

Rampal power price almost doubles

High cost of coal, devaluation of taka against USD cited as reasons



UNB, Dhaka

The cost of power generation at the 1,320MW Rampal Power Plant is now estimated to be Tk 14-15 per unit, instead of Tk 7-8 per unit estimated when the project was taken up.

"The recent hike in coal prices in the global market has pushed up the generation cost. If the coal prices decline, the generation cost will come down rationally," said Subhash Chandra Pandey, the project director of the Bangladesh-India Friendship Power Company Ltd (BIFPCL).

The BIFPCL, a joint venture of Indian state-owned NTPC and Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB), is the owner and operator of the Rampal power plant.

BPDB officials said escalated dollar prices also played a major role in increasing power generation costs at all power plants.

"The coal price was almost half [of the current price] when the power generation cost of Rampal was calculated at the time of implementation agreement," said a BPDB official.

This seems to be a common problem for BPDB, which doesn't seem to recognise the inherent volatility of international energy markets when making big decisions or entering into agreements.

A woman pregnant with twins died when doctors were removing her kidney stone at an unlicensed hospital in Mymensingh city on Friday.

Civil Surgeon Nazrul Islam yesterday formed a four-member probe committee to find the cause of 25 years old Rekha Akhter's death at Patient Care Hospital in the city's Brahmapalli area.

Officials locked the facility on

Friday as it was operating illegally, said Nazrul.

Legal action will be taken against the hospital authorities and the doctors if the probe finds them guilty, added the civil surgeon.

The probe body headed by Abdul Quddus, deputy director of the divisional health office, was asked to submit its report in seven work days, he said.

India lashes out at critics after BBC raids

Indian Foreign Minister S Jaishankar yesterday hit out at "scaremongering" critics who claim the country's democracy is being corroded, singling out billionaire George Soros -- a popular target for right-wing ire.

At an event in Sydney, Jaishankar rejected accusations that multiple raids on the BBC's India offices showed Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his government were veering toward authoritarianism.

Jaishankar defended the prime minister, painting detractors as "scaremongering", holding an antiquated "Euro-Atlantic view" of democracy and failing to respect the Indian people's democratic choice.

"There are still people in the world who believe
