Samsung Galaxy A04 released in Bangladesh

Samsung has recently released the new Galaxy A04 smartphone in Bangladesh. It comes with a 6.4-inch display with HD+ Infinity-V resolution, a 50 MP AF true dual camera, a 5 MP selfie unit and a 2 MP depth sensor. It also has 32 GB storage, with expandable SD storage of up to 1TB, and 3 GB RAM expandable up to 7GB with RAM+.

The smartphone also features an octa-core processor, One UI Core 4.1 and Android 12 OS, with sensors for accelerometer, light and proximity. It has a 5,000 mAh battery with 15 W adaptive fast charging.

Samsung Galaxy A04 will be available in three colours: copper, green and black. It is currently priced at Tk. 12,999/-.



The new iteration in BMW's luxury segment, the BMW X7 xDrive40i, is now officially available in Bangladesh. According to a press release, the BMW X7 comes with significant design changes - a front end and the latest generation of operating system with iDrive control, including a curved display. The redesigned front end features signature BMW design elements such as twin headlamps and a kidney grille.

The new X7 also comes with additional driver assistance and the latest 48V mild hybrid technology.

The six-cylinder in-line engine makes its debut in the new BMW X7, and it improves performance by enhancing the car's combustion process, gas exchange, valve control and ignition system. This new-generation 48-volt mild hybrid technology in its most recent version consists of a crankshaft-mounted starter generator integrated into the transmission and contributes to an additional 9 KW for 12 HP of output and 200 NM of torque.

The price of the BMW X7 starts from Tk. 3 crore 30 lakh in Bangladesh.

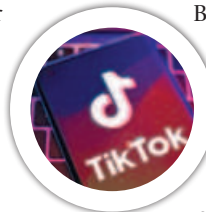
TikTok removes 6 million videos from Bangladesh

The popular micro-video sharing platform TikTok has removed almost 6 million videos from Bangladeshi users from July to September 2022, as per TikTok's latest Community Guidelines Enforcement Report.

The latest report, which covers statistics regarding July, August and September (Q3 2022) of the previous year, states that a total of 5,960,758 videos were removed from Bangladeshi users. This makes Bangladesh rank 5th in the world in

TikTok content removal - behind the US, Pakistan, Indonesia and Brazil.

In the previous quarter of 2022, Bangladesh also ranked 5th overall in TikTok content removal - with 4,974,838 videos removed from April to June this year. In Q3 2022, Bangladesh had a proactive removal rate of 99.5% in TikTok. 98% of videos were removed before 24 hours of uploading, and 97.4% of videos were removed before any views.



Uber completed 150 million km in trips in 2022 in Bangladesh

Uber recently released its annual analysis, which highlights the completion of 150 million kilometres in trips during 2022 in the country. The annual report emphasises Uber's support for communities in using the Uber app to safeguard each trip, helping law enforcement agencies improve overall road safety, and empowering driver-partners to earn on the platform.

According to the report, users of Dhaka were the busiest with most late-night trips (10 pm to 6 am) and most office-hour trips (07 am to 11 am, and 4 pm to 8 pm) taken through Uber. The most popular day of the week in 2022 for booking trips was Friday, the report highlighted.

Moreover, Uber trained driver partners



In partnership with Bangladesh Police, to raise awareness about traffic rules and regulations. The first round of training was conducted by two officials from the Bangladesh police and a representative from Uber, where drivers were educated about road safety, traffic rules and regulations, trip cancellations, offline trips, and cash cherry-picking.

Business case competitions are a great way to elevate business skills and knowledge in a real-world setting. While they can be challenging, they are also a fantastic opportunity to learn and grow your career in the world of business. However, getting into a business competition and finding success in it can be a daunting task if you're just starting out. Here are some key things to keep in mind if you have the drive to excel in business competitions.

Do not be afraid of losing

Fear of losing keeps many from taking part in the first place or continuing it later. But losing can be a great way to learn and improve in these competitions. "The first competition that I ended up taking part in was at the latter part of my freshman year at university because I was afraid," shares Ramim Ahmed, a past champion of a prestigious global business competition. To make the most of the experiences, teams can seek feedback from judges and discuss the challenges they faced and ways of improving on them. "My biggest learnings came from the ones where I didn't win," added Ramim. Learning from your setbacks is a great way of self-improving as well.

Meet with real buyers and sellers

To properly understand the business problem you're trying to solve, it's essential to speak with real buyers and sellers. This will give you valuable insights and help you understand the core issue or problem statement. "Do ground-level research if it is a local case. Talk to customers and retail outlets. Have a conversation with territory officers if that is relevant," shares Sourodip Paul, a past champion of a prestigious global business competition.

According to Ishtiaque Shahriar, Head of Assets of a leading local MFS, "As a business competition judge, I look for whether the research took place with the accurate target group." Meeting with real buyers and sellers helps ensure judges are provided with updated information on the relevant target group. It also keeps you in the loop about possible market changes, including understanding the current demands of local customers.

Translate academic lessons to real-life

University students are exposed to many academic materials which help build a strong foundation of the theoretical aspects of the business. But they sometimes translate differently to the real world. According to Ramim, business competitions can play a massive role in helping to bridge this gap, as it puts the participants in the shoes of decision-makers which helps to develop their strategic thinking ability. It allows participants to try out different solutions and get feedback from experts that gives meaning to their academic learning. As such, focusing on core academic lessons is a great way to build a strong foundation for your business skills.

Always prepare multiple justifications

Business competitions require analytical

rigour, especially so with regard to the efficacy and feasibility of a solution. Regardless of whether the solution type is conventional, it is essential that an active effort is given to justify it from various angles and stakeholders. Sourodip suggests that competitors should be as analytical as possible and give multiple justifications for any proposed decision. He further suggests not to go ahead only on gut feelings but to improvise them with logical analysis. Furthermore, being prepared with multiple justifications also help you land a positive impression on your peers and judges - as well as preparing you for the unpredictability of the real business world.

Make your presentation compelling

In almost all stages, a presentation is necessitated in business competitions. Judges get to know about the suggested product or solution through these presentations, so they must be made in a way that makes the judges take note to give you brownie points. There are many ways a presentation can be made interesting.

For instance, catchy facts could make the judge care more about the problem your proposed product aims to solve. According to Sourodip, judges are used to routine corporate presentations, so it is beneficial to do something that catches their attention. He further shares that some great ways to make a presentation interesting include but are not limited to adding an anecdote, including verbal illustrations, or telling a story. As long as you focus on delivering your points in a compelling fashion, you are more likely to succeed.

Ace different aspects of the competition

There are different types of business competitions and various effective strategies for each type. But a few aspects of these competitions need to be done very well across all types. Ramim recommends competitors use various tools such as SWOT or PESTEL in their presentations. He also suggests that teams should sync the role of individuals within the team in different aspects to prepare effectively in answering Q&A sessions.

Ishtiaque further shares that he looks at how the Return on Investment (ROI) is calculated. To truly excel in business competitions, ROI must demonstrate the financial feasibility of your solution and make it more appealing to judges. It is also a key factor to keep in mind when tackling real-life business problems.

ChatGPT: Everything you need to know about the new AI Chatbot

Artificial intelligence (AI) products have been dominating the headlines for the last several months. The recent hype surrounding AI arts has shown us a glimpse into the potential of AI in disrupting the creative industry. More recently, the launch of ChatGPT has taken the internet by storm and has decidedly marked a turning point for generative AI. If you have been behind the curve on this one, fear not, we are here to catch you up to speed! In this article, we have rounded up all the nitty-gritty details that you need to know about the viral sensation called ChatGPT.

What is ChatGPT?

ChatGPT is a chatbot in essence - but no ordinary chatbot whatsoever. The first thought that comes to your mind when you think of chatbots is perhaps a rudimentary tool that is only capable of answering frequently asked questions on corporate help desk pages. But ChatGPT is here to permanently change your perception of chatbots.

ChatGPT is a large language model that can automatically process and generate responses in a human-like manner. The chatbot lets you type open-ended questions about any topic, to which it gives answers that feel conversational rather than hand-coded. ChatGPT is powered by GPT-3.5, a language-generation software that has been designed to carry back-and-forth conversations with human users. It was trained on enormous volumes of data scraped off the web, then fine-tuned with human assistance to deliver more interactive and useful dialogue.

ChatGPT was developed by San Francisco-based OpenAI, a research company led by Sam Altman and backed by tech investors like Microsoft, Tesla Inc. CEO Elon Musk, and LinkedIn co-founder Reid Hoffman, among others. The company is a power player in the AI applications industry that is known for its breakthrough AI art generator DALL-E.

ChatGPT was released in late November and within only five days of its release, it reached one million users. To

website and click on the 'Try ChatGPT' option. As soon as you sign up with your email address and phone number, the chat page gets loaded. The page is fairly easy to navigate with an area where your results will show up and a text box where you can type your inquiries. There is a 'Regenerate response' button that you may click if you are not satisfied with the response you have received or if you want to opt for a different answer.

What can you do with this chatbot?

Since its launch, social media feeds have been flooded with users displaying ChatGPT's seemingly infinite uses, from generating poems for dating app matches to cheating on university assignments by generating essays. Here are some easy ways you can take advantage of this intelligent tool without breaching any ethical code.

First and foremost, you can prompt ChatGPT to explain complex concepts for you. For example, you may write: "Explain metaphysical philosophy." After you get an answer, for better understanding, you may write: "Explain it for a 10-year-old student" and voila, the chat has broken down the concept into layman's terms.

You can also use it to dash off and fine-tune your resumes and cover letters in just a few seconds. While you can crib from a lot of example copies on the internet, ChatGPT can help create a personalised copy and add a professional polish to your resume or cover letter.

You may utilise the chatbot to generate

codes from scratch or finding a few bugs in your code. However, you still have to double-check to make sure the output is not buggy or insecure.

You can use the chatbot to make summaries of long-form content to get a quick overview of a topic. You can paste the text into ChatGPT and ask it "Shorten this text to three paragraphs while retaining the important details".

ChatGPT can come in handy if you are preparing for an interview. You can prompt the chatbot to generate some generate hypothetical scenarios in a job interview, possible questions that may be asked, convincing replies to those questions, and so on.

Last but not least, you may prompt the chatbot to get a custom list of movies, books, or songs based on your preferences. For this, simply use, "Give me movie recommendations based on the fact that I loved 'Witness for the Prosecution'".

When deploying the chatbot, however, keep in mind that it knows about information only through 2021, cannot browse the web live, and is prone to inaccuracies. So, it would be wise to not use the tool for anything crucial at its current stage. Also, make sure to verify the information it provides before using it.

Is it a good alternative to search engines?

While search engines respond to queries with links to relevant websites, ChatGPT presents information in a structured form without any link or citation, thus eliminating countless hours of research. However, since ChatGPT was built fundamentally as a large language model and not a traditional search engine, it does not have access to the same breadth and depth of information as other search engines.

In short, whether or not ChatGPT is a good alternative to search engines hinges on the specific needs and preferences of the users. It may be a useful option for those who value a more interactive and conversational search experience. But it may not provide satisfactory results for certain types of searches where you expect an array of options instead of a single simple answer to your question.

What does the future hold?

ChatGPT is still a work in progress and requires much more improvements in many areas. Though we cannot tell what the future versions may look like, it is clear that this is a peek into the future of infinite possibilities that AI products hold. Reams of reports show that ChatGPT is just the first of many similar chatbots that will be used extensively in our day-to-day life in the not-so-distant future.

Now that we are witnessing a meteoric rise of AI products, it is a good time to pause and assess: How can we use these intelligent tools safely and ethically? How can we prepare ourselves for the inevitable technological unemployment? How can we use these tools to help us think fast rather than rob us of the capability to think in the first place? Right now, we do not have clear answers to these questions. But these questions will be raised, again and again, as newer AI products keep making waves in the tech industry.



put this number into perspective, Netflix took 41 months, Facebook 10 months and Instagram 2.5 months to achieve this milestone. As the excitement about this chatbot is rising, so is the agitation regarding its future. While some observers are predicting that it will sound the death knell for human-generated writing, others are trumpeting it as an actual disruptive technology.

How can you use it?

If you want to try your hands at using this tool, the good news is, ChatGPT is free (for now at least). Just go to the ChatGPT

the first draft of a business proposal, email, or press release that you have to write in a little time. For example, you can ask ChatGPT: "Write me a press release for a consulting firm called X that has acquired company Y to bolster market leadership in cybersecurity." We would not recommend using the response as is, rather, you can use it as a baseline for your final draft.

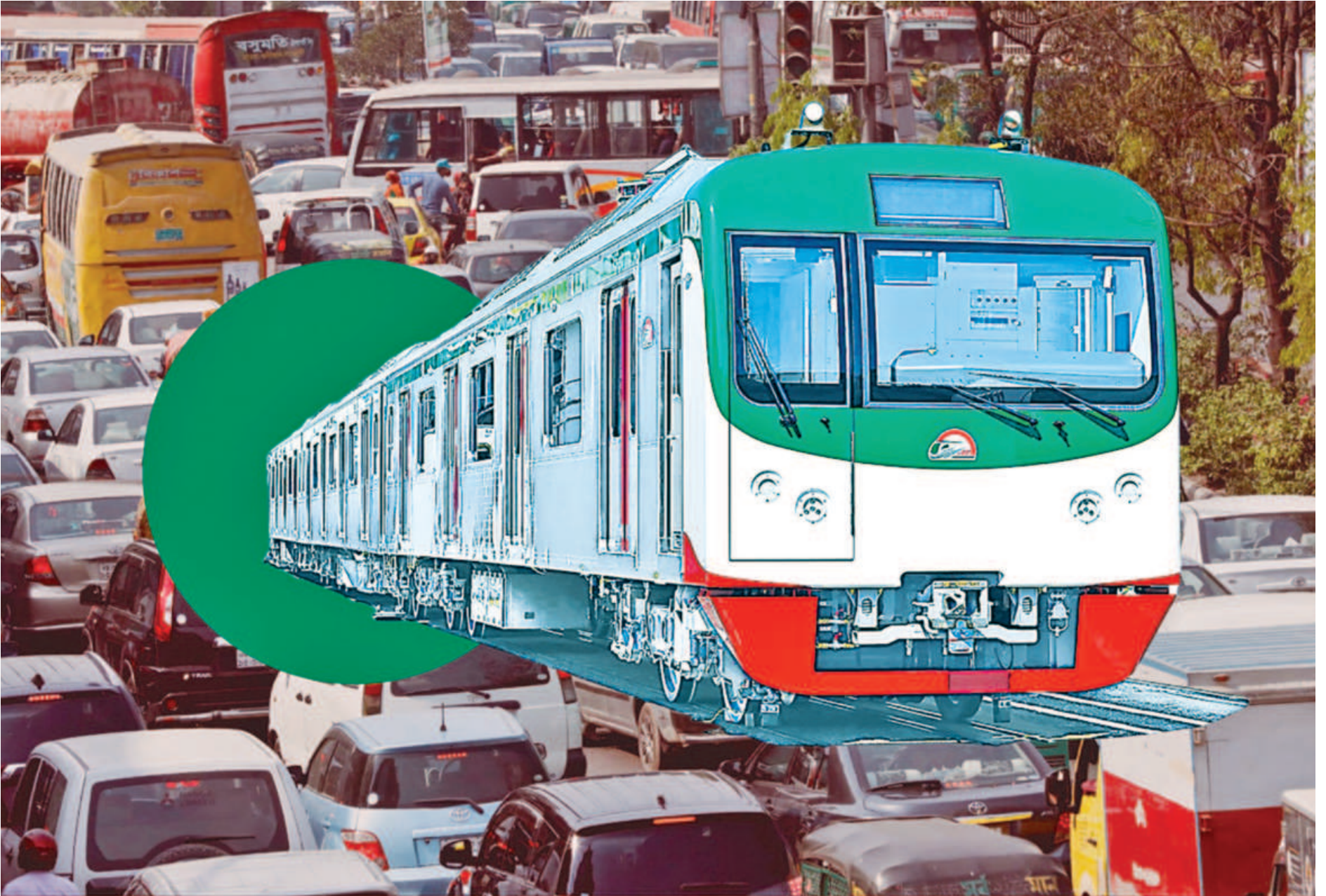
