one-month basic salary every year in addition to regular monthly salary as the force members have to work extra hours regularly.

At the meeting, they may also demand the full retirement benefits, assuming they have served their entire service life, for police members if anyone dies while in service.

After a two-year gap due to the pandemic, the PM has agreed to be present at the event.

At the programme, 115 police and Rab members will receive prestigious Bangladesh Police Medal (BPM) and President Police Medal (PPM) awards from the PM for their courageous work around the year.

Fifteen of them will be awarded with BPM gallantry, 25 with President PPM gallantry, 25 with BPM Service and 50 with PPM Service.

As per the schedule, on the second day of the programme, Hasina will address the police officials at the Prime Minister's Office. The same day, the president will also deliver a speech for them at the Bangabhaban.

On the third day, police officials will hold a meeting with Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal where they will place their demands. On January 6, field-level officers will sit with police high-ups to talk about the country's overall law-and-order situation.

The following day, the IGP will hold a meeting with police officials. The annual general meeting of Bangladesh Police Service Association will take place on the day, the schedule reads.

On the last day on January 8, police officials are scheduled to meet ministers in the morning, the cabinet secretary in the afternoon, and the chief justice in the evening.

sports arena and a philanthropist who would always stand by those in dire need of help.

After undergoing treatment at the ICU of Bangladesh Specialized Hospital for two months, Mubasshar passed away around 1:30am, said Iqbal Habib, joint secretary of Bangladesh Poribesh Andolon.

His first namaz-e-jaanaza was held at the Institute of Architects Bangladesh after Zuhr prayers, and the second on the Brothers Union Club field after Asr prayers, he said.

His body has been kept at the hospital mortuary, from where it will be taken to his village home in Brahmanbaria today.

"After a namaz-e-jaanaza at his village, his body will either be handed over to BSMMU in the capital as per his last wish or will be buried following his family's decision. This will be decided tomorrow [Tuesday]," he added.

Born on December 27, 1943, in Brahmanbaria, Mubasshar graduated from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology in 1972.

Joining the Liberation War at a young age, he was known to have fought valiantly and even took part in the guerrilla operations inside the capital.

In his professional life, Mubasshar was the managing director of Assoconsult Ltd, an architectural practice which designed prominent edifices like the Grameen Bank Bhaban and the Proshika headquarters.

He was also the managing director of Neer Ltd, a real estate business and the chairperson of Global Insurance Co Ltd. He played the role of adviser in many organisations, including

Bishwo Shahittyo Kendro, Grameen Telecom Trust etc.

Both the mayors of Dhaka city expressed profound sorrow at Mubasshar's passing.

In his condolence message, Dhaka South city Mayor Sheikh Fazle Noor Taposh said, "The heroic freedom fighter Architect Mubasshar was a strong voice for well-planned urbanisation. He played an incomparable role in making Dhaka a modern and livable city."

"He was our national treasure. With his death, the nation has lost a great son. He will always be a shining light in our hearts..."

DNCC Mayor Md Atiqul Islam said, "Architect Mubasshar has left an outstanding contribution to the architecture industry of the country. He was a proud son of the nation. He enriched the art of architecture with his talent and thought..."

Mubasshar was elected president of Institute of Architects Bangladesh for five terms and was known for his fight for a well-planned Dhaka city. He also served as president of both the Commonwealth Association of Architects and the Architects Regional Council of Asia.

An active organiser in the sports arena, he was a former director of the Bangladesh Cricket Board and worked as the president of the Brothers Union Club. He was also the founding Convener of Sammilito Krira Poribar.

Mubasshar served as the vice president of Bangladesh Poribesh Andolon and Consumer Association of Bangladesh.

He was featured frequently as a guest in television talk shows, where he spoke his mind without trepidation and with rationality.

mobile phones were looted," he added.

"The attack was led by Delwar, Nuru and Mohsin, who are people of the owner of Lama Rubber Industries," Rengain Karbari claimed.

Another villager, Chamrul Mro, said, "Some families of our villages were setting up some new houses in the area. The rubber company's people noticed it and over the last few days, they were trying to stop the Mro people from constructing new structures."

"Even on Sunday noon, some people of the rubber company came to our village and asked our villagers not to set up new houses. Then, the attack was launched on that night," he added.

Contacted, Kamal Uddin, Lama Rubber Industries Limited's manager, denied the allegations.

"I don't know anything about the arson attack at the village. I have heard that the villagers are building new

houses on our 400 acres of land. That place is ours, not theirs."

Contacted, Lama Police Station's Officer-in-Charge (OC) Shahidul Islam Chowdhury said, "The Mro community people have informed me about the incident. Police have already visited the spot. We are investigating. Legal action will be taken against those involved."

Bandarban Deputy Commissioner Yasmin Parvin Tibrizi told The Daily Star, "There has been a dispute between the villagers and the rubber company for a long time. We will investigate the matter."

"If the rubber company is involved in the incident, we will take strict action against them," she added.

Three villages - Rengyan Mro Para, Langkom Mro Para and Joychandra Tripura Para - are next to one another and the indigenous people of the three villages mainly depend on jhum cultivation.

The villagers alleged that Lama

Rubber Industries Limited has been trying to evict indigenous people from the area to grab their land.

Three organisations, that work to establish rights of indigenous people, in a joint statement condemned the attack and demanded punishment for the attackers.

The organisations are: Gonotantrik Jubo Forum, Hill Women's Federation, and Parbatya Chattogram Pahari Chhatra Parishad.

On April 26 last year, employees of Lama Rubber Industries Limited allegedly torched crops on over 300 acres belonging to the indigenous community of the three villages.

The incident drew huge criticism. Eminent citizens and rights bodies of the country expressed concerns over the incident and demanded punishment of the perpetrators. The villagers also alleged that miscreants poisoned a Jhiri (small water flow in hills) at Rengyan Mro Para on September 6, according to media reports.

Canada bans most

foreign buyers - who accounted for less than five percent of home ownership in Canada, according to the national statistical agency - would not have the desired effect of making homes more affordable.

Rather they point to a need for more housing construction to meet demand.

The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation - the national housing agency - said in a June report that close to 19 million housing units will be needed by 2030.

That means 5.8 million new homes must be built, or 3.5 million more than are currently anticipated to be built to meet that demand, it said.

saying it had discovered a new lunar mineral that could be used as an energy source.

Nelson told Politico that China has enjoyed "enormous success and advances" in its space program over the last decade.

November's WTA Finals in Fort Worth, Texas.

"When it didn't go down, a biopsy was performed, the results came back as stage one throat cancer," her agent said in a statement sent to AFP.

During the tests, a lump was also discovered in her breast, which was later diagnosed as an unrelated cancer.

"The prognosis is good and Martina will start her treatment this month," said her agent.

"The cancer type is HPV (human papillomavirus) and this particular type responds really well to treatment."

"Both these cancers are in their early stages with great outcomes."

Navratilova's treatment in New York has forced her to abandon plans to commentate on the Australian Open although she will appear from time to time remotely.

Chris Evert, Navratilova's great rival on the courts who became her friend, revealed in January 2022 that she had ovarian cancer but was declared to be in remission in May.

As a player, Navratilova brought a new physical dimension to women's tennis.

Her powerful serve and agility at the net made her the dominant payer of her era as she picked up a total of 59 Major titles - 31 doubles and 10 mixed doubles adding to her 18 singles titles.

LPG cylinder price cut

down rationally, said BERC chairman Abdul Jalil, who announced the new prices at a virtual press briefing.

As per the announcement, the price of "auto gas" (LPG used for motor vehicles) also decreased to Tk 57.41 per litre from previous price of Tk 60.41 per litre, down by Tk 3 per litre.

The price of LPG, marketed by state-owned LP Gas Company, will

remain the same as it is locally produced with a market share of less than 5 percent.

The LPG price went up to Tk 1,439 (per 12kg cylinder) in the local market following the start of the Russia-Ukraine war in February last year.

LPG price in Bangladesh was the lowest Tk 1,225 per 12kg cylinder in January last year and it witnessed steady increase in February, March, and April 2022.
