Anwar, deputy director of DoE Chattogram, said, "If any evidence of hill cutting is found during our investigation, we will take legal action against those responsible."
Officials from the upazila administration, who visited the area, have substantiated claims of hill cutting.
The port city has lost around 120 hills over the past four decades. In 1976, the city had 32.37 square km of hills, which reduced

to 14.02 square km by 2008, reveals Bangladesh Environment Forum's data.
Mohammad Kamal Hossain, former professor at the Institute of Forestry and Environmental Science, Chittagong University, emphasised the dangers of living near a hill that has been cut.
"The chopped-down hills usually collapse during monsoons as the soil is loose and soft. Such actions also pose a serious threat to the natural habitat of animals in the area," he said.

"We hope Adhora's case will be withdrawn, or the home ministry will issue a statement declaring it null and void," he demanded.
He emphasised the need for the government to ensure press freedom by taking the journalists' concerns about DSA into consideration.
DUJ general secretary Akter Hossain shared details about the case and said Adhora had been receiving threats after the news was aired. Akter, also the news editor of RTV, called for an end to such targeted harassment and to take appropriate action against those responsible for filing baseless cases against journalists.
Dhaka Reporters Unity president Morsalin Nomani, DRU former

general secretary Syed Shukur Ali Shuvo, Nurul Islam Hasib, among others, spoke at the programme.
The speakers highlighted the discrepancy between the government's claim that the DSA does not target journalists, saying increasing number of cases are being filed against journalists under this act.
They feared DSA cases against journalists may rise as the national election is approaching.
Mentioning that journalists are a supporting force of the state, the protesters sought cooperation from the administration.
Journalist communities have long been demanding repeal of the law, saying it has been curbing the freedom of press and expression.

Journo Ratan Sarkar no more

Centre will be constructed within the forest. Additionally, a beat office under the Forest Department will be established to manage and safeguard the forest against encroachment, according to the senior official of the Social Forestry department.
Urban forests serve as vital defenses against airborne pollutants, alleviate the heat island effect, improve mental well-being, and contribute to the replenishment of water tables.
Prof Adil Mohammed Khan of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning at Jahangirnagar University said, "An urban forest helps maintain the environmental equilibrium of a city. Ideally, a city should maintain 25 to 30 percent green coverage, with five to 10 percent dedicated to urban forests. If properly implemented, this initiative could greatly benefit a city like Dhaka."
Maj (ret'd) Shamsuddin Ahmed Chowdhury, a member of Rajuk responsible for development, revealed that the draft MoU with the Forest Department has nearly been finalised.
He emphasised the importance of conserving and expanding the existing greenery in Purbachal to prevent any commercial encroachment.
Chowdhury acknowledged that the Forest Department possesses the necessary laws and regulations to safeguard the area. Hence, they engaged the department to establish a legal conservation framework for the designated forest area, he added.
"By undertaking this significant initiative, Dhaka aims to strike a balance between urban development and environmental preservation, setting an example for other cities to follow suit," he added.

caretaker government system. They know that they would not come to power if the election is held under nonpartisan caretaker government," said Fakhru.

A threat to marine

Mohammad Najibur Rahman, secretary of Shrimp Hatchery Association of Bangladesh, said they cannot produce the fries as they cannot catch the mother fish from the bay due to the ban.
The country has 60 shrimp hatcheries with a combined production capacity of around 1,000 crores post-larva production against a market demand of around Tk 800 crore.
The market demand is high during this season as it is very suitable for shrimp cultivation.
"We have no savings to keep us going during the ban. We don't even receive government aid. This is the only option left for us," said Abdul Hamid, a fisherman from Cox's Bazar's Samitipara.
A hundred pieces of tiger shrimp fries are sold for Tk 40. Wholesalers buy it from local fishers and later sell it to shrimp farmers, said Jahangir of the same area, who catches around 500-1,000 fries every day.
"The fish grow easily during this season but we don't get any supply from the hatcheries during this period. Thus, we have to turn to the local fishers to source the fries," shared

a fry collector, preferring anonymity.
According to experts, lack of monitoring by the Department of Fisheries is to blame for this destruction. The government, in 2000, banned the collection of marine fries. However, the regulation only remains confined to paper.
"The field officers were asked to monitor the coasts and prevent such actions. The fries are mostly supplied to farms in Khulna as the demand is high there. Stern actions will be taken against the ban-offenders," said Syed Alamgir, principal scientific officer (planning and survey) of the fisheries department.

on the Rapid Action Battalion in December 2021, she said this was a decision and result of "careful research and consideration" of information.
"And, in fact, since those sanctions were imposed, we have seen a constructive development in terms of a documented reduction in reported extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances," Zeya said.
But on the question of lifting the sanctions, she underscored that they would need to see accountability for past and current abuses, and meaningful reform of the institution of Rab.
"These are considerations to take in mind with respect to a potential lifting of sanctions," said the senior

diplomat.
Regarding the visa restrictions policy, she said it was put forward absolutely in a spirit to support the prime minister's stated commitment to free, fair and peaceful elections.
"And that's something that I heard very affirmatively in the discussions we had."
Responding to a question on sending election observers, Zeya said they were examining the issue. In fact, it did come up in the discussions, she said, adding that they are aware of the government's openness to welcoming election observers.
Asked about any plan or proposal from the US related to St Martin's Island, the senior diplomat said, "Let me be very clear on this. There is absolutely no plan on this. The United States respects

Bangladesh's sovereignty and there have not been any discussions about a potential lease of St Martin's Island."
On the perception that the US is escalating pressure on Bangladesh, Zeya said, "I think I would correct your perception a bit respectfully. This visit is about the importance of Bangladesh as a partner to the United States. Our desire is to deepen that partnership, but also our view is that this partnership is anchored in shared democratic principles and human rights."

Port Authority, said the HC Division of the Supreme Court has now issued a restraining order for the Liberian-flagged commercial ship MV Panagia Canala.
In response to this directive, the authorities concerned, including the Port Department, Coast Guard, Navy, and the local shipping agent, have been contacted to ensure that necessary measures are taken to prevent the vessel from leaving Mongla port until further instructions are received.
Khandkar Riazu Haque, the Khulna assistant manager of the vessel's local shipping agent, Togi Shipping and Logistics Limited, confirmed that the HC has issued a restraining order against the vessel, with the Mongla Port Authority also issuing a corresponding letter.

Rokia was also the chairman of Arlinks Group, RR Group, and MIDAS Financing Limited, founder president of Bangladesh Federation of Women Entrepreneurs, and president of Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industries—MCCI, Dhaka.
Born in 1941 in a respectable Muslim family, Rokia started her career with a job at a commercial bank in 1962.
At that time, women working in banks was a rarity. Within two years, she became the first woman bank manager of the country.
In 1964, Rokia married Azimur Rahman, former chairman of Arlinks Group and founder chairman of Mediaworld Ltd and Mediastar Ltd.
Throughout her illustrious career, Rokia received numerous awards including the "Leading Women Entrepreneurs of the World" award in Monte Carlo, "Businessperson of the Year-2003" by the American Chamber of Commerce in Bangladesh, and "Priyadarshani Award" in India.
