

Training for teachers British Council's training programme ends

The graduation ceremony of the fifth group of primary teachers under the "Training of Master Trainers in English" (TMTE) project was held recently in around 12 Primary Teachers Training Institutes (PTIs) across the country.

The Directorate of Primary Education, in collaboration with the British Council, held this project to improve English language proficiency and teaching practice across multiple cohorts of training, said a press release by the British Council yesterday.

Through this 14-week programme, around 544 primary teachers were provided exclusive guidance on communicative teaching practice and methodology to make English language learning more interesting and effective for primary school students.

In its graduation ceremony in Dhaka PTI, Dilip Kumar Banik, additional director general (PEDP4), Directorate of Primary Education, and Dr Uttam Kumar Das, director of Directorate of Primary Education's (DPE) Training Division, were present.

They later sell the collected stones to local traders, Jannu said, adding that he has learned techniques to collect the material from his father.

"Our life depends on stone collection, as this is the only work we have to earn our livelihood," said Salam Mia of Burimari village.

Saju Ahmed, a stone

trader at Kawamari, said around 30,000 to 35,000 cubic feet of stones are collected from the river every day.

They buy the stones from the collectors and sell them to traders from different parts of the country. The livelihood of nearly 200 families of different villages depends on this business, he said.

3 of a family hurt in Dhaka fire

Three members of a family sustained burn injuries in a fire that broke out apparently from gas leakage at a house in the city's Uttarkhan area on Friday night.

The injured were identified as Dalia Rahman, 35, Dalia's mother Aleya Begum, 59, and Anjana Rahman, 30, niece of Dalia.

Inspector Bachchu Mia, in-charge of Dhaka Medical College and Hospital police camp, said the fire broke out on the second floor of the building when Dalia along with her mother and niece went to the kitchen and turned on the stove for making tea around 8:00pm, leaving them injured.

Later they were taken to Sheikh Hasina National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery.

Of the injured, Aleya suffered 60 percent burn injuries while Anjana 30 percent.

Dalia, who was slightly injured in the fire incident, has been given first aid.

On information, a firefighting unit rushed to the spot and extinguished the blaze. Primarily it is suspected that the fire might have originated from a leaked pipeline.

NCTB Chairman Farhadul Islam, said in a number of places, some students will not get a full set of books on the first day. "But each student who will show up at schools during the textbook festival will get new books."

The delay will not cause many problems, he said, as not all students show up on the first day of school to collect all their textbooks.

He said all primary and secondary textbooks will reach the upazilas by January 10.

In addition to the paper crisis, several companies that won the tender for printing primary textbooks

did not sign a contract with the NCTB, and this has contributed to the delay, said NCTB Member Prof Moshuazzaman.

"We have to follow the procedures for awarding the work to second bidders if these printers don't go ahead with the work," he said.

After much delay, the work for printing primary books began on December 1. In spite of that, companies could print so many primary books within a short period because they have way fewer pages than secondary books.

Meanwhile, State Minister for Primary and Mass Education Md

Zakir Hossen will attend a textbook festival for primary students at the central playground of Dhaka University.

Education Minister Dipu Moni will attend a similar programme for secondary students at Kapasia Pilot High School grounds in Gazipur.

Previously, the government used to distribute free textbooks only for primary students. And so, secondary students belonging to low-income groups or disadvantaged communities used to suffer.

Since 2010, the government has been distributing free textbooks

among both primary and secondary students.

Before this whole initiative, printers would often create an artificial crisis by not printing and distributing books on time. In some cases, books used to hit the stalls in the March-April period or even later.

So far, around 430 crore textbooks have been delivered for free, garnering praise from home and abroad.

The success has led to significant improvements in enrolment at the primary and secondary levels and a decrease in the dropout rate, NCTB officials said.

cultural activists and political leaders from home and abroad took part.

But, the gates around Bhasani's grave at Mawlana Bhashani Science and Technology University are now always kept locked, visitors alleged.

Mohammad Alauddin, a student of a local high school, said many admirers of Maulana Bhasani often go back after they found the gates locked.

Bhasani's grandson Azad Khan Bhasani, also member secretary of Bhasani Parishad, said after the university was established, he hoped the university campus would always be abuzz with people's footfall, but that

didn't happen.

He opined that if the university authorities, local administration and Bhasani's followers and admirers together make a combined effort, the historic Darbar Hall as well as Bhasani's grave, mosque and educational institutions on the university compound can be seperated from the campus.

In 2003, Mawlana Bhashani Science and Technology University (MBSTU) was made the custodian of both the Darbar Hall and the museum.

Contacted, the university Vice Chancellor Prof Mohammad Farhad Hossain said it is not

possible to keep the university gates open to the public for security reasons.

However, there is no hindrance in entering Bhasani's mausoleum, said the VC.

"A university should have at least 20 acres of land. As all the establishments are situated on 23 acres, it's not possible to separate the campus through a boundary wall," said Prof Farhad.

In this regard, Bhasani's close aide and veteran politician Bulbul Khan Mahub said MBSTU should not be compared with other universities of the country, as it filled with Bhasani's memory.

Once, all the leaders including Bangabandhu

Sheikh Mujibur Rahman used to visit Santosh to meet Maulana Bhasani.

Earlier, on the pretext of widening road, all the old trees planted by Maulana Bhasani were cut down, while the playground was destroyed to construct multi-storied buildings without planning, he said.
