Thailand's Pheu Thai joins military rivals

House to vote on new PM today

Thailand's Pheu Thai Party yesterday vowed to deliver on a raft of election promises and change the constitution, as it unveiled an 11-party alliance that includes some militarylinked rivals that will try to form a coalition government

Thailand's bicameral parliament has been deadlocked for weeks on forming a government, after the antiestablishment election winner Move Forward succumbed to conservative resistance in parliament, leaving secondplaced Pheu Thai to take up the effort.

While the proposed alliance is a step towards ending the stalemate, the pact between the populist Pheu Thai and some of old military-linked enemies could prolong concern about a new bout of instability after nearly two decades of on-off turmoil.

Parliament will vote today on the prime ministerial bid of Pheu Thai's Srettha Thavisin, a 60-year-old real estate mogul who was thrust into politics only a

"We are confident that Srettha will pass the vote," Pheu Thai leader Cholnan Srikaew told a press conference.

must quickly work to restore the economy and come up with policies that will develop mechanisms for the stability of politics, the economy and society," he said, after announcing how many cabinet portfolios each party would get.

Pheu Thai's pact includes parties created by generals who were behind 2006 and 2014 coups against its governments, and engineered re-writes of a constitution to make it extremely difficult for election winners not favoured by the conservative establishment to form governments.

Most Thais disagree with the idea of a coalition government that includes military-backed groups, an opinion poll showed on Sunday.

Cholnan acknowledged the political divisions in the alliance but said rival forces had a duty to the public to not delay the formation of a government.

The alliance comprises 314 lawmakers and Srettha needs 375 votes from the combined upper and lower houses of parliament to be endorsed as premier and form the next government. It will be counting on support from nonalliance members, including from the upper house Senate, to get it over the line.

Meanwhile, Thailand's Police and Corrections Department officials will arrest former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, 74, as soon as he disembarks his private jet at Don Mueang Airport today, sources have said.

Won't be bullied to take sides in global issues

S African President Ramaphosa vows as he readies to host BRICS summit

South Africa will not be forced to side with any global powers, President Cyril Ramaphosa vowed Sunday as he readied to host a summit of major emerging economies.

The meeting in Johannesburg this week of BRICS nations -- Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa -- will seek to widen their influence and push for a shift in global geopolitics.

South Africa's hosting of the summit has turned a spotlight on its ties with the Kremlin, especially as it has refused to condemn Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

"While some of our detractors prefer overt support for their political and ideological choices, we will not be drawn into a contest between

global powers," Ramaphosa said in a televised state of the nation address.

"We have resisted pressure to align ourselves with any one of the global powers or with influential blocs of nations," he said.

Ramaphosa will be joined at the BRICS summit by China's President Xi Jinping, India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Brazil's President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva.

Russia will be represented by Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, with President Vladimir Putin participating

Putin decided against attending in person as he is the target of an International Criminal Court arrest warrant that South Africa is in theory bound to enforce.

LOC IN KASHMIR Civilian killed by Indian gunfire: Pak

Police Pakistanadministered Kashmir said yesterday a civilian was shot dead by Indian forces along Himalayan region's disputed boundary, the second such incident since June despite a ceasefire accord.

Riaz Mughal, Superintendent of Police in Kashmir's Kotli region, said a 62-year-old man was hit by "unprovoked" Indian shooting while he was cutting grass near the Line of Control (LoC) - the de facto border between the two countries

The Indian military did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Tropical Storm Hilary releases fury on California

The first tropical storm to hit Los Angeles in more than 80 years unleashed furious floods across parts of Southern California more accustomed to drought, as officials urged the public to stay safe as they began to count the cost of damage.

The National Weather Service downgraded the hurricane to a tropical depression but not before California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency for much of Southern California, with flash flood warnings until at least 3:00 am yesterday.

Mountain and desert areas could get 5 to 10 inches (12 to 25 cm) of rare rain, as much as the deserts typically see in a year, forecasters said.

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass said she was still worried that people could let down their guard if Hilary left them initially unharmed but later bands of the storm swung back to surprise those who were not prepared.

Hilary's center was expected to move quickly across Nevada yesterday, with the storm forecast to dissipate later in the day, the weather service

REPUBLICAN DEBATES

Trump says he won't take part

Former US President Donald Trump on Sunday said he would skip the upcoming Republican primary debates, citing his large lead in opinion polls as evidence that he

was already well-known and liked by voters ahead of the 2024 election. Trump has for months suggested he would likely pass on Wednesday night's debate in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, arguing that it did not make sense to give his Republican rivals a chance to attack him given his sizeable lead in national polls.

On Sunday, a CBS poll showed he was the preferred candidate for 62 percent of Republican voters, with his closest rival Florida Governor Ron DeSantis at 16 percent. All other candidates in the primary race had less than 10 percent support.

Russian FM Lavrov to visit Dhaka on September 7

The visit comes when the world sees rising polarisation, especially due to the Russia-Ukraine war, with the West putting huge pressure on Russia, including sanctions.

Russia is also trying to strengthen the BRICS, an alliance of the emerging global economies -- Brazil, Russia. India, China, and South Africa -- that was created as an alternative to the West-led International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.

UK judge jails child-killer nurse for life

A British nurse was jailed for life for murdering seven newborn babies and attempting to kill six others while they were in her care.

Lucy Letby, 33, was convicted of killing five baby boys and two baby girls, making her the UK's most prolific child serial killer in modern history. She was arrested following a string

of baby deaths at the neonatal unit of Countess of Chester Hospital in northwest England between June 2015 and June 2016. The prosecution said Letby

attacked her prematurely born victims, often during night shifts, by either injecting them with air, overfeeding them with milk or poisoning them with insulin.

Four more doctors arrested

They said they visited the CID headquarters in Dhaka, but the officials didn't provide any information about their whereabouts or why they were detained, reports

On August 13, CID told a press briefing that it arrested 12 members of a "question paper leaking racket", from Dhaka, Tangail, Kishoreganj, and Barishal. Of them, seven are physicians,

including Yunusuzzaman Khan Tarim, 40, the owner of Three Doctors Coaching Centre in Khulna, who was arrested Friday. The CID in a press release yesterday

said it found transactions of Tk 25 crore in the bank accounts of Dr Tarim and his wife. Dr Tarim engaged in leaking

medical college entrance exam question papers and arranged illegal admission of numerous students to government medical colleges, it added.

Dr Lewis is an alumnus of Khulna Medical College and a teacher at Tarim's coaching centre. Currently, he works as a medical officer at an

Dr Lamia stood 11th on the national merit list for the medical college admission test during the 2015-16 session. She was a student at Tarim's coaching centre.

However, despite her impressive result in the entrance exam, Lamia

initially failed in all subjects of the four final professional examinations. She later passed the exams after several attempts.

There were allegations that Lamia's husband, Sheikh Osman Gani, paid Tk 15 lakh to Dr Tarim to secure Lamia's admission, the CID claimed.

Additionally, the admissions of Dr Sharmistha and Dr Nazia to Khulna Medical College raised suspicions, as they allegedly acquired leaked question papers from Dr Tarim, the CID also claimed. So far, the number of arrests in the

case now stands at 28, with 14 of them giving confessional statements before a Dhaka court. The CID has been investigating the

case since July 2020, when they first busted the medical question leaking

The racket leaked question papers at least 10 times between 2001 and 2017, earning crores of taka, CID chief Mohammad Ali Mia said at a press briefing at the CID Headquarters last

The people who have been arrested helped hundreds of students to enrol in medical colleges through illegal means, he added.

The question papers of medical and dental college admission tests were leaked repeatedly from the printing press under the Directorate General of Medical Education (DGME), according to the CID.

One Jasim Uddin Bhuiyan Munnu was the mastermind of this racket. His cousin Abdus Salam, a machine

operator at the DGME press, used to leak questions for many years, with help from influential DGME officials, while Jasim used to spread the leaked questions all over the country, using a strong network, said CID officials.

investigation. Mufti Hannan was the only person who was made to say his name ... He [Hannan] later denied it and gave an affidavit which was not accepted."

The grenade attack was launched on an anti-terrorism rally organised by then opposition AL on August 21, 2004, in front of its central office on Bangabandhu Avenue, killing 24 people and injuring scores.

Condemning the grenade attack, Fakhrul termed it one of the most heinous act in Bangladesh politics.

"Tarique Rahman, Abdus Salam Pintu, and Lutfozzaman Babar were not involved in the attack, they have been implicated for political reasons. This has been done without any proper investigation," he added.

At the briefing, Fakhrul also disclosed the programmes to mark the 45th founding anniversary of the BNP on September 1 after a joint meeting of the party and its associate bodies.
