Workplace casualties on the rise: report

The number of casualties in workplaces increased in 2022 in comparison to the previous year, mainly due to lack of safety in the workplace, said a report.

The highest casualties were in the transport sector, it added.

Bangladesh Occupational Safety, Health and Environment Foundation (OSHE) revealed the data at a press conference held at Dhaka Reporters Unity in the capital yesterday.

Md Alam Hossen, director of OSHE,

read out the research paper at the event. He said, overall 1,195 casualties took place in 2022 with 967 deaths and 228 injuries in various sectors across the

According to the data, the casualties were 1,089 last year.

Hossen said country's transport sector has seen most deaths this year surpassing

The number of casualties in this sector is 476. Among them, 425 workers died in 2022.

He said the casualties in transport sector accounts to 40 percent of total occupational casualties.

The second highest casualties were in the service sector, which ranges from utility services to workshops, restaurants

At least 221 people were killed and 59 injured in this sector this year, the data

The agricultural sector was third in the list where 124 workers died followed by the construction sector, which ranked fourth, where 105 workers died.

The garment sector has seen 28 deaths in 2022, the lowest workers' death.

The report was based on news reports and information gathered from the spots of the incidents.

According to Bangladesh Occupational Health and Environment Foundation, laxity in ensuring workers' safety, lack of safety equipment and proper training were the major reasons behind the rising deaths of workers this year.

DU bus on wrong side kills man Case filed, driver detained

A man died after being hit by a double-decker bus of Dhaka University on Thursday night. The bus was plying on the wrong side of the road.

The incident happened on the road in front of the Prime Minister's Office at Bijoy Sarani around 5:30pm when the "Khonika" bus of the Tongi-Gazipur route transporting DU students was on its way to Gazipur from the campus.

The deceased was identified as Al Amin Tutul. He worked in a private company located in Awlad Hossain Market at Bijoy Sarani.

Habibur Rahman, duty officer of Tejgaon Police Station, told The Daily Star that critically injured Tutul was taken to a private hospital in Malibagh, where he succumbed to injuries.

The victim's family has filed a case in connection with the incident, the officer informed.

The driver of the bus, Bazlur Rahman, was detained by Tejgaon police, he added.

"Yesterday, I boarded the bus around 4:30pm... and it took about 50 minutes to reach Farmgate due to gridlock... Suddenly, I heard a noise and came to know that a man got hit by the bus," DU student Imdadul Azad told this correspondent.

"The students then asked the driver to stop but he did not. Students managed to stop the vehicle

Surprisingly, although a party ruling Awami League was built on the donated land, the college authorities didn't take any initiative to construct the dormitory there in all these years," Dinesh said.

Azizar Rahman, principal of Aditmari Government College, said despite repeated pleas they have failed to recover the land.

He also urged the authorities concerned to take immediate action to free the land from illegal occupation.
