

Amazon to lay off 9,000 more employees

Amazon CEO Andy Jassy recently mentioned that he was cutting 9,000 more jobs from the online retail giant's workforce, following the 18,000 that were axed in January. "Given the uncertain economy and the uncertainty that exists in the near future, we have chosen to be more streamlined in our

costs and headcount," Jassy said in a memo to staff.

The layoffs account for a smaller percentage of Amazon's total workforce, which ran up to 1.5 million people in December 2022, than the cuts seen at some other tech giants. Amazon's Iassy told his workers that the extra

layoffs were necessary after more feedback came from departments as the company seeks a way to downsize after years of sustained hiring. The cuts would mainly impact Amazon's cloud computing, human resources, advertising and Twitch video game streaming businesses, Jassy told staff.

LinkedIn will offer free courses across 7 languages, including English, Chinese, French, Spanish, German, Brazilian Portuguese, and Japanese. Moreover, the free AI courses will be available on the LinkedIn Learning platform till 15th June 2023.

Govt launches ProGRESS Project for inclusive skill development

A new project called ProGRESS has been launched by The Ministry of Education of the Government of Bangladesh and the International Labour Organization (ILO) Bangladesh. This initiative aims to strengthen the TVET (Technical and Vocational Education and Training) and enterprise development systems in Bangladesh. The ProGRESS project also plans on making skill development training more inclusive and accessible for women working on policies, systems and operational levels.

As per an official press release, ProGRESS stands for 'Promoting Gender Responsive Enterprise Development and TVET Systems'. The project will be implemented by the Directorate of Technical Education (DTE), Technical and

Madrasah Education Division (TMED) and the Ministry of Education with technical assistance from ILO. The Government of Canada is the funding partner of the

The ProGRESS project is designed to positively address the issues linked to low labour force participation of female workers in both wage and employment markets. It will also bring up issues regarding the limited access to business development services required for initiating self-employment. Additionally, the initiative will support the promotion of employability of the female workforce of Bangladesh to improve their economic well-being and maximise their contribution to the national economic growth.

The firm has raised US \$900,000 in a round with 4 investors, including 3 foreign venture capital funds: Goodwater, Sturgeon Capital, Black Kite Capital.
