

10-yr-old girl 'tortured to death'

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After her death, she [Mou] kept the body at her Shantibagh house for one day. As the body started to decompose, she rented the freezing van and put the body inside it and asked the driver to park it near a private hospital in Moghbazar," he told The Daily Star.
Forensic doctors at Dhaka Medical College conducted an autopsy on the body yesterday after police sent it to the morgue on Monday night.
"The body bore numerous marks of torture and [there were] burn injuries in some parts too. There are also severe injuries in her genitals," a morgue source said, adding that the doctors have collected samples to test and confirm whether she was raped before death.
Soheli Akter, sub-inspector of Shahjahanpur Police Station, who prepared the inquest report, had also found marks of torture on the body.
"There are small bruises on her head, scratch marks on her forehead and left ear. A swollen wound was found on the right cheek.
"There was blood clotted in her nose and mouth.

Bruises were found on the neck, various parts of the chest and abdomen. Her skin was found peeled off in some parts," the report said.
"My daughter earlier told me that the woman used to torture her... I want justice," the victim's father said.
He added that both his daughters used to work at Mou's house - one for seven years and the deceased for a year and a half.
"I visited them three months ago and my daughter [who passed away] told me that her employer would torture her often. I wanted to take her home but the woman demanded money from me, saying my daughter killed a pet bird and damaged things in her home. I could neither give her money nor take my daughter home then.
"Around 7:00am on Sunday, the employer called me and told me my daughter was sick. I came to Dhaka that very night and asked to see my daughter. The woman then told me she died due to illness."
He further said, "She forbade me to report the incident to anyone and even offered me Tk 70,000 and a house in Savar. I wanted to see my daughter's body but she did not allow it."

Finding no other way, the father then contacted 999 and sought help to find his daughter's body.
"Police later recovered the body from the van."
He also alleged that the woman forbade his elder daughter, who is now with him, from telling anyone about the incident.

The AL chief said assuming office in 1996 after 21 years, her party made the country self-sufficient in food. But then the BNP-Jamaat alliance came to power again and unleashed plundering, money laundering, corruption, militancy, terrorism and killing, she added.
The premier said they mercilessly tortured AL


leaders and activists.
Noting that the BNP was founded in the hands of those who grabbed power illegally violating the constitution, Hasina said the BNP leaders don't think of the wellbeing of the people and Bangladesh, rather they come to power for looting national wealth.
Talking about the development of the haor region, the premier said the otherwise neglected region witnessed a remarkable change in the last 14 years.
Recalling her previous visit to Mithamoin, she said that there was only water everywhere and no road was fit even for rickshaws at that time. "Today those days are gone."
Hasina said her government has been implementing different programmes to change the fate of the neglected communities in the haor area of Kishoreganj.
She said from now on all roads to be built in haor areas would be elevated to protect arable land and existing roads. The government is dredging rivers and canals in the haor region to channel water with a view to protect crops from flash flood, she added.
AL General Secretary Obaidul Quader, Organising Secretary Mirza Azam and Office Secretary Biplab Barua, and local lawmaker Rejwan Ahammad Taufiq spoke at the rally, among others.

Electricity price hiked again by 5pc

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electricity tariffs in November last year was a "welcome step".
Accordingly, Nasrul Hamid, the state minister for power, energy and mineral resources, told The Daily Star last month that the government will adjust the electricity price every month.
Asked why the electricity price was being raised at a time when fuel prices are declining globally, Mir Mohammad Aslam Uddin, the ministry's spokesman, said he didn't get any data from the power division.
"The power division will provide a notification soon in this regard including the reason behind the price hike," he said.

While the IMF did call for lessening the subsidy, they did not prescribe doing so by hiking the electricity price every month, said Khandaker Golam Moazzem, research director at the Centre for Policy Dialogue.
"Going for a price hike is kind of avoiding the main problems in the sector, which are overcapacity, excessive capacity payments, corruption and so on."
There are lots of ways to reduce subsidy expenditure than by hiking the tariffs, which only impacts the consumers.
The government can reduce the subsidy burden by cutting back on the "illogical expenditures" in

the power sector, he said.
"The subsidy burden is not the fault of consumers. With this electricity price hike, it will not be possible to increase the dollar reserves, which would be essential to import fuel for electricity," he added.
The government hiked the electricity price at a time when the energy price in the international market decreasing, said M Shamsul Alam, vice-president of the Consumers' Association of Bangladesh.
"Consumers are in all sorts of problems with the increasing prices of all kinds of products in the past two years. The government should stop toying with the people like this."

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Barring a series defeat to England in 2016, Bangladesh have been unbeaten in their past twelve ODI series at home since 2015 and that will surely provide confidence as the hosts aim to clinch a maiden ODI series win against the English.
The likes of Shakib, Mahmudullah Riyad and Mushfiqur Rahim will lend their vast experience while new match winners like Liton Das and Mehedi Hasan Miraz will also be hungry to perform.
On the other hand, England will look to

continue their attacking brand of cricket regardless of the talk of how a slow and low Mirpur pitch could hamper their strategy.
Things have not been going to well for Jos Buttler and Co. in recent times, especially in the 50-over format where England have managed just one win in their last five ODI series.
Despite that, the experience that some of the visiting squad have of playing in Bangladesh should help them settle relatively quickly and adapt to conditions, meaning it will be a tough battle between the two sides.

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"We've tried to solve the problems after holding talks with the home ministry and others concerned.
