Why first 72 hours crucial for rescues

Time was running out for survivors buried in the rubble of the earthquake in Turkey and Syria, as search efforts near the crucial 72-hour mark, a rescue response expert

More than 90 percent of earthquake survivors are rescued within the first three days, said Ilan Kelman, a professor of disasters and health at University College London. With the 72-hour window closing early this morning, Kelman told AFP why this timeframe is so important.

INJURIES, TEMPERATURE

"Generally, earthquakes do not kill people, collapsing infrastructure kills people," said Kelman, who has published research on quake rescue responses. The most pressing factor is getting medical attention to people crushed under collapsed buildings before "their bodies fail" or they bleed out, he said.

Weather is also a key factor, and "it is completely against us" in Turkey and Syria, Kelman said. "This very sadly means that hypothermia is possible, and people are probably unfortunately perishing due to the weather,"

GETTING HELP TO THE SCENE Kelman said that normally "the vast majority of survivors are brought out within 24 hours

by local teams, often using no more than their hands or a shovel.' Dozens of nations have pledged to send search and rescue teams as well as relief supplies to Turkey and Syria.

But the quake occurred in "a remote area, in a conflict zone, which is very difficult to get into," Kelman said. It generally takes

get set up and start working. "At that point, a good number of the people who could have survived have already perished," Kelman said.

HOW TO FIND SURVIVORS?

Once on the scene, there are a range of ways that rescue teams can find earthquake survivors, including dogs which sniff through rubble. A particularly famous team of quake rescue dogs from Mexico is on its way to Turkey, Kelman pointed out.

BEFORE THE 72 HOURS STARTS

Kelman emphasised that "ultimately, a successful rescue operation starts decades before the earthquake to try to stop the infrastructure collapsing in the first place". During an international rescue operation such as those in Turkey and Syria, it costs an average of \$1 million per life saved, he said. "If we would see levels of investment in disaster prevention that we are seeing in disaster response, we would not be in this situation.'

A one-year-old baby was found alive yesterday in the Turkish province of Sanliurfa after spending 53 hours trapped under a collapsed five- In the southeastern Adiyaman storey building, Turkey's Anadolu Agency reported.

HIDDEN CASH STOCKPILE

Ousted Lankan president quizzed

Sri Lankan police told AFP vesterday they are investigating ousted president Gotabava Rajapaksa over a hidden cash stockpile uncovered when protesters stormed his former residence last year. Rajapaksa presided over an unprecedented economic crisis that saw the island nation's 22 million people suffer through months of food, fuel and pharmaceutical shortages. He fled the country last July after an angry mob besieged his compound -- tendering his resignation from abroad days later – but has since returned and is living under armed guard. Protesters occupied his presidential palace for several days, discovering 17.5 million rupees (\$48,000) hidden in Rajapaksa's private quarters that they later turned over to police. Police investigators on Monday "recorded a three-hour long statement from the former president Gotabaya Rajapaksa on the cash found in the president's house", police spokesman Nihal Thalduwa told AFP. A court in the capital Colombo had ordered police to take a statement on the cash stockpile last November. Thalduwa said the interrogation was part of an ongoing investigation, without giving further details.

DOWNING OF FLIGHT MH17 Putin 'approved' missile supply: probe

Russian President Vladimir Putin likely decided to supply the missile that shot down Malaysia Airlines flight MH17 over Ukraine, but there is no realistic prospect of prosecuting him or others, investigators said yesterday. Investigators said there were "strong indications" Putin had


personally approved the transfer of the missile to pro-Russian separatists during fighting in eastern Ukraine in 2014, citing intercepted phone calls. But the probe is being suspended because "all leads have been exhausted"

into the shooting down of the plane, which crashed with the loss of all 298 people on board. The announcement comes less than three months after a Dutch court convicted two Russians and a Ukrainian of murdering those aboard MH17. "There are strong indications that the Russian president decided on supplying the Buk TELAR to the separatists," the Joint Investigation Team said.
