pass the buck over the payment method, it is the people of Habiganj who continue to suffer, said locals and rights activists.

The water residents get is full of iron and often unusable. However, locals reluctantly end up using the contaminated water as they don't have any alternatives, they added. Tofazzal Sohel, coordinator

of Habiganj Sankhubdo Nagorik

Andolon, said, "BPDB and the municipal authorities should pay heed to the people's needs." "Both sides have to come forward to resolve the disagreement," he
