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585 killed in 593 road crashes in January

Says Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity

At least 585 people were killed and 899 injured in 593 road accidents across the country last month, according to Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity.

During this time, 214 road crashes involving motorcycles (36.09 percent of total crashes) claimed 205 lives (35.04 percent of the total death toll) last month.

The Samity, which compiled the data following media reports, revealed it through a press release yesterday.

The development came within a month after the transport authorities and leaders came down heavily on relevant organisations, including the Samity, for publishing "fabricated" reports on road crashes.

Speaking at a workshop

The road crashes and injuries have increased in January this year by 5.3 percent and 10.04 percent respectively, compared to January last year.

previous years, taking the number of vehicles into account.

They also said organisations are publishing "fabricated" reports on road crashes, creating confusion among the people and tarnishing the country's image abroad.

However, representatives of two road safety organisations, who were present at the workshop, said the numbers were based on media reports and prepared with due diligence.

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They snatch 300 phones a day

Says DB after arresting 16 of a theft gang in Dhaka

Around a hundred roam the city streets in search of their target -- mobile phones. On average, they mug unsuspecting people and steal around 300 phones in Dhaka and adjoining areas every day.

The "mohajans (gang leaders)" set a target for each of their members to snatch at least three phones per day.

Mohammad Harun Or Rashid, chief of Dhaka Metropolitan Police's Detective Branch, disclosed this yesterday after law enforcers arrested 16 muggers including two gang leaders from different areas.

"So every day, 300 mobile phones, on average, are being mugged in the city," he said.

The muggers snatch the phones whenever anyone talks or browses the internet while sitting on the window seat of a bus or car.

The gang leaders then buy the phones from them at a low price.

The inexpensive phones are sold directly, while the expensive ones are dismantled and sold as parts. In some cases, the gang leaders change the International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI) numbers of the phones and sell them, he said.

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Man dies in bike accident on Hanif flyover

A man died after a vehicle hit his motorcycle and ran him over on the Mayor Mohammad Hanif Flyover in Dhaka's Jatrabari area yesterday afternoon.

The deceased was identified as Rakib Hasan, 31.

"Rakib died on the spot after an unknown vehicle ran him over around 2:00pm. We are trying to locate the vehicle," said Nur Mohammad, sub-inspector of Jatrabari Police Station.

The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy, he added.

The deceased's uncle Nur Uddin said Rakib lived with his mother in Dhalpur area and offered rideshare services on his motorcycle.

"We came to know that he died in an accident on the flyover," he said.
