The plane that brought Bangabandhu home

Talks on to set up exhibition centre for the aircraft, which is now in Germany

It had been months since Bangabandhu last felt the breeze outside his jail cell in West Pakistan. Since the start of the Liberation War, he kept languishing there, while his people fought tooth and nail to fulfil the dream of an independent Bangladesh.

Then on December 16, 1971, freedom was announced. East Pakistan became Bangladesh, Pakistani authorities finally released Bangabandhu from solitary confinement, and later on, a plane was arranged to take him home to his motherland.

The very plane that bears memories of the extraordinary event later found a home at an aircraft museum in Germany. How the aircraft, which used to serve the UK's prime minister, ended up carrying Bangabandhu and then landed at the museum is a story worth telling.

Currently, some Bangladeshis are working with authorities of the museum in Hermeskeil to prepare an exhibition centre for showcasing the historic Comet jet (DH106 Comet 4C), which belonged to the British Royal Air Force (RAF), at the

establishment.

"We are in talks regarding the exhibition centre... When they [museum authorities] got to know that this plane carried Bangabandhu home, they felt delighted to have it at the museum," said Tarik Sujat, who wrote the book "Bangabandhur Swadesh Pattyabartan Comet Biman o British Gopon Dalil", published in 2022.

In 2021, the museum authorities sent a letter to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, also the journey, and writings centring the

RAF sold the jet to DAN-AIR Service, a British private airline in 1975. The new

historical significance of Bangabandhu's owner changed the livery (the special design and colour scheme). Air Classik then bought it in 1981. Both the airlines merged with British Airways in 1992.

Leo Junior, founder of the museum Flugausstellung L+P Junior -- bought the plane at auction in 1996, and since then, the aircraft has been there.

Tarik saw the plane during a visit in October 2021 and found that the livery used by DAN-AIR was still fine. The cockpit was

Trial against GK Shamim, his mother begins

Trial against GK Shamim, an expelled Jubo League leader, and his mother Ayesha Akhter in a case filed over amassing illegal wealth worth Tk 297 crore. began at a Dhaka court yesterday with deposition of the complainant.

Judge Shaikh Nazmul Alam of the Special Judge's Court-4 of Dhaka recorded statement of Deputy Director of ACC Md Salahuddin.

During the hearing, GK Shamim was present in the court while his mother went into hiding after getting bail from the High Court.

The judge then fixed February 12 for crossexamination of the complainant on behalf of the accused in the case.

The ACC filed the case against GK Shamim, a government-listed contractor, and his mother on October 21, 2019 for accumulating illegal wealth worth Tk 297 crore.

But the investigation agency found involvement of accruing illegal wealth of Tk 300 crore, according to the charge sheet.

Govt overcame many hurdles for metro rail: PM

Urges commuters to follow guidelines

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said her government overcame several challenges to implement the metro rail and different development projects in the country.

"There had been challenges when we went for any work, but we completed all those projects overcoming all hurdles," the PM said in introductory speech in the weekly cabinet meeting held at the Prime Minister's Office.

Talking about the metro-rail project, she said in the initial feasibility study, the metro rail route was designed to go through Bijoy Sarani. "In that case, we would have to close down our Tejgaon airport, which has a 9,000-foot runway. I was dead against that proposal."

Hasina mentioned that during the 1998 floods, all the relief goods were transported through this airport as Kurmitola airport became inundated.

She told the meeting that if the old design was implemented, then the government would have to demolish 22 buildings. "I proposed the new route using The PM also mentioned that she extended the metro

rail route up to Kamalapur station. "At that time, demolishing Kamalapur station for the metro rail was proposed, to make space for turning and landing." The PM told officials concerned that it would not have

been wise to demolish such a big station and construct Hasina said she asked them how they could make space

'Road crashes have actually gone down'

Claims top transport leader; e-tickets for 711 more buses start today

While three organisations working on roadsafety issues said road crashes are on the rise, Khondaker Enayet Ullah, general secretary of Dhaka Road Transport Owners' Association (DRTOA), yesterday claimed that the number is going down.

He, however, admitted that deaths in road crashes have increased.

Enayet made the claim at a press conference arranged to inform that 711 more buses under 15 companies based in the capital's Mohammadpur, Azimpur, and Gabtoli will be brought under e-ticketing system from today.

The conference was held at DRTOA office in the capital's Paribagh.

Three organisations -- Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity, Road Safety Foundation, and Nirapad Sarak Chai -- recently published their annual road-crash reports, which said that both crashes and deaths have increased last year when compared with previous years.

According to Jatri Kalyan Samity, 9,951 people were killed in 6,749 road crashes last year. The numbers of crashes and deaths are the highest since 2015; they are 19.89 and 27.43 percent, respectively, higher than those in 2021.

Road Safety Foundation said 7,713 people were killed in 6,829 crashes last year, 27.14 and
