



Govt mulling lifting GP's SIM sales ban

Grameenphone is poised to get the ban on its SIM sales lifted as the telecom minister yesterday expressed satisfaction about the country's leading mobile operator's service quality.

"We have seen a lot of improvement in the situation [quality of services], so we are considering withdrawing the SIM sales ban," Post and Telecommunications Minister Mustafá Jabbar told The Daily Star yesterday.

Earlier on June 29, four days after the Padma bridge inauguration, the telecom regulator, on instruction from the posts and telecommunications division the previous day, banned Grameenphone's SIM sales until it "improves its quality of service including bringing down call drop rate".

The letter does not specify how Grameenphone failed in terms of quality

Remittance flat at \$22b in 2022

Bangladesh received \$22.07 billion in remittance in 2022, almost unchanged from a year earlier, though a record number of workers went abroad for jobs in the just-concluding year, shows Bangladesh Bank data published yesterday.

The amount was 3.67 percent higher than the \$21.29 billion sent to the country in 2021. The earnings stood at \$21.74 billion in the previous year.

Islami Bank takes emergency Tk 8,000cr from BB

Islami Bank has started to avail a central bank facility that is only summoned during extraordinary circumstances, as the Shariah-based lender looked to dress up its balance sheet ahead of the year's end.

Called the "lender of the last resort", the facility allows banks to borrow from Bangladesh Bank at 8.75 percent interest. As a Shariah-based lender, it is not supposed to borrow by offering interest.

But so dire was the need for fund injection for the bank, which suffered a cash reserve ratio (CRR) shortfall of Tk 5,101 crore on December 28, that it went against its principles.

On December 29, the last working day before the year-end, Islami Bank took Tk 8,000 crore under the BB special arrangement at 8.75 percent interest, which is equivalent to the special repo rate, according to Md Mezbaul Haque, the central bank's spokesman.

The special repo rate is the rate at which cash-strapped banks take loans

from the central bank to ease their immediate liquidity crunch.

In exchange for the funds, Islami Bank presented a demand promissory note, which is a legal instrument in which the issuer guarantees to pay a specific sum of money at an agreed time.

A bank's demand promissory note is usually accepted by the BB when it does not have available bills and bonds to provide as collateral.

A comet that last appeared in the night sky when Neanderthals still roamed the Earth is set to make a reappearance early this year.

The C/2022 E3 (ZTF) comet orbits the sun every 50,000 years and will pass within 26 million miles of Earth on February 1 this year, making it visible to the naked eye.

Several killed, hurt in blast near Kabul airfield

An explosion at the entrance to a military airfield in the Afghan capital killed and wounded several people yesterday, an official told AFP.

The cause of the blast at the gate of the facility next to Kabul's international airport was unclear, interior ministry spokesman Abdul Nafy Takor said.

"A number of our compatriots have been martyred and wounded in the blast," Takor said, adding that authorities were investigating the incident.

A Kabul resident said late yesterday his brother, an air force officer, was killed in the blast.

"He had worked in the previous government too as an air force officer," Abdul Noor told AFP, referring to the ousted, Western-backed government of former president Ashraf Ghani.

"He and some of his colleagues were in a queue waiting to enter the military airfield when the blast occurred," Noor said, indicating the blast had caused more casualties.

Taliban officials including Takor did not offer any other details despite repeated requests for information.

The Islamist group claims to have improved security since storming back to power in August 2021 and often downplays casualty figures from such attacks.

Yet there have been scores of bomb blasts and other attacks, many claimed by the local chapter of the Islamic State group.

At least five Chinese nationals were wounded last month when gunmen stormed a hotel popular with Chinese business people in Kabul. That attack was claimed by Islamic State.
