For the first time in three years, February 1 marked the opening day of the Amar Ekushey Boi Mela, commemorating the memories of the Language Movement martyrs. The fair will continue till February 28.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated the book fair in person after three years, with the apt theme of "Read books and build Bangabandhu's Bangladesh".

After the inauguration ceremony, the doors of Boi Mela were opened for the public at 5:30pm, when people of all ages and all walks of life gathered at the Suhrawardy Udyan premises, where the fair is being held.

Mahbub Jamil Pulak, who visited the fair on its opening day, said, "I'm an avid music lover and so, I'm looking for books related to music. I bought Joy Shariar's 'Rupali Guitar', written about rock legend Ayub Bachchu and 'Niloy Da' about celebrated musician Niloy Das, edited by Milu Aman and Haque Faruk."

"I'm happy to be back at the fair without any restrictions. I will come back again to purchase books by my favourite writers," he added.

Another visitor Jannatul Nayem Annanya, who came to the fair with her friends, said, "This is the first time that I'm visiting the fair on its opening day. The premises look vibrant with all the new books."

Publishers, on the other hand, are expecting some good sales as readers can now visit the fair without any restrictions in place.

CURBING AIR POLLUTION

'Govt must Implement HC directives'

The government must implement the 12 High Court directives to curb air pollution immediately, including spraying water on the roads and banning black smoke-emitting vehicles, demanded environmentalists.

They made the demands at a discussion, titled "Urgent measures needed to curb air pollution in Dhaka", held yesterday at Dhaka Reporters Unity premises.

Save The Environment Movement, Work for a Better Bangladesh (WBB Trust), Jonoudoyg, Nagorik Adhikar Sanrakshan Forum (Nasal), Green Force, DU Poribesh Sangsad, and environmentalists from Bangladesh Safe Water Movement's jointly organised the discussion.

Speakers said air pollution in the capital has reached a dangerous level. According to AirVisual's air quality index data, 23 days out of the first 24 days of January saw Dhaka's air quality at an alarming level. The air quality index indicated that the air quality was at a hazardous level of 301+ with the highest level of air pollution recorded at 635 on 12th January.

Don't eat food from strangers

5 members of dope gang arrested in Dhaka

They sell Ayurvedic medicines on buses and trains. Some members of the gang travel on specific vehicles in the guise of passengers. In the middle of the journey, the other members get on board and pitch benefits of the medication. To make the pitch more credible, the "commuters" begin hyping up the medicines, saying "I took it before and it was helpful".

Because of all the "positive feedback", some travellers fall right into the trap and buy the products. The catch is that these seemingly innocuous ayurvedic medicines are mixed with powerful sedatives. As a result, commuters become unconscious shortly after consuming those. And then, the gang starts snatching away valuables from the targets.

Mizanur Rahman Molla alias Molla Mizanur, the leader of the dope gang, described the techniques while talking to this newspaper recently.

Mizanur, also known as "Guru" among his associates, has been involved in such activities for over one and a half decades on Dhaka-Chattogram and Dhaka-Sylhet highways, and different routes of north Bengal.

Law enforcers have arrested him six times so far, but Mizanur returned to this life of crime after securing bail every time.

Recently, the detective branch (DB) of police arrested Mizanur again, alongside four others -- Sumon, Sarwar, Abul Basar, and Nure Alam --

from different areas of the capital on Sunday.

Mashiur Rahman, deputy commissioner of DB (Lalbagh division) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police, told The Daily Star that they are now interrogating the arrestees to learn about other dope gangs.

Generally, these gangs usually operate during summer, but this year, they started looting people before the end of winter, he said.

Mizanur, also known as "Guru" among his associates, has been involved in such activities for over one and a half decades on Dhaka-Chattogram highways, Dhaka-Sylhet highways, and different routes of north Bengal. Law enforcers have arrested him six times so far, but Mizanur returned to this life of crime after securing bail every time.

Detectives came to know about the gang's activities and arrested the five while investigating a recent complaint of a district additional judge.

The additional judge was going to Dhaka from Chattogram on a public bus. As he did not reach home in time, his relatives started to search for him.

Finally, he was found unconscious

Man who stole 1,000 bikes in 15 years held

Detectives claimed to have arrested a member of a gang of motorcycle thieves who was involved in stealing around 1,000 bikes over the last 15 years.



A team of DB arrested Abdul Khaleq on Tuesday while investigating a general diary filed with Turag Police Station, Mohammad Harun Or Rashid, chief of detective branch of Dhaka Metropolitan Police, told reporters at his office yesterday.

Detectives also recovered 12 stolen motorcycles based on his information.

"During primary interrogation, Khaleq admitted that he stole around 1,000 motorcycle in the last 15 years," he said.

"He had at least seven others accomplices who were arrested by law enforcers earlier. The gang members committed the same crime after getting released on bail," he said.

The DB official said the theft of motorcycles is rampant and they often get complaints that bikes are being stolen from garages or roads.

He asked people to be careful before buying old motorcycles, and to check if documents were valid.

Dhaka, Tokyo vow deeper ties

'An anti-people decision'

Gano Forum urges govt to scrap move to hike electricity price

The government has taken an anti-people decision by increasing the electricity price twice in a month without holding any mass hearing, said Dr Kamal Hossain, president of Gano Forum.

In a joint statement, he said people are already reeling from the unbridled price hike of essentials and inflation.

The government on Tuesday increased the electricity price by 5 percent at the retail level -- the second hike in 19 days, as it steadily retracts subsidies from the power sector while piling the burden on common people already struggling with inflation.

On top of that, the continuous price hike of power, gas and energy due to the wrong decision and inappropriate planning in the energy sector will further cause untold sufferings to people, reads a press release.

Dr Kamal has asked the government to form an inquiry commission comprising experts to take an appropriate plan to prevent corruption and wastage in the energy sector.

In the statement, the party has called upon the government to scrap its decision. Gano Forum General Secretary Mizanur Rahman is another signatory of the statement.
