Kiran hopeful about Choton's return

Mahfuza Akter Kiran, chairman of Bangladesh Football Federation's women's committee, is still hopeful that coach Golam Rabbani Choton would change his mind and return as head coach of the women's teams.

Choton announced that he was stepping down from his role on May 26 and sent an official resignation letter to the federation last Monday.

"Choton bhai has not left yet because he just sent his resignation which has not been accepted. I talked to him yesterday [Wednesday] and it seems that he may return and I still believe that he will," Kiran told The Daily Star.

She, however, said that the federation would look to bring a foreign coach if Choton does not change his mind. "We are working on it. If he doesn't return, we may search for a foreign coach," she said.

Since Choton's resignation, the different age-group teams and the senior team have been training under the supervision of technical director Paul Smalley and assistant coach Mahbubur Rahman Litu.

Most of the footballers have been gearing up for the upcoming Women's Super League which is scheduled to get underway on June 10. The senior team, however, is hopeful to make use of the FIFA International friendly window in July, and the U-17 side is scheduled to take part in the Round-2 of the AFC U-17 Women's Asia Cup from September 16 to 24.

In his first interaction with the media, he joked about having a magic wand that could fix Test batting woes.

The Youth and Sports Ministry received an allocation of Tk 1,303 crore for the 2023-24 fiscal year as finance minister AHM Mustafa Kamal placed a Tk 7,61,785 crore national budget yesterday.

On the surface, it is an increase of Tk 28 crore compared to the last fiscal year's budget of 1275 crore. However, the last allocation was revised to Tk 1,628 crore, meaning that the allocation for the current fiscal year has decreased by nearly 20 per

In his speech, Kamal said it was necessary to develop the sports sector, which is an important means for physical and mental well-being and sound entertainment. Construction and renovation of various sporting infrastructure, including modern stadiums, gymnasiums, and swimming pools, are going on and free gear is being provided to the sports clubs, he added.


Messi's last PSG game on Saturday

Lionel Messi will play his last game for Paris Saint-Germain against Clermont on Saturday, coach Christophe Galtier confirmed on

Messi, who has 21 goals and 20 assists for PSG in all competitions this season, moved to the French capital from Barcelona in 2021 on a two-year contract.

The 35-year-old World Cup winner won the Ligue 1 title in the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons with PSG as well as the French Super Cup in July

"I had the privilege of coaching the best player in the history of football. This will be his last match at the Parc des Princes, and I hope that he will receive the warmest of welcomes," Galtier told reporters on Thursday. Messi's last game for PSG is unlikely to be a joyous affair as their title celebrations would be put on ice with the team concern for goalkeeper Sergio Rico, who was involved in a riding accident.



Cabrera's challenge to settle on best XI

Bangladesh coach Javier Cabrera will be dealing with a headache as he looks to get his playing eleven right during the upcoming SAFF Championship, especially following the booters' dismal performances in March's friendlies against Seychelles.

The 38-year-old Spaniard has already announced a 35-member preliminary squad, which will be trimmed to 27 ahead of the start of a residential camp on June 4. He will then finalise a 23-memebr squad for the regional football extravaganza, which is scheduled to be held in Bengaluru from June 21.

Although Cabrera has set his sights high, aiming to take Bangladesh to the semifinals after missing out in the past five editions since 2009, selecting a playing eleven appears a tough task given the dearth of quality players and the omission of a few players he trusted in past due to waning performances or injury.

Following his appointment in 2022, Cabrera experimented in his first two friendles, losing 2-0 to Maldives and drawing against Mongolia.

He then settled on a team during third friendly against Indonesia, which ended 0-0, and fielded the same eleven throughout his first assignment, the Asian Cup Quailfiers. His team put up determined performances but lost all three games, falling 2-0 to Bahrain, 1-2 to Turkmenistan and 1-4 to Malaysia.

During that qualifying campaign, Cabrera banked on Anisur Rahman Zico, Yeasin Arafat, Tutul Hossain Badsha, Bishwanath Ghosh, Hossain, Rimon Jamal Bhuiyan, Biplu Ahmed, Atiqur Rahman Fahad, Rakib Hossain, Mohammad Ibrahim and Sazzad Hossain.

It appeared Cabrera would stick to those players during friendly matches in September last year, but he again opted to tinker, making a few changes that paid off in a 1-0 win against Cambodia but backfired afterwards in a 3-1 loss to Nepal.

experimentation Cabrera's continued into 2023 as he made seven changes to the team that lost to Nepal during two friendlies

against Seychelles in March. But again the changes did not pan out as an unimpressive Bangladesh toiled to a 1-0 win before going down in the second match by the same margin.

Cabrera had also opted to field players outside their regular positions but those moves were largely ineffective against Seychelles. With Bangladesh's biggest

campaign knocking at the door, the Spaniard is expected to face a huge challenge in picking the right combination.

With midfielders Fahad, Biplu, Jafar Iqbal and some others not in the 35-member

preliminary squad, Cabrera will have just one chance to test out whatever combination he settles on during next month's friendly against Cambodia a week ahead of the SAFF Championship. If Cabrera really want to get out of the group stage comprising two strong opponents Lebanon and Maldives, he will need to make the most of the players at his disposal and the new faces in the team.
