People suffer as drinking water Still fighting

drums regularly, we have to buy bottled water, which costs Tk 20 per litre," she added.
Hasan Murad from Chawkbazar area said, "I work as a computer operator at a private firm. Buying water from outside is an extra burden for me."
Like Manashi and Hasan, thousands of residents in different areas including Jamal Khan, Chawbazar, Kattoli, Bakalia, City Gate, Halishahar and Bahaddarhat have been suffering due to water salinity.
According to Chattogram Wasa, content of total dissolved solids (TDS), mainly different types of salts, remains at 10 to 15mg per litre of water supplied by Wasa in normal times, but the TDS has increased to 300 to 350 mg now-a-days as the rivers Halda and Karnaphuli, Wasa's two main sources

for collecting water, have become more saline.
As Wasa does not have salinity removal plants, the authorities are now waiting for rainfall so that the salinity decreases in the waterbodies.
Admitting the fact, Ariful Islam, superintendent engineer of Chattogram Wasa, said usually, salinity in Halda increases in dry season. "Usually, we blend the Karnaphuli waters with Halda's to reduce salinity," he added.
"On the other hand, the salinity of Karnaphuli river is decreased by the upstream water released from Kaptai Hydroelectric Project Dam," Arif went on saying, "As there was no rain in the past three months, the level of water in Kaptai dam is 12 feet down now from that of normal time."
"So, salinity in both Halda and Karnaphuli rivers has increased," he

said. "During high tide, the situation worsens further."
According to Chattogram Wasa officials, the daily water supply in Chattogram is around 46 crore litres per day. At present, around 41 crore litres is being supplied from four water treatment plants of Wasa.
Ariful, however, said although people feel discomfort to drink the supplied water, it's "not harmful" for the human body.
Contacted, Dr Sujat Paul, a former professor and head of medicine department at Chattogram Medical College, said water with a TDS content of less than 500mg/L will not create any health risk if the water is not contaminated by microorganism.
However, patients with high blood pressure should avoid drinking water that is more saline, he said.
