Demands Road Safety Coalition

The government must either incorporate a new chapter on road-safety issues into the Road Transport Act-2018 or make a new law to ensure road safety, demanded Road Safety Coalition Bangladesh yesterday.

The coalition, a platform of nine organisations working on road-safety issues, made the demand at a press conference at the capital's Jatiya Press Club, as according to it, the existing law and rules are not enough to ensure road safety.

Ilias Kanchan, chairman of Nirapad Sarak Chai, a member of the coalition, read out the keynote paper at the press conference.

Kanchan said the road transport act and its rules are not enough to ensure safety on the roads.

Many important issues like safety related to road infrastructure and vehicles, post-crash rescue and treatment, seat-belt use and safety of children do not get due importance, Kanchan added.

In this regard, the coalition demanded the government either incorporate a new chapter into the existing act or enact a separate "Road Safety Act" to deal with all such issues.

Representatives of other member organisations were also present at the press conference.

re than half the children with abilities in Bangladesh are not colled in any formal education, ording to new national-level data.

The findings come from the recently olished National Survey on Persons h Disabilities (NSPD) 2021, conducted the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics S) with technical support from icef, said a press release issued by icef yesterday

The survey reveals that among ldren with disabilities (aged 5-17 rs), only 65 percent are enrolled in

- the first of its kind by the BBS highlights the challenges children with disabilities face growing up. The findings will support the government to formulate policies and initiatives to ensure the rights of persons with disabilities in Bangladesh," said Iftekhairul Karim, BBS project director.

According to the survey, 1.7 percent of children in Bangladesh live with one of twelve types of disability defined in the Persons with Disability Rights and Protection Act 2013, while 3.6 percent of children face functional difficulty in at least one of the domains of mary school and only 35 percent are seeing, hearing, walking, motor skills, controlling behaviour. "The new data highlights just how many children with disabilities in Bangladesh are losing out on education. We need to do more for these children. 'They issued 5,000 birth certificates breaching server' Four of racket held in port city

Chattogram police yesterday arrested four people over issuance of birth certificates illegally by breaching the government server.

Members of the counter-terrorism division of Chattogram Metropolitan Police arrested them during a drive in the port city's Patenga and EPZ areas

Collaborating with several organised, techsavvy criminals, a gang has issued around 5,000 birth certificates across the country, by using false information and taking huge amounts of money from people, said police.

The arrestees are Md Mostakim, 22, Md Delwar Hossain Saimon, 23, and Abdur Rahman Arif, 35. The other arrestee is a juvenile, they said.

Over 500 birth certificates were issued illegally under five wards of CCC from January 8 to January 20, using addresses of different districts. Noticing the unusual activity, Chattogram City Corporation had temporarily suspended the birth registration SEE PAGE 4 COL 4

CCC to allocate 115 spots for posters, set fees

The Chattogram City Corporation (CCC) will designate 115 specific spots in the port city where people can put up posters for a fee.

This decision has been taken in a bid to keep the city neat and clean, said CCC sources.

However, instead of managing the system itself, CCC will go through a tender process to select a private company for management, they said, adding that the decision was made in an internal meeting of CCC's conservancy department on Monday.

Contacted, CCC Chief Conservancy Officer Abul Hashem said the tender would be floated by publishing a circular in newspapers in a day or two.

"The highest bidder would be selected through the tender. The selected company would set up steel structures of 10 feet by 6 feet in the dedicated spots and realise fees from individuals or organisations putting up posters," he said. "The fee would be fixed by CCC," he added.

Hashem said a fine would be imposed on those who paste posters beyond the specific spots.

A part of the revenue from the fees will go to CCC, officials said.

Many city dwellers are, however, doubtful whether this initiative will bear any fruit despite it SEE PAGE 4 COL 4

The survey also found that children with disabilities who do attend formal education lag academically by over two years for their age on average.
