



Shahabuddin next president

No contestant against AL's surprise pick

Md Shahabuddin, a retired district judge and a former commissioner of Anti-Corruption Commission, is set to become the next president unopposed, putting an end to weeks of intense speculation over the post of the head of the state.

The ruling Awami League yesterday submitted the papers nominating Shahabuddin, also a freedom fighter and a member of AL Advisory Council.

As no other political parties with representation in parliament fielded any candidate, the Election Commission will announce Shahabuddin as the president-elect after scrutinising the nomination papers today.

The development came as a surprise as his name did not surface until the filing of the nomination. Even many top leaders and the rank and file of the party seemed to have been caught off-guard after his name was announced.

"Nobody knew who will be the president even 10 minutes before [the nomination submission]. There were many speculations and even my name was also discussed," said AL General Secretary Obaidul Quader while speaking at a programme yesterday afternoon.

"Bangabandhu's daughter gave us a real surprise."

An AL delegation, led by Obaidul Quader, submitted the nomination papers to the Election Commission.

Opening likely before polls

BR to run trains from Dhaka to Cox's Bazar, Mongla this year

Bangladesh Railway is likely to open four major railway lines before the next general election.

Chattogram-Cox's Bazar rail line, Khulna-Mongla rail line, Dhaka-Bhanga section of the Padma Bridge Rail Link, and Akhaura-Laksam double line are supposed to significantly improve communications.

The four projects, being implemented with foreign loans, are two to 10 years behind the initial schedule. The cost of three projects escalated by 13 percent to 873 percent.

Even though the lines will be opened before the polls, there could be some work pending, like automatic signalling system. Dedicated manpower for smooth rail operation on the three new lines

could also be a problem as proposals for recruitment are awaiting approval.

For decades, BR has been in a serious manpower crisis.

Officials of the projects want the recruitment process completed before opening of the new lines as they fear it could hamper train operations on other lines.

Railways Minister Nurul Islam has directed the project authorities to have the lines inaugurated before the election, BR sources said.

The next parliamentary election is likely to be held either in late December or early January next year.

"Opening the lines will significantly improve railway operations," BR Director General Quamrul Ahsan told The Daily Star yesterday.

BNP to march in cities Feb 18

The BNP will organise road marches in all divisional cities on February 18 to press home its 10 demands that include holding the next national election under a non-partisan caretaker government.

BNP Standing Committee member Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain made the announcement before the party's road march in the capital's Shyamoli yesterday.

Meanwhile, addressing a rally in the capital's Khilgaon area, Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader said the AL will continue to organise programmes and remain on the streets until the national election, likely to be held early next year.

The BNP again urged its archival not to hold "counter-programmes" during BNP events.

At the AL rally in Khilgaon, Quader said, "We have chalked out our course
