# 'I'M BACK'

### Trump returns to Facebook, YouTube

Former president Donald Trump wrote his first posts on his reinstated Facebook and YouTube accounts Friday, more than two years after he was banned over the US Capitol insurrection.

"I'M BACK," Trump exclaimed, alongside a 12-second video clip that appeared to show him giving his victory speech after winning the 2016 election saying: to keep you waiting complicated business.'

The 76-year-old Republicawn leader -- who is running for president again -- has been unable to post any content for his 34 million Facebook followers and 2.6 million YouTube subscribers.

platforms benched Trump days after the January 6, 2021 insurrection, when a mob of his supporters seeking to halt the certification of his election defeat to Joe Biden stormed the US Capitol in Washington.

He was sanctioned for posting content that the platforms said incited unrest, with YouTube announcing his reinstatement on Friday, two months after Facebook said it was unlocking his account.

former reality The TV star had spent weeks falsely claiming that the presidential election was stolen from him, and he was subsequently impeached for inciting the riot.

The former president's Twitter account, which has 87 million followers, was also blocked after the riot.

New Twitter owner Elon Musk reinstated Trump last November, days after Trump announced a fresh White House run, but he has yet to post there.

# Situation with China fragile, dangerous: India

The situation between India and China in the western Himalayan region of Ladakh is fragile and dangerous, with military forces deployed very close to each other in some parts, Indian Foreign S Jaishankar said Minister

At least 24 soldiers were killed when the two sides clashed in the region in mid-2020, but the situation has been calmed through rounds of diplomatic and military talks.

Violence erupted in the eastern sector of the undemarcated border between the nucleararmed Asia giants in December but did not result in any deaths.

'The situation to my mind still remains very fragile because there are places where our deployments are very close up and in military assessment therefore quite dangerous," Jaishankar said at an India Today

India-China relations cannot go back to normal, he said, until the border row is resolved in line with the September 2020 inprinciple agreement he reached with his Chinese counterpart.

"The Chinese have to deliver on what was agreed to, and they have struggled with that."

Although forces from both month. sides have disengaged from many areas, discussions are

points, Jaishankar said. "We have made it very clear to the Chinese that we cannot have a breach of peace and tranquility, you can't violate agreement and want the rest of the relationship to continue as though nothing happened. That's just not

tenable." Jaishankar said he discussed the situation with China's new foreign minister, Qin Gang, on the sidelines of a meeting of the foreign ministers of the G20 nations hosted by India this Ukraine.

Regarding India's presidency of G20 this year, Jaishankar said India has made progress and expressed hope that New Delhi can make the forum "more true to its global mandate".

"The G20 should not be a debating club or an arena only of the global north. The entirety of global concerns needs to be captured. We have already made that point very forcefully, Jaishankar said.

Two G20 ministerial meetings in India in the last three weeks have been overshadowed by Russia's 13-month invasion of

# 100 killed this year

Israeli forces shot dead a Palestinian Friday in what the army described as an attempted "stabbing attack", bringing the number of people killed in the conflict this year to 100.

The Palestinian health ministry announced the death of Yazan Omar Jamil Khasib, 23, who died "after the occupation (Israel) opened fire on him at the northern entrance of Al-Bireh" city near Ramallah, in the occupied West Bank.

The Israeli army said "soldiers spotted a suspect and asked him to identify himself. The suspect drew a knife and approached the forces who responded by opening fire". "The assailant was neutralised," the army said in a statement, adding that the incident took place close to Beitin, a Palestinian village near Al-Bireh.

No military personnel were injured in the incident, it added.

Israel has occupied the West Bank since the Six-Day War of 1967. Since the start of the year, the Israeli-Palestinian conflict has claimed the lives of 86 Palestinian militants and civilians, including

Thirteen Israeli adults and children, including members of the security forces and civilians, and one Ukrainian civilian have been killed over the same period, according to an AFP tally based on official sources from both sides.

# Millions of dead fish clog Australian river

Millions of dead and rotting fish have clogged a vast stretch of river near a remote town in the Australian outback as a searing heatwave sweeps through the region. Videos posted to social media showed boats ploughing through a blanket of dead fish smothering the

water, with the surface barely visible underneath. The New South Wales government said on Friday that "millions" of fish had died in the Darling River near the small town of Menindee, in the third mass kill to hit the area since 2018. "It's horrific really, there's dead fish as far as you can see," Menindee local Graeme McCrabb told AFP. "These fish deaths are related to low oxygen levels in the water (hypoxia) as flood waters recede," the government said in a

## POFILE OF THE 23RD CONVOCATION SPEAKER

Professor Wahiduddin Mahmud is an internationally acclaimed Bangladeshi economist and a leading economic policy expert, having expertise in a wide range of fields including development and growth theory, macroeconomic reforms, microfinance, migration, agricultural and rural diversification, poverty reduction, sustainable development, and rethinking of economics from moral perspectives.

Born in 1948 in Noakhali. Dr. Mahmud has the rare distinction of obtaining the top position, with record marks, in all his public examinations from the Secondary School Certificate to the Master's in Economics. He then went to the University of Cambridge, UK, and obtained his PhD in 1977.

Dr. Mahmud joined in 1969 as a faculty at the University of Dhaka, from where he retired in 2011 as Professor of Economics. Currently, he

is Chairman of Economic Research Group, Dhaka, and is on the Board of the Global Development Network (GDN), and is also affiliated in advisory capacity with the International Growth Centre based at the London School of Economics. He has served as a member of the UN
Committee for Development Policy (UN CDP) and as Chairman of the South Asia Network of Economic Research

Institutes. He has also worked in various teaching and research roles at the University of Cambridge, IDS at Sussex University, International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), UNDP, and the World Bank, among other institutions.

In addition to his teaching roles, Dr. Mahmud has been closely involved with the formulation of key economic policies in Bangladesh. Notably, he chaired the Panel of Economists for the Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Five-Year Plans and the Perspective Plan of the Government of Bangladesh (2015-2030), and he also chairs the National Advisory Committee of the Bangladesh government's "Vision 2041" strategic plan. He led the government committee for monitoring and implementation of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and, since 2001, he has overseen as chair of the technical committee the periodic revisions of Bangladesh's national income accounts. He was on the Board of the Bangladesh Bank for 16 years, during which time he chaired two bank reform committees. He is a co-founder and a former Chairman of the PKSF, the apex organization for funding the microcredit programmes of NGOs in Bangladesh. In 1996, he served as a member of the Caretaker government in charge of the ministries of finance and planning. He received the Bangladesh Bank Award in 2020 for his outstanding contribution to the advancement of

Dr. Mahmud has published on a wide range of topics in economic development, and is on the editorial advisory board of several international academic journals. His authored and edited books include, among others, Adjustment and Beyond: the Reform Experience in South Asia (Palgrave-Macmillan for the International Economic Association), Handbook on the South Asian Economies (Edward Elgar), The Theory and Practice of Microcredit (Routledge), Seasonality of Hunger and Public Policies (World Bank Publications), and most recently, Markets, Morals and Development: Rethinking Economics from a Developing Country Perspective (Routledge).

His late wife, Simeen Mahmud, was an internationally acclaimed researcher in demography and gender studies. His two sons studied, respectively, public policy at Harvard and astrophysics at Rice University in the US and his only daughter is Assistant Professor of Demography at the University of California, Berkeley.
