# Eyes on election, not talks or movement

AL preparing to face BNP if it finally decides to join polls, not worried about one-point movement

The ruling Awami League thinks the main challenge for the party does not stem from the BNP's one-point movement, but from the possibility of BNP joining the national polls at the last minute.

Although the BNP says it will not take part in the polls under the Sheikh Hasina-led government, the AL leadership says the BNP has already started making preparations to contest the parliamentary polls, slated for January next year.

If the BNP finally joins the polls, the AL may face tough competition, say party insiders.

The AL leaders also think the BNP is finalising its candidates behind the scene, keeping the party's existential crisis in mind.

They believe when the BNP sees the other political parties contesting the polls with Sheikh Hasina as the head of the polls-time administration, it too will decide to join.

The AL, therefore, is not at all bothered about dialogue with political parties, which has received much media attention over the past couple of months. And the ruling party will not take any initiative to bring the BNP to the polls, according to AL sources.

Instead, the ruling party is focusing all its attention on resolving intra-party feuds so that it can take part in the polls unitedly.

AL chief Sheikh Hasina told her party colleagues on many occasions that the upcoming national polls would be challenging for the party. She asked them to make all-out SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

Thousands of people in three northern districts have been marooned after lowlying areas got inundated.

The Teesta, Dharla and Dudhkumar rivers have been swelling up since Thursday due to incessant rain and onrush of water from upstream, said officials of Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB). "There is a chance of heavy to

very heavy rain in the northern and adjoining areas of the country in the next 24 hours. As a result, the Teesta, Dharla, and Dudhkumar rivers of this region may rise at times during the

period," said a weather bulletin of Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre at 9:00am yesterday.

It also forecast, "The flood situation in low-lying areas of Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat, and Kurigram may remain steady in the next 24 hours."

Houses, roads and vast tracts of farmlands have been submerged, while poultries and crops were washed away in some areas.

Many people have taken shelter on roads, dykes and in flood centres. They are having only dry food as cooking is impossible there.


