important centres will have a 19-member team present. A total of 4,400 policemen, over 300 Ansar members, and around 285 APBn (Armed Police Battalion) members will be on duty, he added.

Furthermore, ten platoons of the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) will be deployed on the day of the election.

Md Mahamudul Hasan, commander of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-8), also echoed the same.

Meanwhile, many non-residents began to gather at the city bus stand in Barishal. A middle-aged woman, who had travelled from Dhaka to support her brother who is a councillor candidate, was seen waiting in front of one such counter, visibly worried about the scarcity of transportation options.

The transport authorities confirmed the noticeable increase in the number of people compared to a typical day.

Meanwhile, Border Guard Bangladesh teams have started patrolling various city streets.

unit at the age of 82.

He had been undergoing treatment at the hospital for old age complications, according to DMCH Director Brig Gen Nazmul Haque.

Before his burial in Begumganj, Serajul was given a guard of honour by the local administration. He was buried beside his mother's grave as per his last wish.

Earlier, people from all walks of life paid tribute to Serajul, known as "Dadabhai" among friends and colleagues, by placing floral wreaths on his coffin. Hundreds of people, including noted politicians of the country, joined his janaza.

They said Serajul spent the later years of his life in solitude. His demise was also a silent one.

During his years as a student, Serajul became the assistant general secretary of Chhatra League in 1961 and its general secretary in 1963. He was also a key figure behind the formation of Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal in 1972.

that they discussed with the university authorities about the students' concerns and held the exam only after being assured of safety by the university proctor.

The rejoinder clarified that the department rescheduled the midterm exam of May 8 2023, following the sudden illness of the concerned course teacher.

"Deliberately skipping pre-scheduled examinations despite being instructed not

to do so is a breach of the academic code of conduct... Such a violation of academic norms cannot be considered a legitimate reason for rescheduling and retaking the midterm exam," the rejoinder reads.

**OUR REPLY**  
A report should be judged by the facts contained in it.

But the department in their rejoinder claimed our report as "incomplete" and "partial", without contesting a single fact that we wrote. It only explains or clarifies their versions through the

rejoinder.

While preparing the report, we contacted the department chairman, Prof Jahangir Alam Chowdhury, and three concerned course teachers to know the rationale behind their decision.

But all of them refused to make any comments on the matter. Prof Jahangir instead said: "You can write whatever you want."

We appreciate that the department authority now explains their versions through this rejoinder.

gambling, sexual harassment and other forms of cyber crimes have risen significantly.

Frauds on social media by hacking accounts and using fake accounts, question paper leaks, and terrorist propaganda, have also witnessed a surge.

"The use of information technology and the internet is playing the most important role in changing the patterns of crime," said Additional Commissioner (admin) of DMP AKM Hafiz Akhtar.

Police officers mentioned that criminals mostly target job-seekers and less educated people. Several of them said the biggest challenge is to change their process while investigating modern-day crimes. Apart from only collecting physical evidence and questioning witnesses, they have to recover the victims' cell phones and look into their social media accounts and transactions on MFS apps.

For an investigator it is certain that they must have

a know-how on devices and technology in general, said police.

AFM Al Kibria, deputy commissioner of the Cyber Crime Investigation Division of the CITC unit, told The Daily Star that the major challenges are that the victims do not want to file cases in cyber-related crimes. Due to the delay in filing complaints, it became harder to collect evidence.

Another issue is the lack of awareness, especially in MFS related crimes, he said.

"Often, service providers of many sites do not respond to our requirements properly and delay the exchange of information. Steps have been taken for the mutual legal assistance treaty (MLAT) to solve this issue," he added.

Moreover, tech-savvy criminals are now using VPNs to hide their activities, making it an even bigger challenge to catch them, Kibria explained.

"We are providing training to our officials on the newer trends of

crimes. Currently, there are cybercrime units in Dhaka Metropolitan Police, Detective Branch, Criminal Investigation Department, Anti-Terrorism Unit, and Rapid Action Battalion. The officials working in the cybercrime unit of CID have trained abroad," he mentioned.

Former Inspector General of Police AKM Shahidul Hoque said officers get some basic cybercrime training during training and they get extensive training when they are included in specialised units.

"However, it is necessary to include cybercrime in the general training manual to deal with the new trends of crime, especially financial ones," he added.

Mir Rezaul Alam, principal of Bangladesh Police Academy in Sardah, said, "We are presently providing a basic course on cybercrime to the newly-recruited officers. We plan to include the provision of specialised training on cybercrime, money laundering, and human trafficking."

Sayeed alleged that said the person showing the gun is Abul Kalam Azad alias Tuhin and he is the former president of ward-7 unit of Chhatra League.

Meanwhile, a CCTV footage of the showdown went viral on Facebook on Thursday evening.

Tuhin was arrested with arms by the Rapid Action Battalion on March 12, 2021 and was recently released on bail, according to media reports.

June 11, 2005, they have expanded their presence to 73 highway police stations across eight regions. Their jurisdiction covers approximately 3,000 kilometres of the national highway, which accounts for a significant portion of the country's total road network of 8,888.46 kilometres.

Md Shahabuddin Khan, additional inspector general of police and head of the highway police, told this correspondent, "The highway police are actively working to prevent robberies, combat smuggling of illegal goods, and protect the well-being of vehicle owners, workers, and passengers."

Additionally, the highway police have implemented various initiatives to provide immediate assistance to injured passengers, including prompt first aid services, efficient accident management, transportation to hospitals, and quick removal of damaged vehicles to keep the roads operational, he said.

minister for water resources Advocate Gautam Chakraborty, Fakhru said their party took part in talks with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina before the 2018 election with the hope to create an atmosphere for a neutral election through discussions, but they were bypassed.

"We have been cheated twice (in the 2014 and 2018 elections). We would like to clearly say that the people of the country won't get cheated again for the third time," he observed.

The BNP leader said the next election must be held

under a non-party caretaker government as the current regime has completely destroyed the voting and election system in the country in a planned way.

Referring to Law Minister Anisul Huq's comment in parliament that no one will be arrested during the next election as the administration will remain under the Election Commission, he said, "Who will believe these words? We want to say clearly, no one will be misguided by these words of the current regime. Because you have never kept any promises that you made before the nation."
