

BCL man beaten up by fellow activists

An activist of Bangladesh Chhatra League who studies at Dhaka University was assaulted by fellow activists, who are also the university's students, on campus on Saturday evening.

Zubaer Ibne Humayun, a student of the criminology department and leader of the social science faculty's BCL unit, had to receive treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

According to witnesses, a speeding car splashed muddy water on Zubaer while he was talking to some of his friends near the faculty building in the evening.

This prompted Zubaer and his friends to chase down the car near Tin Netar Mazar area for an explanation, initiating a quarrel with those inside the car, they said.

According to Zubaer, about an hour later, he was asked to come to Kabi Jasimuddin Hall area over phone. When he reached there, a group of around 15 students attacked him with sticks, cricket stumps. Some of them whipped him with their leather belts.

Witnesses said the attackers are also BCL activists.

Campus sources said the attackers stay at different halls of the university and run a "gang" called "Proloy".

The gang members are involved in different types of offences over trivial matters.

According to the victim, the accused students are Tabarak Mia, Sifrat Sahil, Fayal Ahmed Shakil and Shovon, students of Muktizoddha Ziaur Rahman Hall. The rest are Ferdous Alam Emon of Bangabandhu hall; Ornob of psychology department; and Hedayetun Nur and Sadman Tawhid Borshon, students of Shaheed Sergeant Zahurul Haque Hall and Joy Biswas Jagannath Hall.

Talking to The Daily Star, Hedayetun, Borshon, both activists of Shaheed Sergeant Zahurul Huq Hall unit BCL, admitted to assaulting Zubaer. They claimed that Zubaer attacked them first.

Tabarak denied the allegation.

Contacted, DU Proctor Prof AKM Golam Rabbani said they know about the incident. "If the victim lodges any written complaint, then we will take action after investigation."

A written complaint has been lodged with Shahbagh Police Station.

Sandwip: A haven for stolen motorbikes

From the city of Chattogram, Sandwip island is nearly 60 kilometres away. It is located in the north-east of the Bay of Bengal, having only a waterway to move to other places. But the island has now turned into a haven for stolen motorbikes according to police.

In the latest development, Kotwali police station yesterday recovered 24 motorbikes that were stolen from different parts of the city and arrested five persons, including a leader of a motorbike-lifting gang, from the island.

Police said most of the motorbikes in Sandwip upazila have no registration and other required documents, and the thieves used to sell stolen motorbikes in the remote area for a meagre price, persuading local police and administration.

The arrestees are Mithun Dhar, 29; MD Babar alias Babul, 35; MD Shahad, 26; MD Ripon, 40, and MD Khorshed Alam, 29. Among them, Mithun is the ringleader, said police.

Mustafizur Rahman, deputy commissioner (DC, South) of Chattogram Metropolitan Police (CMP), in a press briefing at his

office yesterday noon, said police first arrested Mithun and Babar from Chattogram Railway station area along with a stolen motorbike. Based on information, a team of police then started raiding different areas including Sandwip and traced down the huge number of stolen bikes.

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"They are the active members of an inter-district motorbike-lifting syndicate. The operatives are working in four tiers maintaining a good chain of command," he added.

The DC said, "During our investigation, police found that most of the motorbikes which are plying Sandwip upazila have no licence, registration and other documents. After stealing, the

motorcycles used to be moved to the island and sold for only Tk 15,000 to 30,000, based on the model."

This correspondent talked to local sources in Sandwip upazila, who alleged that the stolen motorbikes are plying the local streets by persuading Sandwip police and political leaders.

Seeking anonymity, a local businessman in Sandwip municipality area told The Daily Star, "The lifters sometimes also manage local political leaders and police before moving the vehicles."

Locals also said Sandwip's Kalapani union parishad chairman Alimur Raji Titu is one of the masterminds behind the stolen motorbikes. Titu is also the athletics affairs secretary under Awami League.

Titu said he is not involved in any such activities, and his political rivals are spreading rumours to defame him.

Shahidul Islam, officer-in-charge of Sandwip police station, told The Daily Star, "Following the investigation of a case, police [Kotwali] recovered the bikes with our help. It's not true that police used to get money from stolen motorbikes."

People suffer as salinity in drinking water rises Chattogram Wasa waiting for rain

Chattogram city dwellers have to drink bottled-wasa as the salinity of Chattogram Wasa's water has increased almost 30 times than it was a month ago.

This new phenomenon has put extra pressure on the monthly budget of people from low and lower-middle income groups, who are already

struggling due to the excessive price hike of daily essentials.

"We have been suffering because of this for around a month," said Manashi Talukder, a resident of port city's Jamal Khan area.

"A 15-litre drum of water from shops costs Tk 100, and a family needs one every alternative day," she said.
