

### Maritime university gets new VC

The incumbent Chairman of Mongla Port, Rear Admiral Mohammad Musa,



has been appointed as the new vice chancellor of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Maritime University.

According to a notification issued by the Ministry of Education, President Abdul Hamid, also chancellor of the university, appointed him for the next four years.

He will replace the outgoing VC Rear Admiral (Retd) M Khaled Iqbal.

Rear Admiral Musa has an outstanding naval career of 38 years with the highest-rated professional record in command, staff, and instructional appointments both in Armed Forces, National and International level, said a press release. He has commanded 6 warships, including the Flagship of Bangladesh Navy.

He performed as Directing Staff at National Defence College. Admiral has four masters (International Relations, English Literature, Business Administration and Security Studies), MPhil and PhD on Maritime Governance.

## DEFENCE PARTNERSHIP 2 Indian ships arrive in Ctg

Two Indian Coast Guard ships arrived in Chattogram for a six-day visit on Friday, making a mark on the Indo-Bangla defence partnership.

ICGSShaurya and ICGSRajveer, two indigenously built Indian ships, were given a warm welcome by the Bangladesh Coast Guard, read a statement of the Indian High Commission.

ICGS Shaurya is an Advanced Offshore Patrol Vessel operates both Chetak & Advance Light Helicopters and has long range endurance.

The ship's sustenance and reach, coupled with its advanced systems, make it a versatile multipurpose platform for fulfilling Coast Guard Charter of duties.

ICGS Rajveer is an Inshore Patrol Vessel fitted with advanced navigation and communication equipment, sensors and machinery imparting the ship wide-ranging capabilities for search and rescue, maritime law enforcement and marine pollution response operations.

The visit of these ships is an important part of the defence partnership between India and Bangladesh and the wide-ranging cooperation between the Coast Guards of the two countries.

Regular visits of ships between the Navies and Coast Guards of India and Bangladesh contribute to further strengthening mutual trust and understanding between the two countries and their armed forces, while showcasing the common commitment to peace, stability and prosperity of our shared maritime space, the statement read.

## 7 more hospitalised with dengue

At least 7 dengue patients were hospitalised in the last 24 hours till yesterday morning.

With the new ones, the total number of dengue cases this year rose to 377, according to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

Some 123 dengue patients are still undergoing treatment of which 73 are from outside Dhaka, it added.

The total number of deaths in dengue was 281 last year while the total number of cases was 62,382, of which 23,162 were from outside Dhaka, according to the DGHS.

Meanwhile, Experts have urged the authorities concerned to conduct extensive drives, identifying clusters of Aedes mosquitoes since the beginning of the lean period.

## Sylhet fuel traders call indefinite strike from Jan 18

Protesting poor supply of fuel, Sylhet's fuel traders decided to go on an indefinite strike from Wednesday.

The Sylhet divisional committee of Bangladesh Petroleum Dealers, Distributors, Agents, and Owners Association made announced after an emergency meeting yesterday.

According to the organisation's decision, traders will cease purchasing fuel from depots on Wednesday and selling to consumers from January 22.

"The Sylhet oil traders have no choice but to protest," said speakers in the meeting, mentioning that the short supply has been going on for a long time.

children drowning in various ponds and canals of Patuakhali doubles. In 2021, 56 children drowned, but in 2022, the figure rose to 100. The number was 29 in 2020. According to the data provided by the office of Patuakhali civil surgeon,

The World Health Organization (WHO) has recommended 10 essential measures to prevent child drowning. These include child day-care centres, learning swimming and first-aid. Such measures, however, are few and far between. A lack of awareness in this regard prevails in society.

the upazila called Anchal. "Around 2,500 children have been taught swimming during this time. We also provide primary-level education at our daycare centre," he said. "We take care of the children from morning to noon when the mothers are busy doing household chores, as most accidents take place during this time."

In 2022, 26 children drowned in Kalapara upazila alone, the highest in the district. Most of the deaths occurred between morning and noon, and majority of them were children aged under six years.

Mariam, 7, daughter of Masud Mridha of Sutabaria village in the district's Galachipa upazila, and Rafia, 4, daughter of Nizam Mridha of the same village, drowned in a pond near their house on December 30.

When Rafia fell into the waterbody, her cousin Mariam jumped into the pond to save her baby sister, but both perished. Relatives later recovered their floating bodies.

Masum said, "The pond was unfenced. If it had been netted, my child would not have drowned."

Meanwhile, the private organisation Center for Injury Prevention and Research has been working in Kalapara for the last one year to prevent child drowning. Its field manager Motaher Hossain said children aged between 6 and 10 years are being taught swimming in Kalapara to prevent drowning. They also operate a day-care centre in Patuakhali Civil Surgeon SM Kabir Hossain said a campaign is being launched to raise awareness to prevent child drowning. Ponds will be fenced with net and some ditches or marshlands next to the homesteads will be filled up with soil. Besides, the issue of teaching swimming to children after a certain age should be transformed into a social movement, he said.

unfavourable weather conditions. On the other hand, broker syndicates and middlemen are offering Tk 4,000, instead of the fixed price of Tk 6,000 for mustard honey."

Dulal said there are more than 2,500 commercial beekeepers in the country. Among them, there are more than a hundred bee farms in Tangail district, half of which produce honey commercially.

He said the country's

honey farmers produce more than 3,000 tonnes of honey annually. About 1000 tonnes of honey is from mustard and litchi, and the remaining 1,000 tonnes is from various flowers and crops.

Beekeepers demanded that the government give special attention to this sector.

Contacted, Shahnaz Begum, assistant general manager of Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation

(BSCIC) in Tangail, said a few years ago, they had given training to beekeepers and a loan of Tk 25,000. But these initiatives have currently stopped.

"Many beekeepers couldn't repay those loans due to various problems. They have demanded increasing the loan to Tk 1 lakh. We've also sent the same proposal to the higher authorities but no decision has been taken yet," she added.

In another accident, Tusher died on the spot after a bus rammed his motorcycle at Kabirpur bus stand on Shailakupa-Jhenaidah road in Shailakupa upazila around 9:30am.

The bodies were sent to Jhenaidah Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsies, the police official added.
