## Masud Rana's international allies land in Dhaka

'MR-9: Do or Die' hits theatres on August 25

Bangladesh's iconic spy Masud Rana (played by ABM Sumon) is on a mission, and his trusted alliance finally landed in Dhaka this Sunday. The audience eagerly waits to witness how they help him fight terrorists as *MR-9: Do or Die* hits theatres on August 25.

The Daily Star caught up with the core team, consisting of the ship's captain Asif Akbar, along with the international cast—Niko Foster, Zhang Xueli Snow, and action director Philip Tan at Channel i's office, where they reflected upon the film, their experience in Bangladesh, and more.

"Upon our arrival in Dhaka, police officials immediately recognised us at the airport. We spent about an hour having casual conversations with them," shared Niko Foster, who is also the co-producer of the project.

"They were ecstatic to meet us and this boosted our spirit as we looked forward to promoting our film in Bangladesh," shared the actor.

*MR-9: Do or Die* is a visual adaptation of *Dhongscho Pahar*, first edition of the popular

spy series Masud Rana, authored by eminent writer Qazi Anwar Husain.

"I believe we have successfully adapted Husain's work into a cinematic version that resonates with the modern audience," shared the director who had concerns regarding the challenges of book-to-film adaptation.

"Masud Rana captivated South Asian readers, and we've sought to create a similar connection with a wider audience through the film. While staying true to the essence of the story, we've made necessary adjustments to suit the preferences of contemporary global viewers," he further added.

While the movie focuses on a Bangladeshi spy, its core background is set in Las Vegas, which gives it a Hollywood flair.

Jaaz Multimedia claims that the project is the highest-budgeted Bangladeshi movie, crafted spending Tk 83 crores. They have also made assumptions that the film will earn Tk 700 crores worldwide.

"I don't know from where this figure has appeared, as it's still an ongoing process. I've been told that it's one of the highest-budgeted films in Bangladesh's history," stated Asif.

Philip Tan, producer and action choreographer of the film, detailed the toughest action sequence in the movie.

"The most challenging scenes were the opening and ending sequences, which required grandeur. We featured the scenes with around 100 stunt performers, complex hand-to-hand combat, and martial arts choreography. Time and budget constraints were a huge concern," said Philip.

Both Foster and Tan expressed their admiration for ABM Sumon's selection in the film. "We've come across many good-looking Bangladeshi actors, but Sumon stood out," said Philip, adding, "His excellent fitness level was the icing on the cake."

"I've had around 15-20 years of training in Kung Fu in the Shaolin Temple. I landed the role by impressing Asif with my swordsmanship skills during the audition," said Zhang Xueli Snow, portraying Kong, an MSS agent in the film.

Most of the promotional efforts are geared towards the worldwide premiere on August 24 at SKS Tower. The creators have also received an invitation to showcase their film in China.

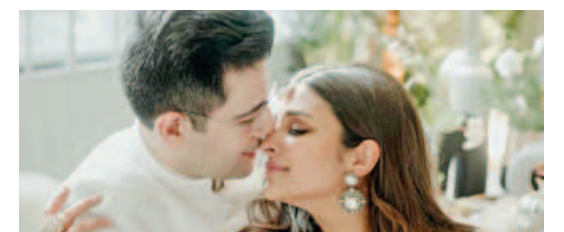


## Parineeti Chopra, AAP Leader Raghav Chadha lock wedding date

## Drive to free canals, drains continue

Mymensingh City Corporation (MCC) authorities have removed over a hundred illegal structures in the last couple of weeks as part of an ongoing eviction drive to free the city canals and drains from illegal encroachment.

MCC authorities will continue the drive for an indefinite period to free all the city drains and canals from illegal encroachment in a bid to keep those free flowing and protect the city from waterlogging.

The drive that began on July 5 would continue for an indefinite period.

Mohabbat Ali, conservation inspector at MCC, said one of the major reasons behind the waterlogging is clogging caused by plastic bottles and polythene that hampers the drainage systems.

Apart from evicting the illegal structures, cleaning of drains is also going on side by side, he said.

While talking, Advocate Nazrul Islam Chunnun, convener of Jonoudiyag Mymensingh, a citizens' forum, said not only drains, the city ponds, which disappeared in the last 40 years, should also be recovered to improve the city environment.

Chunnun also suggested the authorities concerned to construct walkways alongside the drains and canals to protect those from further grabbing.

Nurul Amin Kalam, secretary of Mymensingh Nagarik Andolon, said the city's population has increased many folds since its upgradation as Mymensingh City Corporation in 2018.

As the city drains are not cleaned up regularly, it leads to serious waterlogging even after a moderate rainfall, alleged Anwar Ahmed, a resident of the city's Mashkanda area.

According to sources at MCC, currently around six hundred workers are involved in cleaning and waste management activities in 33 wards of the city, but the number is not sufficient.

Contacted, MCC Mayor Ekramul Haque said they are conducting the drives to free the city drains and canals from illegal encroachment. The drive started last month and will continue till all the grabbed lands are recovered, he added.

suo motu rule and probe order.

Deputy Attorney General Saifuddin Khaled and S Alam Group's lawyer Ahsanul Karim strongly opposed making Suman a party to the rule.

The bench asked lawyer Karim the reason for his opposition and he said, "If confusing statements are made about S Alam Group to the media while this matter is pending with the court, it will impact the company financially."

The bench then said, "It is a crime not to speak out. It is unacceptable if everyone stays quiet. One should not knowingly stay quiet."

The HC also said it holds accountable those spreading false news to denigrate any individual or organisation.

Justice M Enayetur Rahim, chamber judge of the Appellate Division, yesterday fixed tomorrow (Wednesday) for a hearing on the petition, Muhammad Saifullah Mamun, a lawyer for the petitioners, told The Daily Star.

In the rule, the HC had ordered the Bangladesh Financial Intelligence Unit (BFIU) and the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of police to conduct an enquiry into the allegations disclosed in The Daily Star report and submit their reports to the HC as early as possible, preferably in two months.

In the rule, it asked them to explain as to why they shall not be directed to enquire into the allegations as alleged and disclosed in the The Daily Star report and why they shall not be directed to take appropriate legal steps and actions against the entities and persons who are involved in the financial scam leading to misappropriation/embezzlement of a huge amount of money and money laundering through suspicious transactions.

the road has been reduced by 4km in a revised proposal.

It said the explanation should be sent to the Project Evaluation Committee that would have a meeting on August 30, according to documents.

The commission also wanted to know if any new feasibility study is the basis of the costs and time escalation.

Contacted, Project Director AKM Azad

Rahman said as per the original development project proposal (DPP), the width of the service line was supposed to be 3.7 metres, but following a new decision, the width of the service lanes will be 5.5 metres.

This is the reason for the need to acquire more land, he told this correspondent yesterday.

Azad said 16km of the highway near Barishal city has been moved following the demand

of locals and ground reality and this requires acquisition of more land.

Asked about the slow progress, he mentioned that almost half the work was done and that land acquisition is complicated and involves the local administration.

RHD sources said the highway from Faridpur to Kuakata would be expanded under SASEC Dhaka-South Corridor Improvement Project with a loan from the ADB.

After an investigation, the ACC pressed charges on February 2.

The court framed charges on April 17 last year.

Shahed was arrested on July 15, 2020, at Debhata in Satkhira while he was trying to flee the country.

Later, over 36 cases, including an arms case,

were filed against him with police stations across the country.

On September 28, 2020, Shahed was handed a life sentence in the arms case.
