schooling for a better Dhaka. "We have suggested building 627 schools, 285 colleges, and 287 hospitals in the capital," he said. Students will have to be admitted to schools near their residences.

Tk 25,000 crore is needed to acquire lands for the schools, whereas the cost of a line of metro rail is Tk 30,000 crore. It is possible to reduce

traffic congestion by implementing area-wise schooling system," said Ashraful, who presented the keynote paper.

Arefin and previous DC Md Moniruzzaman Talukder and Dumuria's UNO Sharif Alik Rahman appeared before the HC bench and offered unconditional apology for not complying with its earlier directives for evicting illegal brick kilns from the rivers, writ petitioner's lawyer Manzill Murshid told The Daily Star.

Advocate Sazzad-ul-Islam, lawyer for the DC and UNO, could not be reached for his comments on this issue.

In response to a petition,

the HC on February 25, 2021 ordered the authorities to maintain status quo on land grabbing, earth filling and operating brick kilns on the land of the Bhadra and Hora rivers and also issued a rule asking the authorities concerned to explain why their inaction to stop such activities should not be declared illegal.
