

Sufia Showkat passes away

Sufia Showkat, mother of Dhaka Metropolitan Police Deputy Commissioner (Detective-Cyber and Special Crime unit-South Division) Mohammad Iqbal Hossain, passed away early yesterday. She was 71.

Wife of late freedom fighter and schoolteacher Showkat Ali, Sufia left behind her two sons, three daughters and a host of relatives to mourn her death.

She was buried at her family graveyard at Pirpur village in Monohardi upazila, Narsingdi following a namaz-e-janaza after the Asr prayers.

Textbooks

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“We don’t think there were errors in the textbooks. There might be some spelling mistakes. But we (NCTB), as a government body, tried to stay above controversy,” he said.

However, Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee President Shahriar Kabir, who spoke at the event, alleged that the government in some cases were compromising with fundamentalists and the withdrawal of the books under pressure from fundamentalist quarters is an example of this.

Rasheda K Choudhury, former advisor to the caretaker government, claimed the state is now moving in the opposite direction of the ideology of non-communalism.

Bangladesh Mahila Parishad President Fauzia Moslem chaired the function, while Liberation War Museum Trustee Mafidul Haque; Rokeya Kabir, executive director of Bangladesh Nari Progati Sangha; and Helen Monisha Sarker, general secretary of Young Women Christian Association Bangladesh, spoke at the discussion.

NCTB on February 10 withdrew two school textbooks in the wake of controversies over some contents. The books, which were withdrawn, are “History and Social Science: An Inquiry-based Reader” for classes 6 and 7.

High cost leads to poor

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at least Tk 6.83 lakh to perform hajj under government management, up by around Tk 1.61 lakh from the previous year. The minimum cost under private management has been fixed at Tk 6.72 lakh, about Tk 1.5 lakh more than that of the year before.

Apart from this, each pilgrim will have to pay about Tk 22,000 for a Qurbani coupon from the Islamic Development Bank in Saudi Arabia. The amount is used for meeting the expenses for sacrificing animals.

This year, the hajj will be held on June 27, depending on the sighting of the moon.

Abdus Salam Aref, general secretary of ATAB, yesterday said a

Bangladeshi pilgrim will have to spend around Tk 8 to 9 lakh on average to complete all formalities of hajj this year.

HAAB, a platform of around 1,500 private hajj agencies, said this year’s airfare was high, for which the cost of hajj packages have increased significantly.

“The airfare of Biman was Tk 1.40 lakh last year. But this year, it is around Tk 2 lakh, which is very high,” said HAAB President M Shahadat Hossain Taslim.

Sources at HAAB and ATAB said in India, the airfare is around Tk 1.25 lakh, and in Pakistan it is about Tk 1 lakh.

ATAB and HAAB leaders said due to the high prices, they are now worried whether the hajj agencies

and government will be able to send the targeted 1.27 lakh Bangladeshis to Saudi Arabia.

ATAB’s Aref asked if airfare of umrah can be around Tk 90,000, then why would hajj airfare be Tk 2 lakh?

“In most cases, intended hajis are saying that it is difficult to manage the additional money,” Md Khorshed Alam, managing partner of Al-Madina Travel & Hajj Kafela, told The Daily Star yesterday.

HAAB leaders said people from villages used to perform hajj in large numbers.

“But as the cost of hajj packages has increased, village people in general can’t afford to go,” said Khorshed.

Traffickers enjoy impunity

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Runa Sultana, coordinator of Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF), noted that the enactment of a victim and witness protection law is crucial to protect victims.

Dipta Rakshit, team leader of Ashashash project, Winrock International, emphasised the implementation of a national referral mechanism with the support of government and non-government organisations to protect the victims.

Advocate Salma Ali, president of BNWLA, said, “Internal human trafficking is another burning issue. Many women have been trafficked from villages to cities as sex workers.”

The event was supported by The Embassy of Switzerland in Bangladesh and Winrock International.

Presided over by Salma Ali, the meeting was addressed, among others, by Jesmin Area Begum, retired senior district and session judge; advocate Jobaida Pervin, general secretary of BNWLA; and Abu Saleh Md Salauddin Khan, deputy secretary at the law ministry.

Seven BNP MPs, including Rumeen Farhana, resigned from the parliament following the December 10 rally last year.

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the PTI centre in 1971, said, “Every night, the screams and cries of freedom fighters filled the area.”

Dipankar Mohanta, a Liberation War researcher, said at the beginning of the war, the Pakistan army used PTI as its brigade headquarters. There, they built an underground bunker, which was used as a torture cell.

“Many women were also raped and killed inside this place,” he said.

“We demand that the chairman of the district council and district deputy commissioner take appropriate steps to preserve this historic place. The authorities should build a monument in the memory of martyrs

and a Liberation War museum on PTI premise,” he added.

Tapan Palit, a history professor at Jagannath University, said after killing people, the Pakistan army would dump the bodies inside the PTI well or in and around surrounding forests and hills.

“Due to a lack of research, there is no exact data on how many people were killed and raped inside this building. People should know about this place,” he said.

Contacted, Moulvibazar Deputy Commissioner Mir Nahid Ahsan said, “We are taking some initiatives to preserve the memories of the martyrs who sacrificed their lives inside this building.”

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stronger bonds, Japan suggested partnering with Bangladesh in further developing the southern Chattogram area centring on the Matarbari Infrastructure Development Initiative (MIDI) project in the context of connectivity.

Both sides agreed that these projects should be built under Japan’s Big-B initiative. Bangladesh hoped that these projects will bring more Japanese investments.

Among others, Bridget Job Johnson, chief of the social and behavioural changes section at Unicef; Rawnak Jahan, director (acting) of the Women’s Global Education Project, and Tahera Jabeen, social development advisor of Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office, also spoke at the event.
