## Mass grave of 7 martyrs lies neglected

A mass graveyard of seven valiant freedom fighters, who embraced martyrdom during the Liberation War in 1971, in Netrakona's Kalmakanda upazila is on the verge of being eroded by the Ganeshwari river.

Freedom fighter Abdul Khaleque Talukder, also chairman of Kalmakanda Upazila Parishad, said seven freedom fighters---Dr Abdul Aziz Mohammad Fazlul Haque of Netrakona, Mohammad Yaar Mahmud, Bhabotosh Chandra Das, Dijendra Chandra Biswas and Mohammad Nuruzzaman of Mymensingh, and Jamal Uddin of Jamalpur- borrowed martyrdom during a fierce battle with the Pakistani occupation forces at Nazirpur Bazar in Kalmakanda on July 26 in 1971.

Later, fellow freedom fighters took their bodies and buried them in bordering Phulbari area.

Every year the upazila administration and local freedom fighters observe the day as 'Historic Nazirpur Day' with due respect, said Saidur Rahman, chairman of Lengura Union Parishad (UP).

But continuous erosion by

Ganeshwari river in the last couple of years has put the graveyard at risk as the paved road along the river is eroding every year, the chairman added.

At present, the graveyard is pretty close to the river and if immediate steps are not taken to stop the erosion right now, it may devour in the river soon, a number of locals said.

Schoolteacher Ashraf Ali said such historic places should be preserved for the better interest of the younger generations.

Local people have been urging the authorities concerned to build a guide wall along the Ganeshwari river to protect the martyrs' graves from further erosion, he said.

They have also been demanding to construct a museum at the place with complete information about the seven martyrs, their memorabilia and history of other freedom fighters in the region.

Kalmakanda LGED Upazila Engineer Shuvra Deb Chakraborty said they have sent a project proposal to repair the damaged road, stretching from Lengura Bazar to the Martyrs' Graveyard, and construct guide walls at different risky spots of the road.

Those are China's invasion of Taiwan and Russia's expansion of war to Poland. a NATO member.

"If one or both of these happens, Dhaka could come under unprecedented pressure from the US and its Western allies to take stronger positions against China and Russia," Kugelman said, adding that the scenarios should not be discounted at all.

The Indo-Pacific region is the focus of global powers and so is Bangladesh because of its geographical location, said foreign policy analysts from home and abroad.

The Russia-Ukraine war has further intensified the global power competition. Constructive regional

international cooperation is one of the guiding principles of Bangladesh's 'Indo-Pacific Outlook', said Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen.

The country also stresses regional connectivity and always takes an active role towards this end.

"Through Bangladesh has worked as a bridge between South and Southeast Asia. Now Bangladesh is ready to expand its engagement with more members of the Indo-Pacific region."

Momen went on to urge the regional countries to help resolve the Rohingya crisis for a stable Indo-Pacific.

Minister for State Foreign Affairs Shahriar Alam said "militarisation in the sea lanes" is undesirable as Bangladesh believes in the foreign policy dictum "friendship to all and malice to none".

Its only goal now socioeconomic development, he added.

One should not ignore the importance of the middle and emerging powers of the region, said David Brewster,

senior research at the National Security College, Australian National University.

Such countries including Australia, Japan, India, Indonesia and Bangladesh can strengthen partnerships and help prevent any militarisation of the region.

Bangladesh and India over the last decade have been a great success cooperation collaboration, and should bolster efforts to offset any negative implications of the great power competition, said MJ Akbar, India's former state minister for external affairs.

Foreign Secretary Masud Momen; Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury, former foreign secretary; Ahmad Tariq Karim, director of the Centre for Bay of Bengal Studies; Pankaj Saran, former Indian high commissioner to Bangladesh, among others spoke at the three-session event.

More than 100 people were injured in violent clashes in Tel Aviv between Eritrean government supporters celebrating an Eritrea Day event and opponents of President Isaias Afwerki.

Israeli police fired stun grenades to break up the clashes, while some protesters hurled stones at police and set fire to trash bins, Reuters journalists at the scene said. Footage on social media showed Eritrean government supporters beating anti-government protesters with clubs.

Israeli medical officials said more than 114 people had been treated for injuries, including about 30 police officers. The violence broke out

around an event organised by the Eritrean embassy to mark Revolution Day on September 1, which commemorates the start of the Eritrean War of Independence against Ethiopia in 1961. I

The Election Commission is likely to announce the scheduled for the 12th general elections in October.

Before the House goes into session today, a meeting of parliament's Business Committee will be held at 4:00pm to fix the duration and agenda of the session.

According to the constitution, parliament has to convene within 60 days after the end of its previous session.

The last session of parliament, which was the budget session, was prorogued on July 6.
