

A terminal in ruins

“The terminal is full of potholes, all of which transform into ditches following drizzles. Speeding vehicles often spill that water on our clothes,” shared Abdul Halim, a local who frequently commutes through the Patuakhali central bus terminal.

Despite earning around Tk 20 lakh annually from leasing the terminal, the district’s municipality has failed to address the pressing issues transport workers and commuters have to face on a daily basis due to a lack of maintenance.

Built in 2003 by Local Government Engineering Department on a stretch of two acres in Kalikapur spending Tk

stench is unbearable while the terminal mostly remains inundated during monsoon,” informed Ruhul Amin, a passenger.

The boundary walls were also damaged, giving way for security concerns, informed Abdus Sattar, a local.

“A big pothole in front of the ticket counter causes a lot of trouble for the passengers. A similar pothole, which is filled with dirty water most of the time, also causes inconveniences, especially for women and children,” said Badrul Haque, counter in charge of Sakura Paribahan.

Most passengers avoid entering the terminal due to the puddles and potholes. They prefer boarding and getting off buses on the road

The terminal was later handed over to the municipality. However, they have never cared to fix the toilets which have been unusable since the very beginning, claimed locals.

‘THREAT TO PM’

HC orders trial of all cases in one court

The High Court yesterday directed the government to bring all the cases filed against a BNP leader for issuing a “death threat” to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina before a single court in Rajshahi for trial.

A total of 17 cases have been filed in 12 districts against Abu Sayeed Chand after he made a political speech in Rajshahi.

The HC bench of Justice KM Kamrul Kader and Justice Mohammad Showkat Ali Chowdhury issued the order following a petition filed by Chand’s daughter challenging the filing and initiation of cases against him in connection with a single issue.

Petitioner’s lawyer Kayser Kamal said filing more than one case in connection with a single incident is contradictory to Article 35 (2) of the constitution.

Chand, BNP’s Rajshahi district convener, in a rally on Shibpur High School premises in Puthia, Rajshahi, on May 19, allegedly made a “death threat” to the PM.

During the hearing, the HC bench told the deputy attorney general that cases have been lodged in many places for a single offence, which can cause sufferings.

A ‘Bhalobashar Neer’ for birds

Cop, journo, trader join hands to build sanctuary for feathered friends

The chirping sound of baby birds waiting in nests made out of earthen pots -- this is what people are welcomed to when they visit the additional police superintendent’s office in Moulvibazar Sadar circle.

These nests were set up by Ziaur Rahman, former ASP of the district, local journalist Hasanat Kamal, and Zaheed Ahmed Chowdhury, a young trader from the area, under their initiative “Bhalobashar Neer” (a house of love).

Aiming to ensure safe habitats for birds, the three had planned the initiative about three years ago. However, their plans were put on hold indefinitely due to Covid-19.

After the pandemic, over 80 clay pots were installed as bird nests to shelter local birds about a year ago.

Upon visiting the ASP’s office in the town’s M Sailur Rahman road, this correspondent came across two boards that read -- let’s all create a safe environment for the birds.

He also came across various pots tied to mango, mahogany, litchi, and arjuna trees which serve as a home to many birds in the area.

“I had seen such nests in Rajshahi and it really inspired me. This area is home to numerous birds, and we wanted to build a sanctuary for them,” said Ziaur, who is currently posted as ASP (crime) in Pabna.

Bird nests often fall off as they fail to endure rains and storms, informed Hasanat, the editor of online portal Eye News.

“Hatchlings usually die when they fall off the nests. It’s difficult to save them even if we rescue them swiftly. Thus, we came up with this solution -- a permanent and ecofriendly substitute,” he said.

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5 killed, 12 hurt in road accidents

At least five people were killed and 12 injured in road accidents in two districts during the last two days.

In Dinajpur, a bus and a truck collided head-on in Sadar upazila yesterday, leaving a man dead and 10 injured. The deceased, Abu Bakkar, 30, was the helper of the bus driver.

In Chirirbandar upazila, a motorcyclist was killed after a microbus hit his bike from behind in Champatoli area yesterday.

Ruhul Amin, 38, died on the spot, said OC Siddique Hossain of Doshmile Highway Police Station.

In Birampur upazila, a man was killed and his wife injured after a pickup hit their motorcycle at Tatakpur village, said police.
