Metro now stopping at Kazipara, Mirpur-11

The Kazipara and Mirpur-11 stations of the country's firstever metro rail were opened to public yesterday morning. Metro rail has started picking up and dropping off

passengers at the stations since morning, said officials. MAN Siddique, managing director of Dhaka Mass Transit Company Ltd, on March 9 told reporters that the two stations would be added to metro rail's Uttara North-Agargaon route from yesterday.

The metro rail will now on stop at -- Uttara North, Pallabi, Mirpur-11,

Mirpur-10 Kazipara and Agargaon.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on December 28 last year inaugurated the country's first-ever metro rail and it was opened to public on the following day. At first, the trains were operated from Uttara to

Agargaon without any stoppage. Later, two more stations -- Pallabi and Uttara Centre

were made operational in two phases.

A year since deal inked, Greece yet to hire Bangladeshis

A year has passed since a memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed between Bangladesh and Greece for the latter to recruit Bangladeshi migrant workers. However, Greece is yet to initiate the

4,000 workers from Bangladesh each year.

According to the Bangladesh embassy in Athens, the recruitment could not be started because of difficulties in visa issuance, since Greece does not have an embassy in Bangladesh.

To resolve the problem, Bangladesh has suggested that Greece open a visa forwarding service (VFS) in Dhaka, said officials at the Bangladesh mission. Currently, Bangladeshis need to submit visa applications to the Greece embassy in India to enter the country.

Bangladesh Ambassador in Greece Ashud Ahmed recently said the mission has been in talks with Greece to find a way to start the recruitment process. Greece is considering Bangladesh's suggestion to open a VFS in Dhaka, the ambassador told this newspaper over phone.

The recruitment process could be started by the end of July, provided that the VFS is opened, he said, adding that the agreement aims to address the regular migration of Bangladeshis to Greece.

The MoU is also seen as an important step towards curbing irregular migration and trafficking of Bangladeshis to the As per the MoU, signed in February last European country. Greece is currently year in Dhaka, Greece is supposed to hire home to more than 28,000 Bangladeshis.

European countries, especially EU member states such as Greece, are soughtafter destinations for many Bangladeshi youths mainly because of their strong economic conditions.

Want Tk 25,000 per month **Demand RMG workers**

RMG workers' leaders at a press conference yesterday urged the government to declare a new wage board for garment workers within a month, considering the current situation.

They also demanded that the government set the monthly wage at Tk 25,000 per month for them.

The event was jointly organised by "Garment Workers Trade Union Centre" and "Garments Workers Rights Movement" in front of the wage board office on Topkhana Road at Segunbagicha in the capital.

RMG workers said the prices of daily essentials have been skyrocketing, and it is getting too difficult for them to survive with the current wage. However, they are yet to get a new wage board,

increment and ration even during this unwarranted time of inflation. From the Covid-19 pandemic to the present time,

the RMG workers have not received any special Meanwhile, they have been victims of lay-offs,

retrenchments and torture, they said. The Labor Act specifies that salaries must be fixed after five years.

However, in accordance with the law, the government may, if required, establish a wage board earlier than the five-year mark as it did in 2010 and 2013 after 2006.

Taslima Akhter, coordinator of the Garment Workers' Rights Movement and the head of the meeting of Bangladesh Garment Workers Solidarity, read the written statement at the press conference.
